

TOUR DE FAT



Now in its 19th year, <u>Tour de Fat</u>, New Belgium's nonprofit-supporting celebration of bikes, beer and bands, is coming back in 2017 with a bevy of changes, including a greatly expanded circuit, bigger headliners and an entry fee.

This year also marks Tour de Fat's change into a music-focused festival, which will pair a nationally-known headlining act with each city it visits. To foot the cost of the bands, the festival is abandoning its free-to-enter model, charging a ticketed fee that will also help Tour de Fat raise more money for the nonprofits the events support, which are localized to each participating city.

For most cities, the new model also spells the end of Tour de Fat's hallmark bike parade, save for three locations: Fort Collins, Boise and Tempe.

"We're still about advocacy and philanthropy and we're still a celebration of the bike and beer," New Belgium spokesman Bryan Simpson said, "but this was our best model going forward to keep it sustainable."

New Belgium Brewing has raised more than \$4.5 million for partnering non-profits since its inception. This summer Tour de Fat hopes to generate more than \$600,000 in support of local causes.

In addition to musical headliners, a touring ensemble of artists, Cirque performers, and general mayhemists will appear alongside local buskers and street performers. New Belgium Brewing will host a battle of the bands in many cities prior to the event to give local bands the chance to represent their hometown scene.

CRAWFORD COFFIN RACES



Legend has it that a young woman named Emma Crawford moved to Manitou Springs in 1889 hopeful that the clean mountain air and healing mineral springs would cure her tuberculosis. After accomplishing a hike up nearby Red Mountain, she let it be known that once she passed on, her wish was to be buried on the mountain.

She died soon after and was laid to rest on Red Mountain. Many years later, heavy rainfall caused Emma's coffin to dislodge, and it came racing down the mountain. The coffin was found by some children, but her remains were never discovered. Emma supposedly still haunts Red Mountain.

The legend of Emma Crawford lives on in the wacky Emma Crawford Coffin Race up Manitou Avenue. Costumed impersonators of Emma ride on coffin-like contraptions pulled by teams of four "mourners." A Parade of Coffins and awards for the best Emma and Most Creative Coffin complete the day-long event.

Stay in town for the Emma Crawford Estate Sidewalk Sale hosted by participating local businesses in Downtown Historic Manitou Springs. The night before, a Victorian Wake in Emma's honor is held at Miramont Castle in Manitou Springs.

Nederland, Colorado, to loosely celebrate the 1994 discovery of the cryonic state corpse of Bredo Morstoel.

Known as one of the most unique and quirky festivals in the country, Frozen Dead Guy Days takes place in the Colorado mountain town of Nederland — three days of frosty merriment featuring 30 live bands in heated super tents and outrageous events like coffin racing, costumed polar plunging, frozen t-shirt contests and much more.

Celebrating its 16th year in 2017, <u>Frozen Dead Guy Days</u> continues to be a worldrenowned spectacle. The home-grown frosty fest pays homage to Bredo Morstol, who is frozen in a state of suspended animation and housed in a Tuff Shed on dry ice high above Nederland. Thousands of adventurous, life enthusiasts come to participate in Colorado's "most frigidly fun festival" and view the events along with local, national and international media and entertainment.

MIKE THE HEADLESS CHICKEN FESTIVAL



The Annual Mike the <u>Headless Chicken Festival</u> in Fruita, Colorado is "Colorado to the Core". This festival is dedicated to the amazing story of one chicken's will to live. Events such as a 5k run, disc golf tournament, wing and peep eating contests, live music, delicious food and artisan booths make this a weekend to remember.

History was made on September 10th, 1945 when a strapping young rooster was pecking through the dust of Fruita, Colorado. The unsuspecting bird had never looked so delicious as he did on that infamous day. Clara Olsen was planning on featuring the plump chicken in the evening meal. Husband Lloyd Olsen was sent out, on a very routine mission to prepare the designated fryer for the pan. Nothing about this task turned out to be routine. Lloyd knew his mother-in-law would be dining with them and would savor the neck. He positioned his ax precisely, estimating just the right tolerances, to leave a generous neck bone. "It was as important to suck-up to your mother-in-law in the 40's as it is today." A skillful blow was executed and the chicken staggered around like most freshly terminated poultry.

Nothing about this task turned out to be routine. Lloyd knew his mother-in-law would be dining with them and would savor the neck. He positioned his ax precisely, estimating just the right tolerances, to leave a generous neck bone. "It was as important to suck-up to your mother-in-law in the 40's as it is today." A skillful blow was executed and the chicken staggered around like most freshly terminated poultry.

