## Crossroads Safehouse Begins 30th Year

**Crossroads Safehouse** begins the new decade, and their 30<sup>th</sup> year in operation, with a countywide smile. Since 1980, Crossroads has been providing a place for victims of abuse and their children to receive safe housing. In our mission to eradicate domestic violence through education, advocacy support services, and promotion of social change in the community, we have expanded to include bilingual advocacy services to men, women and children; legal services; 25 transitional housing units; 24/7 crisis intervention via a toll-free hotline, **1.888.541.SAFE**; a Crossroads' staff member working in the TANF offices; a public outreach center; and round-the-clock on-scene response to law enforcement, hospitals, and Colorado State University when these entities page a Crossroads' representative to go to the scene of a domestic abuse incident. Our federally-funded legal program, **Bringing Justice**

**Home**, provides full legal representation in civil matters to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault in five Northwest Colorado counties and in Weld.

In 2008, we were gifted with a 29,000 square-foot facility that, with the help of JCL Architecture, is being renovated to accommodate all those from Larimer County who seek safe haven at Crossroads. The facility is so large that it will also take overflow clients from other Safehouses throughout Colorado, and, thus will become a statewide facility. This facility could not come at a more critical time. During 2009, we recorded a 32.5% increase in the number of residents staying in the Safehouse. Unfortunately, during this same year we had to

turn away 138 people due to lack of space.

The new facility will provide a "home" for more than four times the number of clients we can currently house. In addition to offering a men's suite, the new facility will provide a large meeting room, an interior play space for children staying at the Safehouse, regular educational programs, weekly on-site healthcare, and job training. To ensure that domestic violence victims are able to access our facility, we will provide a DV Circuit Rider to transport people to the Safehouse from areas in and around Larimer County as well as throughout the entire state of Colorado.

We look forward to working on this community venture with all of you in a mutual effort to end domestic violence and to help those afflicted by it. We thank you for your support.

## Habitat for Humanity Applications Begin

**Loveland Habitat for Humanity** The Family Selection Committee of the Loveland affiliate will open the application period **beginning March 1, 2010 and closing April 15, 2010**. We have discovered the number one factor for the successful acceptance into our program is the presence of a person who encourages and supports the family to apply. Low income families are so used to hearing "no", that the possibility of acceptance for a beautiful, new home seems impossible. Please take a minute to look over our qualifications and if you know of



someone who could benefit from a Habitat home, tell them about it. Encourage them to apply. Encourage them again. You could change their life!

### Applicants must meet the following basic requirements:

1. Have lived or worked in Loveland for at least one year.
2. Have a need for adequate housing. (Are current living conditions overcrowded or

unsafe or do you pay 40% or more of your income for rent, or receive subsidized housing?) And can't qualify for a conventional loan.

3. Willing to partner with Habitat by working 250 volunteer hours (sweat equity) per adult applicant.
4. Earn between 30-60% area median income, are a US citizen or legal permanent resident and have: No bankruptcy within the last 2 years, No current non-medical collections, no judgments or liens. Current history of paying bills on time.

## Learn about CASA

**CASA, Court Appointed Special Advocate**, what does it mean? Imagine a young child living with his mother, a methamphetamine addict. She is unable to provide for his basic needs and doesn't understand the harmful effects of exposing him to meth. This could be a CASA case. The children CASA serves are in the Court system as they are victims of abuse and/or neglect. For the average 18 months it will take the Court to decide a child's permanent home placement, the child may have two or more social workers and live in two or more foster care or other

homes. A CASA volunteer is sometimes the only consistent, caring person in a child's life. In addition to providing important emotional support, as court appointees they are able to gather pertinent data about the child's life from teachers to therapists and provide the Court with this valuable, factual information. This helps the Court determine a permanent home placement that is in the *best interest of the child*.

**A CASA Volunteer Affirmation:**  
*The most gratifying experience I've had as a CASA volunteer came when I learned that during a therapy session my CASA*

*child was instructed to draw and talk about her "safe place" and she drew me. That moved me beyond belief, and with that great honor came an even greater sense of responsibility to continue to be a stable person in her life at a time when she really needed that.*



This is the type of service CASA was able to provide to 189 children in 2008 and our numbers are increasing in 2009. We also operate the Fort Collins & Loveland Harmony House programs that

provide a place for safe visitations between children and their non-custodial family members.
