Loveland Community Health Center and Larimer Center for Mental Health (LCMH) are pleased to announce a recent grant award from

The Colorado Health Foundation for the integration of primary health and behavioral health care.

The three-year award will allow **Loveland Community Health Center** to place a medical team at **Larimer Center for Mental Health's** Loveland office. The team will work closely with **LCMH** staff to meet the medical needs of our mutual clients. Individuals with severe mental illness and addictive disorders are disproportionately impacted by chronic health conditions, and are dying, on average, 25 years earlier than those who are not impacted by behavioral health disorders. Because of difficulties accessing primary care and routine screenings, as well as high levels of obesity, smoking, and other unhealthy lifestyle choices, the placement of a medical team at **LCMH** is a much needed resource.

Conversely, **Larimer Center for Mental Health** will be placing a Behavioral Health Specialist at **Loveland Community Health Center**. This individual will be fully integrated into the medical team, and will serve as a resource for patients in need of mental health and substance abuse screenings, brief interventions for



Conversely, **Larimer Center for Mental Health** will be placing a Behavioral Health Specialist at **Loveland Community Health Center**. This individual will be fully integrated into the medical team, and will serve as a resource for patients in need of mental health and substance abuse screenings, brief interventions for substance abuse, depression and anxiety, and assistance with connection to long-term behavioral health care as needed. Many, many patients come to **Loveland Community Health Clinic** in need of some kind of behavioral health intervention. Being able to receive it, on-site, in the location of their choice will be highly beneficial.

“We are incredibly grateful to **The Colorado Health Foundation** for entrusting us with this large undertaking,” said Mitzi Moran, President/CEO of Sunrise Health Centers, which oversees **Loveland Community Health Center**. “We intend to show that when we provide health care that recognizes the interplay of behavioral health and primary health, people will have much better health outcomes. The concept for Meals on Wheels began in Great Britain during World War II (1939) when people's homes were destroyed and they had nothing to eat. The first Meals on Wheels program in the United States began in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1954.



Meals on Wheels of Loveland and Berthoud serves individuals with limited abilities to leave home, shop for food and prepare meals Monday through Friday. The program's service area has grown and meals are delivered in Loveland, Berthoud, Masonville and rural areas around the communities.

The program is comprised of six staff members daily that work to prepare and package meals, coordinate volunteers and raise funds to provide the needed revenue to administrate the non-profit agency.

Meals on Wheels has a total of 300 incredible volunteers that assist the program with providing over 60,000 meals annually. They help by prepping, packaging and delivering meals as well as governing, providing I.T. support and equipment maintenance. They make it possible to provide meals to every homebound person in need of service.

Meals on Wheels is happy to announce they have teamed up with **The Community Kitchen** to assist Loveland's homeless and low income needy residents. **Meals on Wheels** uses their large well-equipped kitchen to prepare meals seven days per week for **The Community Kitchen** program. The meals are provided at cost and **The Community Kitchen's** dining center is leased at no cost.

The two separate non-profit programs have collaborated to provide nutritious meals to individuals utilizing **Meals on Wheels** spacious facilities. The effort has proven to be efficient and cost effective benefiting everyone in need. **Meals on Wheels** and **The Community Kitchen** are blessed to have the Loveland communities' support.

Meals on Wheels is grateful for everyone who contributes to its program ensuring that no one person is in need of meals.
