



Loveland Historic Preservation Commission has Opening for High School Student

The Loveland Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) has an opening for one high school student to serve as a commission member.

The Loveland Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) is an official board created to advise City Council on issues concerning historic preservation in the Loveland community. The HPC meets once per month on the third Monday from 6:00p.m.-8:00p.m. in the City Council Chambers at City Hall. HPC members may also participate in preservation outreach events throughout the year.

To be eligible for the Historic Preservation Commission the applicant must be a high school student under the age of 21 and a resident of the City of Loveland. The applicant must have an interest in historic preservation, architecture, history, and/or community leadership. The term is for one school year. The high school student member may be excused from commission meetings and activities during school breaks.
