i. Colorado Person First Festival Update

-went well, we were thanked in the Reporter Harold

-great partnership with the Loveland Disabilities Commission

c. City Council Liaison-Phil Farley

-Police training facility: cost 24 million dollars. The city of Fort Collins is willing to split the cost with Loveland.

- The Evergreen Development Proposal is developing the intersection on Eisenhower and 287(north east corner) a Sprouts will go here; all of the incentives given will go to the construction company (2.2 million dollars)

-Loveland and others in the region are applying to the state to create a Regional Tourism Authority that will bring a significant number of out of state visitors to the region. The Tax Increment Funding could generate \$190M or more in state sales tax over 30 years that would be used to help fund the projects. Loveland has committed \$175K to complete the application, \$125K from the city and \$50K from the Lodging Tax.

- Hawk Chemicals Expansion - \$12.5 million in costs for their expansion

- New high end pizza shop, Origins, will open at Lincoln Place

-New underpass at Madison for bike trail
