Injunction Granted in Twelve States, What's Next?

Join us on **Tuesday, September 22 from 12:00pm-1:00pm** for a short workshop or webinar, your choice, to learn from Paul M. Seby, a partner at Holland & Hart and a Special Assistant Attorney General to the State of North Dakota, lead a twelve state legal challenge to the EPA and Army Corps of Engineers "Waters of the U.S. Rule". *North Dakota et v EPA et al* (US DC ND 3:15-CV-00059-RRE).

Paul successfully argued and obtained a preliminary injunction against implementation of the WOTUS Rule in twelve states, which include Colorado. The District of North Dakota is the only Court in the U.S. thus far to have enjoined the Rule and there are significant other legal actions going on around the country, involving other federal District Courts, several Courts of Appeal, and the U.S. Judicial Panel on Multi District Litigation.

Paul's presentation will talk about the WOTUS Rule, the Preliminary Injunction decision, and several other legal proceedings that will likely contribute to the fate of the WOTUS Rule being decided by the Supreme Court. Tune in next Tuesday to find out the details!
