WINGS Program in Loveland to join Easter Seals Team

Easter Seals Colorado (ESC) is proud to announce that WINGS, a Loveland based program for adults with developmental disabilities is now an Easter Seals program. Founded in 2006, WINGS provides services in a day program setting to support adults with special needs in the Loveland community. Easter Seals Colorado WINGS raises the bar through meaningful, educational and enriching activities for their participants such as: art, computer work, exercise, social skills class, martial arts and community volunteer opportunities.

Research shows that ongoing stimulation enhances adult lives and helps prevent regression of skills, depression, cognitive decline and isolation. Sue Cox, Director of WINGS says, "This program encourages participants to have input and responsibility for programming in a flexible environment that allows adults to soar." Essential adult services preserve safety, health, literacy skills and social growth.

"The robust and unique programming of WINGS makes it truly a win-win situation for participants, their caregivers and the community as a whole," says Lynn Robinson, CEO Easter Seals Colorado. Beyond the WINGS participants, there is another group of individuals who are deeply impacted: the caregivers. The affordable day program gives overworked caregivers much needed respite.

This same type of curriculum is also featured at the Explorers Adult Day Program at two sites in Lakewood. Participants in the adult day programs range in age from 18 to seniors. Both of these programs focus on the important issues of social interaction, cognitive growth and functional independence.

RVNA Schedules On-Site Flu Vaccinations

Non-profit Plans Ahead for Flu Season 2012



Though the official cold and flu season of 2011 is just behind us, Rehabilitation and Visiting Nurse Association (RVNA) is making plans and ordering vaccine for the next season. Scheduling has begun for dates and timeslots to conduct on-site vaccination clinics, which begin in late August and run through late November. Any business, agency, organization or congregate living site may take advantage of the convenience of the on-site clinics and administration of vaccines by medical professionals. Such organizations are encouraged to call early to secure their preferred date and time for this year's clinic.

RVNA, a non-profit home health care organization that serves both Larimer and Weld Counties, has been offering the on-site flu clinics for decades. Their nurses and administrative staff ensure that the clinics run smoothly and effortlessly and that those receiving the vaccinations are comfortable with the process.

Each year, thousands of unvaccinated Colorado residents are ill, miss work, are hospitalized or even die from influenza-related illness. According to the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, and Harvard Business Review:

- Flu accounts for millions of lost work days each year.
- For every \$1 spent by employers on vaccinations, medical costs decreased by \$3.27 and absenteeism costs fell by \$2.75.
- Data shows flu vaccine is an effective way to minimize company losses.

Flu vaccination compliance and engagement rates are highest when vaccinations are conveniently offered in the workplace.

In addition to flu shots, RVNA provides flu mist, intradermal flu shots, high dose flu shots (for those over the age of 65), pneumonia, and tetanus shots upon request when scheduling the clinic. Dates are available seven days a week. Flu shots, mist, and intradermal shots are just \$25 and RVNA accepts payment in the form of cash, check, Medicare and some Medicare advantage plans. Vaccines may be given to anyone 4 years and older with special arrangements made for younger children.

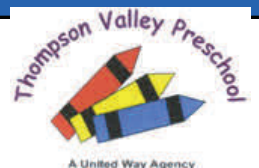

Private Care Services by RVNA Launches in Northern Colorado

In-Home Program Begins Taking Clients

Residents of northern Colorado have a new choice in assistance for personal care, homemaking, companionship, and activities of daily living within their homes. **Private Care Services by RVNA** (Rehabilitation and Visiting Nurse Association) has begun offering services in both Weld and Larimer Counties for persons who need a variety of assistance in their homes in order to maintain independence and safety. Extent of services range from, a couple of hours of companionship or respite for another caregiver in the home, up to 24 hour full-service personal care. The services are available at hourly rates of pay and are tailored to fit a client's needs and wishes.

The types of clients utilizing **Private Care Services by RVNA** cover a wide demographic range. Seniors who live in their own homes experiencing difficulties with certain daily living activities can receive visits from a caregiver who will prepare meals, do laundry, assist with bathing, etc. Others may contract to receive visits on a daily or nightly schedule for safety precautions as clients experience some instability from illness, surgery, or injury.