Then the determined bird shook off the traumatic event and never looked back. Mike (it is unclear when the famous rooster took on the name) returned to his job of being a chicken. He pecked for food and preened his feathers just like the rest of his barnyard buddies.

When Olsen found Mike the next morning, sleeping with his "head" under his wing, he decided that if Mike had that much will to live, he would figure out a way to feed and water him. With an eyedropper Mike was given grain and water. It was becoming obvious that Mike was special. A week into Mike's new life Olsen packed him up and took him 250 miles to the University of Utah in Salt Lake City. The skeptical scientists were eager

to answer all the questions regarding Mike's amazing ability to survive with no head.

It was determined that ax blade had missed the jugular vein and a clot had prevented Mike from bleeding to death. Although most of his head was in a jar, most of his brain stem and one ear was left on his body. Since most of a chicken's reflex actions are controlled by the brain stem Mike was able to remain quite healthy.



In the 18 MONTHS that Mike lived as "The Headless Wonder Chicken" he grew from a mere 2 1/2 lbs. to nearly 8 lbs. In an interview, Olsen said Mike was a "robust chicken - a fine specimen of a chicken except for not having a head." Miracle Mike took on a manager, and with the Olsens in tow, set out on a national tour. Curious sideshow patrons in New York, Atlantic City, Los Angeles, and San Diego lined up to pay 25 cents to see Mike. The "Wonder Chicken" was valued at \$10,000 and insured for the same. His fame and fortune would earn him recognition in Life and Time Magazines. It goes without saying there was a Guinness World Record in all this. While returning from one of these road trips the Olsens stopped at a motel in the Arizona desert. In the middle of the night Mike began to choke. Unable to find the eyedropper used to clear Mike's open esophagus Miracle Mike passed on.

Now, Mike's spirit is celebrated every year at the Mike the Headless Chicken Festival the first weekend in June.

An annual event in Fairplay, Colorado since 1948, Burro Days celebrates the role of the burro in mining days of old.

Always held during the last weekend in July, the 69th Annual Burro Days will take place on Saturday, July 29 and Sunday, July 30, 2017.

Over 10,000 people participate in festivities such as: burro races, llama races, kiddies pack dog races, parades, contests, over 140 arts & crafts booths, over 30 food vendor booths, local musical entertainment, dance & BBQ, pancake breakfast, Cowboy Church services and more!

In 1949 when the challenge went out to anyone with the fortitude to race from Leadville to Fairplay for a \$500 prize, every mountain town in the Rockies came alive in the following weeks trying to lure racers into representing them. Mosquito Pass became a mecca for aspiring racers. The local bars reported that those runners consuming more beer were producing faster practice times. The Fairplay Flume reported that there were more burros escaping from their pasture than ever remembered.

Some of the most exciting races were in the 1960s, when some marathoners decided to challenge the sport that was dominated by miners. At the time the race was dominated by nine-time winner Joe Glavineck of Leadville. He won his first race in 1955 and had some kind of special rapport with his burros that kept him in first place for over 20 years. His battles with marathoner Steve Matthews became legendary, showing that it takes more than being a good runner to win this race. Glavenick was the last of the true miners to win the race, but he beat the best runners of the time including some Olympic hopefuls who took the challenge.

In the 1970s the local mining industry declined rapidly with many of the miners having to relocate or take on new jobs - but the spirit of the race continued. During this time a cross country coach from Arvada, Lee Courkamp exposed burro racing to runners on the front range. Lee won the race two times and had a string of well trained burros. He inspired his high school teams to train with them and in the process won numerous state championships along with developing Olympic runner Jon Sinclair who also went on to win the 1977 race. Many of the present runners trained with Lee and have run his burros.

The current group of racers is probably the most diverse in history. Eight-time winner Ardel Boes, a math professor at the School of Mines in Golden was the first to break the 4 hour barrier which was felt to be impossible. Tom Sobal finally broke the seemingly "unbreakable" record of Joe Glavinek in 2002 with his 10th win. Tom also holds the course record of 3 hours 44 minutes for the 30 mile course. Hal Walters, a freelance writer, has won the race three times in the past six years.

As long as the "Pass" is there and a record to be broken, runners and burros will line up the last weekend of July to "Get Their Ass Up the Pass."

FRUITCAKE TOSS DAY



Let's be honest nobody really likes fruitcake, and nobody ever really eats it, either. Heavy, flavorless and always too sweet, fruitcake is one of our century's biggest holiday jokes. So when Christmas is over, and you've taken the tinsel down, and thrown out the tree, what should you do with that old fruitcake that you've been using to prop open the door/to replace a missing limb/as a headrest? Fruitcake Toss Day has a "fruitful" answer.The event, which is reported as having originated in Manitou Springs, Colorado, was created in order to help people get rid of unwanted fruitcake after Christmas.

