Randy Mirowski is the fire chief for Loveland Fire Rescue Authority (LFRA) and oversees the resources assigned to the department to carry out its mission. This includes the fire suppression division and training, fire prevention, emergency management and administration. He is also the liaison to the City of Loveland's management team (M-Team), the Loveland Fire Rescue Authority Board, the Loveland Rural Fire Board, and the Fire Rescue Advisory Commission (FRAC). In addition, Chief Mirowski is one of eight regional fire chiefs heading up the Front Range Fire Consortium, (FRFC), which works together to improve relationships and emergency services in the Northern Colorado, Southern Wyoming area.

Chief Mirowski was appointed to the position of fire chief for Loveland Fire Rescue on January 5, 2009; coming to LFRA with thirty-five years of experience in the fire service. He began his fire service career in the Topeka Fire Department (Topeka, KS) in 1974. He then moved to the Loveland Fire Department (Loveland, CO) in 1979, and then to Poudre Fire Authority (Fort Collins, CO) in 1982. Chief Mirowski has served in various positions within the fire service including firefighter, driver-operator/engineer, fire inspection coordinator, company officer/captain, training captain, battalion chief, training chief and special operations chief. He has served in leadership roles for a variety of teams and committees including haz-mat, wildland, technical rescue, apparatus design, new station design, safety, fitness, PPE, incident representative, policies and operational directives. Chief Mirowski has been a long-time fire service instructor specializing in leadership and management training, incident command, strategy and tactics and decision making for fire officers.

Chief Mirowski has accredited degrees from Aims Community College, Greeley, CO (A.A.S. Fire Science Technology), Colorado State University, Fort Collins, CO (B.S. Technology, Education and Training), and is near the completion of an M.A. in Organizational Leadership from Gonzaga University, in Spokane, WA. In addition, he holds three graduate level degrees in theology, completing his Doctorate of Ministry (D.Min.) in May of 2004 from Christian Life School of Theology in Columbus, GA.

Chief Mirowski's leadership philosophy is solidly grounded in the principles of servant leadership, with a strong emphasis on transformational leadership. He believes in the principles of inclusion, and that the accomplishments made together make us strong today and better prepared for tomorrow. These characteristics have contributed greatly to his past success as a leader and will help him be an even better and more effective leader for Loveland Fire and Rescue in the future.
