**POLICE CITIZEN ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES
OCTOBER 6, 2015
POLICE TRAINING ROOM**

Present: Chairperson Pat Kistler; Erin Frisch, Ed Gassman, Dick Hunsaker, Mark Kirkpatrick, Dennis Soucek, and John Tindall. Councilor Hugh McKean; Chief Luke

Hecker. Citizen Guest Ed Klen (Front Range Gun Club). Absent board members: Tony Adams, Bev Cardarelli and Swaine Skeen

Meeting was called to order by Chairperson Pat Kistler at 5:40 pm. A motion was made and seconded by Dennis Soucek and John Tindall respectively to approve the September 8th meeting minutes as is. Motion carried. All approved.

CHIEF'S UPDATE

- Chief presented to staff the update on the Regional Training Center including the projected schedule of development as well as the explanation of costs for each phase. Brief synopsis is:

- 2015 Construction bid process to start in 4th quarter
- 2016 Campus infrastructure and driveway area
- 2017 Indoor ranges

Chief indicated that possibly a berm or trees will be placed on the west side of the property to de-emphasize the training center. Entrance will be on the west with special access code for law enforcement to enter the firearms area.

- Board member Erin Frisch asked where Ft. Collins was in this process. Chief indicated that they (Ft. Collins) are seeking 1.5 million in their 2015 budget. This should be finalized at their city council meeting in November.
- With the expansion of the training center, board member Mark Kirkpatrick asked if/when an academy would be started. Chief indicated that would be something that would be in the future as the center was going to be built in stages with expansion of classrooms at a later time.
- Citizen Ed Klen asked how many LPD personnel have attended an academy and had been paid for it. Chief indicated that since he has been in command that there have not been any. Chief did say that Ft. Collins Police Services supports officer candidates without POST qualifications and sends them to the academy in Adams County.
- After additional discussion a motion was made and seconded by Erin Frisch and Dennis Soucek respectively to have John Tindall write a letter to City Council from the Board in support of the Regional Training Center. All approved.

COUNCILOR McKEAN UPDATE

- Not much happening on the side of City Council but he did indicate to the board that caution needs to be made when it comes to operational costs of the facility for accuracy.
- Expressed his THANKS to the Klen Brothers for their input on the new facility.

BOARD COMMENTS

- Ed Gassman expressed his THANKS to Front Range Gun Club for offering a solution for training to LPD staff.

There being no further business a motion was made and seconded by Ed Gassman and John Tindall respectively to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 6:55 pm.