Manitou Springs has hosted the Fruitcake Toss tournament every year since 1995. During the competition, fruitcakes are thrown, hurled, catapulted and cannoned into the air using a range of inventive devices. Those braving this event would be wise to remember to look up occasionally – a frozen fruitcake in the face is a formidable force when fired from an exercise-bike-powered cannon.

The best way to celebrate this crazy holiday is simply to take part Fruitcake Toss day is organized on the first Saturday of every January in Manitou Springs, and festivities are organized in the following manner:

Participants are expected to bring their own fruitcakes which should contain candied

fruits, nuts and of course, flour, and not any inedible substances. The fruitcakes are inspected by the "Fruitcake Toss Tech Inspectors" before they are allowed to be used for competition to make sure they do not contain any substances hard enough to hurt a person that may get hit in the head with a flying fruitcake. However, you happen to forget your fruitcake at home, you may rent one on the spot.



The Distance Competition is about hurling a 2-pound fruitcake as far as possible. The winner is the person able to hurl the fruitcake the farthest. The distance is measured at the final resting spot of the fruitcake, not where it first hits the ground.

Catch the Fruitcake is played in groups of three team members who are required to catch fruitcakes tossed by their own devices. In this competition, the fruitcakes must be a minimum of 1 pound in weight to make sure nobody gets hurt trying to catch them. The team that catches the most fruitcakes wins.

Accuracy with Targets is another great way to take part in the competition but not get as messy. Targets are placed out in the park at distances of 75 feet, 125 feet and 175 feet at varying angles. The goal is for each team to land in or as close to as many targets as possible. Have a great time at Fruitcake Toss Day, but don't forget to keep your eyes on the sky above you!

Northern Colorado's place on the meetings map is becoming more prominent. As neighbors on the Front Range, Loveland and Greeley have emerged as attractive alternatives to the state's largest cities for meetings and events.

The benefits to looking north? Lower prices and an enviable location that allows for easy day trips to area attractions, plus more manageable logistics, revitalized downtowns, and plenty of good beer.

Loveland

At the peak of Loveland's meetings market is The Ranch Events Complex. Opening the gates and doors in 2003, The Ranch (also known as the Larimer County Fairgrounds) can accommodate 10 to 100,000 people in its more than 375,000 square feet of event space. Three of the four buildings on campus include the Budweiser Events Center with a 7,200-seat arena and a 3,000-square-foot restaurant; First National Bank Building with two 18,000-square-foot exhibition halls and five meeting rooms; and Thomas M. McKee 4-H, Youth & Community Building with a 12,500square-foot hall and six meeting rooms. The fourth is the Ranch-Way Feeds Indoor Arena and Pavilions featuring a large arena and two indoor pavilions as well as the smaller attached Ranch Arena, plus two outdoor arenas located next to the building.

The Ranch's calendar includes 2,500 events a year, and it's much more than rodeos and horse shows. "There are a lot of different events we can do over here," says Sales Manager Katie Buttermore, touting parking availability and easy access to Interstate 25. "We have countless trade

shows, corporate events, meetings across the board. We can accommodate small weekly meetings with 10 people to a campus-wide event of 100,000 people."

Sheryl Fahrenbruch, outreach program manager at Loveland's McKee Medical Center, organizes a pair of annual health events at the First National Bank Building that attract about 400 attendees. "Everybody from the events coordinator to the catering staff is so fantastic to work with," she says. "The price is right, and it's just a great location."

Janet Hatfield, resource and membership services director for the Home Builders Association of Northern Colorado, plans the annual Home & Remodeling Show in the same building, drawing upwards of 10,000 people. They also have used The Ranch Bar & Grill in the Budweiser Event Center for a 140-person awards dinner. "It's one of the only venues where you can do a trade show" in Northern Colorado, she says, echoing Fahrenbruch's sentiments on cost and location.

Lodging comes in the form of the adjacent Embassy Suites by Hilton Loveland Hotel Conference Center & Spa that has 40,000 square feet of event space and the third largest ballroom in the state. "We partner with Embassy Suites and other major hotels as well," says Buttermore. "We can compete with major cities."

Cindy Mackin, visitor services manager for Visit Loveland, says The Ranch and Embassy Suites are complemented by smaller spaces at La Quinta Inn & Suites (6.170 square feet of meeting space), Sylvan Dale Guest Ranch (with an 1.815-square-foot event room), and the restored 1920s Rialto Theater Center downtown (with space for 120 and seating for 500 in the historic theater itself).

