1. Update of 2030 Transportation Plan to 2035 Transportation Plan.

This is a public hearing item. As a legislative matter, the 2035 Transportation Plan will be presented to the Planning Commission for review, and recommendation to the City Council. The Plan is a functional component to the 2005 Comprehensive Master Plan.

The primary purpose of the Transportation Plan is to provide a thorough yet understandable document that guides transportation decision making toward a future desirable to the community of Loveland. The 2035 Transportation Plan is not a detail-oriented document. It is intended to establish transportation policies and to identify future improvement projects without determining the actual design.

VII. STUDY SESSION

1. Review of proposed amendments to the Public Notice provisions.

Chapter 18.05 of the Zoning Code and Chapter 16.16 of the Subdivision Code specify the public notification requirements for applications submitted to the City for development review approval. The Current Planning staff has been working with the Title 18 Committee and the City Attorney's office to simplify and clarify the requirements for public notice.

At the study session, staff will present a summary of the proposed amendments in order to obtain the Commission's feedback. Staff anticipates that a public hearing will be scheduled with the Planning Commission later in 2012 as part of the formal process for adopting code changes.
