Overview of Budget Process

- LUC members volunteer to attend budget meetings with staff
- Discuss future challenges and help set priorities for the next budget year
- Budget presented to LUC prior to going to City Council
- Provide feedback and insight prior to the budget being presented to City Council
- Monthly financial updates are provided to the LUC



LUC 2016 Goals

Power Cost-of-Service Rate Study

- Analyze current rates & customer classes
- Complete every 3-years
- Explore renewable rate concepts
- Working toward charging full cost-of-service to each customer class



3.5 MW FEMA Alternate Project

- Foothills Solar Field
- Install by December 30, 2016
- Receive 3x renewable state energy credit
- Gain experience with solar and distributed generation



LUC 2016 Goals

Redefine Key Accounts Program

- Analyze customer utility billing data
- Tiered approach to services offered
- Determine metrics to qualify



Asset Management Program

- Continue development of our asset management program
- Focus on critical infrastructure
- Plan for future growth
- Address aging infrastructure



LUC 2016 Goals

Community Solar Garden Program

- Participate with the four cities and PRPA
- End Goal: Deploy a community solar garden program to provide our customers with another renewable energy option
- Currently have 37 net metering customers
- Explore:
 - Feasibility
 - Best location
 - Best implementation practices



PRPA's Integrated Resource Plan

- Assist PRPA in developing an Integrated Resource Plan
- Has been adopted by Western Area Power Administration
- Plan to Include:
 - Resource planning
 - Direction on demand response
 - Future of energy efficiency goals
 - Impact of EPA's Clean Power Plan