In the 75,000-resident community, Mackin touts "a lot of outdoor recreation and a lot of water" in the form of Boyd Lake, Lake Loveland and other local bodies of water, plus the public art and sculptures at Benson Sculpture Garden and the growing number of craft breweries within city limits.

But Loveland's also great for what's right outside of it, she adds. "We completely promote the fact that we are 35 minutes from Rocky Mountain National Park."

Greeley

About 20 miles east of Loveland, **Greeley** is on the cusp of opening its newest full-service hotel and conference center; The DoubleTree by Hilton Greeley at Lincoln Park is slated to host its first events in September 2017.

Ann Marie Cole, the hotel's director of sales, says she's already booked several local galas and conferences, but is looking to 2018 and beyond for larger events in the 12.000-squarefoot Centennial Ballroom, which can accommodate 800 for dining and 900 theater-style.

It's a much-needed facility for the city. "It is a big deal," confirms Cole, touting the hotel's locally focused restaurant. Meeker's – A Colorado Kitchen.

The target is "the association market and three- to four-day conferences," she adds. "There has been such a need for a full-service hotel and conference center. A lot of [local conferences and events] have gone outside of Greeley."

The hotel's event space opens up to Lincoln Park, the historic town square, and Cole says she's working with city officials to make the park available for events at the hotel.

The city's largest event venue is Island Grove Regional Park. The 155-acre municipal facility hosts the city's biggest annual event, Greeley Stampede, which draws 250,000 to its rodeos and concerts every July. Island Grove features a 15,000-seat arena as well as more than 100,000 square feet of indoor event space. The largest facility, the 80,000-square-foot Events Hall, can accommodate up to 8,280 people

Hildy Morgan, Friday events coordinator with the Buckhorn Valley Kennel Club, says Island Grove has been a great fit for dog shows that draw about 1,000 people and 1,300 canines every October. It's a good venue for the organization's budget and the event's, and Greeley's lodgings and the park's RV spaces accommodate overnight stays.

"One of the good things about getting out of a big city like Denver is you can spread out more," Morgan adds. "We feel Island Grove is the most exhibitor-friendly dog venue in the state."

Another larger event space is Union Colony Civic Center, with theater seating for 1,661 in its Monfort Concert Hall. University of Northern Colorado also has plenty of unique spaces including the Rocky Mountain Grand Ballroom which can accommodate 540 people for meals, along with a variety of smaller halls and classrooms.

The Homewood Suites by Hilton is a good option for smaller groups. The BNI Greeley PHDs Chapter has held weekly meetings at the Homewood Suites' 1,500-square-foot meeting room since late 2016. Jon Banza, president of the chapter and a salesman at Dellenbach Motors in Fort Collins, says the space allows the chapter to grow. "It seems like there's new life in the chapter," he says of the move from a smaller basement space in Greeley. "We were having trouble growing."

Greeley has numerous benefits for meetings and events. "We've got this lovely location that's sort of central to Denver, Estes Park and Cheyenne, and we're not as expensive as everybody else," says Amy Dugan, director of Visit Greeley, the city's tourism bureau, noting that Greeley is only a 45-minute drive from Denver International Airport. "We're kind of like a cruise ship: You go out on day excursions and come back for the night."

With a population of 103,000, Greeley is big enough to have plenty of amenities but small enough to be logistically manageable, she adds.

Dugan points to Greeley's fascinating history as another draw: "It was supposed to be a utopian society." Centennial Village, a living history museum, provides a lens to see the area's past, and Colorado Model Railroad Museum offers a chance to see tiny trains in dioramas inspired by historic railroads. A bustling brewery community and a growing gallery scene on 8th Avenue also provides groups with fun and memorable outings.

"It's a lovely city," she says, "We're so proud of it. People who grow up here stay here. Kids come to school here and stay here and work."



Lower prices and an enviable location that allows for easy day trips to area attractions, plus more manageable logistics, revitalized downtowns, and plenty of good beer.





Loveland

At the peak of Loveland's meetings market is The Ranch Events Complex. Opening the gates and doors in 2003, The Ranch (also known as the Larimer County Fairgrounds) can accommodate 10 to 100,000 people in its more than 375,000 square feet of event space. Three of the four buildings on campus include the Budweiser Events Center with a 7,200-seat arena and a 3,000-square-foot

restaurant; First National Bank Building with two 18,000-square-foot exhibition halls and five meeting rooms; and Thomas M. McKee 4-H, Youth & Community Building with a 12,500-square-foot hall and six meeting rooms. The fourth is the Ranch-Way Feeds Indoor Arena and Pavilions featuring a large arena and two indoor pavilions as well as the smaller attached Ranch Arena, plus two outdoor arenas located next to the building.

