IV. New Business:

With a full agenda, the first of six (6) presentations began. The presentations on Process Flow Charts, Capital Expansion Fee (CEF) and CEF Progress Report were informational only, needing no action from the CAB.

Discussion from the presentation on updates to the Storm Drainage Standards & Storm water Quality Ordinance ensued in reference to the Residential Lot Storm water Quality Permit Application and when the permit will be required. Once the ordinance is approved by city council, the application will be part of the building permit process, originating in the Building Division. Additionally, one application could be used for multiple lots.

A motion for approval was made by David Stamps and seconded by Gregg Meisinger. The motion passed unanimously.

The next presentation that brought discussion was Water & Power Utility Impact Fee Proposal for 2013. Once the new fees are approved by city council, the rates will put in place.

A motion for approval was made by Ingrid McMillan-Ernst and seconded by Chris Rosenberger. The motion passed unanimously.

The CEF Progress presentation did not require board action but had some discussion, in particular about the commercial and industrial fee rates. Board member Jason Baker indicated that he liked the idea of increasing the commercial CEF. Ed Klen, in the audience, urged the CAB to be careful when and if increasing the commercial CEF since the commercial property owners pay more taxes than residential owners.
