



Significant Electricity Legislation 2005-Present




Electricity Related Legislation in CO




Electricity Related Legislation Trends



MOUs	$\geq 40k = 10\% \times 20$	No requirement	$\geq 5 k /$ Utilities set compensation	No mandate	No mandate
REAs	TSGT & IREA = $20\% \times 20$	$\geq 100k = 1\%$ $< 10k = .75\%$ All others = 3%	All must offer Utilities set compensation	No mandate	No mandate
IOUs	$30\% \times 20$	3% Customers retain RECs	PUC sets compensation	PUC approves & utility must purchase all of the energy & RECs	5% reduction x 18 from 06 peak demand & energy sales PUC sets annual goals


CAMU's 2016 Legislative Advocacy in CO

So Where Are We Today?


- Bigger fish to fry in an election year
