ADMINISTRATION

The beginning of March ushered in a major change as 22-year Library Director Ted Schmidt retired and long-time assistant director Marcia Lewis was promoted to Director.

Library and Facilities Management staff as well as Human Resources and Risk Management continue to deal with safety and ergonomic evaluations as well as additional building changes, repairs and punch list items.

Marcia led library tours for six groups (90 individuals) including the Loveland Utilities Commission, Wexford residents and the Northern Colorado Chapter of the International Facilities Management Association.

In conjunction with the Larimer County Extension, the library presented six Master Gardener programs that were well attended. In fact, the session on pruning trees and shrubs was repeated a second time due to popular demand. Noontime Nature, Great Ideas, a Willa Cather exhibit-related writing class and a Genealogy workshop also brought people into the library for a total program attendance of 450.

TEENSEEN

There were several highlights this month in the teenseen Department! Michelle started working additional hours and that has been a real blessing – because of those additional hours we now have “Off-Desk” time each week. YAY!!! Along with the blessing of “Off-Desk” time, Michelle created two new successful programs that the teens enjoyed. Michelle researched, designed, marketed, and implemented the first installment of a new program series “teenseen World Tours”. They “traveled” to Greece in March. The teens competed in Greek mythology trivia, tried ancient and modern Greek snacks, and learned to tie a toga! In addition to these new programs, we were given the opportunity to take 5 teens to the Colorado Teen Literature Conference. This was the conference's 10th year and this year it had the highest attendance. Over 450 librarians, teachers, teens, and writers attended the conference. The teens were able to meet national best-selling authors Maggie Stiefvater and Todd Mitchell. Michelle and I are already planning to ask Todd Mitchell (Fort Collins Author) if he would like to speak with our teens in the fall. We hosted 13 programs this month with 147 teens in attendance.

We're continuing to plan for the Summer Reading Program. The Friends Group asked us to sort through 11 boxes of books donated from the Book Warehouse. We were able to come up with books to use as prizes for teens that complete this year's SRP. Michelle and I have been busy getting local businesses to donate food coupons for prizes. We've got performers scheduled and are trying to finish flyers containing program information.

We've added a display unit (thanks to Lupe) and have been busy creating and implementing book displays that the public will enjoy. Michelle created a “If you liked Hunger Games, try one of these” display that constantly has to be refreshed throughout the day.

To keep teens and parents up to date on what is going on at the library, Michelle has done an incredible job posting program pictures on our teen Facebook page. Our teens really enjoy looking at the photos and reading the comments. We also keep teens informed of programming that is going on in the teenseen Room by updating the teen web page, posting regularly on Facebook and Twitter, emailing teens, and also sharing with them details when they are at the library.
