Purpose

- ❖ Prevent accidental poisonings and abuse.

What's accepted:

- Prescription Pills & Capsules
- Over the Counter Pills & Capsules
- Vitamins & Supplements
- Ointments, lotions and creams
- Pet Medications
- Medical Patches
- Medication Samples

Not Accepted:

- IV Bags
- Inhalers
- Needles
- Epi-pens
- Thermometers
- Controlled Substances

- Products should be in their original container and tightly sealed.
- Remove or mark out any personal information, including Rx number using black permanent marker, duct tape, or by scratching it off.