The Ranch's calendar includes 2,500 events a year, and it's much more than rodeos and horse shows. "There are a lot of different events we can do over here," says Sales Manager Katie Buttermore, touting parking availability and easy access to Interstate 25. "We have countless trade shows, corporate events, meetings across the board. We can accommodate small weekly meetings with 10 people to a campus-wide event of 100,000 people."

LOVELAND, Colo. -- Visitors of a popular northern Colorado lake are receiving some good news.

According to a new operating agreement which starts next summer, Lonetree Reservoir in Larimer County will remain open to recreation.

Last week, Colorado Parks and Wildlife said public access would be cut off after being outbid on a lease to operate the 300-acre lake and recreation area.

But the new leaseholder, Berthoud Heritage Metropolitan District, said public access for boating and fishing at the southwest Loveland reservoir will continue when the state's lease expires in July 2018.

The leaseholder said it has plans to improve the reservoir.

"We are thrilled to have been awarded the lease of Lonetree Reservoir," said John Turner, president of the district.

"We will keep this amenity open to the public. We have the resources to improve, manage and maintain this reservoir to an elevated level in which we have not seen with the current lessee."

Experience Sunrise Ranch with Paul Bassis

ARISE Music Festival co-founder and producer Paul Bassis spoke with me recently on the upcoming event to take place in Loveland, Colorado on August 4-6.

This will be the first year that our media outlet will have the opportunity to cover and report from Sunrise Ranch. We wanted to find out more on the environmental, musical, and geographical aspects to the festival.

Thank you for taking the time to speak with me today. First, let's go over your role with the ARISE Music Festival.

Paul: Sure, my name is Paul Bassis, and I am the co-founder and producer of the ARISE Music Festival. I've been there from the onset.

 $\mbox{CV:}$ The event has been going on for five years, correct? And was the original location the Sunrise Ranch?

Paul: That is right. ARISE Music Festival has only taken place at Sunrise Ranch.

CV: Why did you pick the Sunrise Ranch?

Paul: We just got lucky I suppose. Sunrise Ranch is an extraordinary place. The location has Red Rocks on one side and the foothills of the Rocky Mountains on the other. What I use to call a 'magic secret valley,' but I think the secret is getting out right now. It is just one of those places that people will want to come back to.

CV: Was the Sunrise Ranch geographical selected for a target demographic?

Paul: The location of the Sunrise Ranch happens to be extremely convenient in the sense that it is about an hour and ten minutes away from Denver, maybe 45 minutes from Boulder, about 25 minutes from Fort Collins. So, there was not another large-scale outdoor camping, music festival anywhere on the front range. Location is at the very least convenient, but it is also extraordinary beautiful.

CV: Could you give me an overview of the recycling efforts and the environmental progress the festival takes each year.

Paul: Absolutely, I appreciate you asking that because I think what you are speaking to is some of the core values of the ARISE Festival. Ultimately, these core values attract people to the festival. Obviously not just because there is great music, but because there is 'leave no trace' ethos that is very much at the heart of this kind of gathering. We also plant a tree with every ticket sold. We don't sell water in plastic bottles. We provide water for free, and encourage people to bring their own reusable water bottles.

ZeroHero does all the onsite recycling and composting. I have to take my hat off and give a lot of credit to the people that come to the festival, to the attendees. Who participate and contribute to that 'leave no trace' commitment that we have with this festival.

We could go a lot deeper and we could talk about carpooling, and how that reduces environmental impact and carbon footprint. We work with Bus to Show, and people can ride the bus to the festival. We encourage people to carpool to the festival.

CV: How did you go about booking and selecting the bands for the festival?

Paul: People who have attended the ARISE before, even though the music is that primary focus, they know that it is always going to be a great festival, and there is so much more going on besides the music.

To answer your question about the process of booking artists, and how does the music business work, or this aspect of it. Yes, we work by a committee. We have a team of talent buyers, and we go through of a process by starting with a wish list, and booking acts that we think that are right for ARISE.

We founded this festival on this basic philosophy that most people don't just like one kind of music; what most people like is really good music. Something that has that groove and moves them.

ARISE is a multi-genre festival, and we have everything from hip-hop to funk, to bluegrass, to reggae, to jambands and folk. There is a full gambit of genres of music without creating a clash of cultures.

CV: Which Colorado bands are up-and-coming or might make big waves at ARISE?

Paul: As a Colorado band, I have to say SunSquabi is the number one fast-rising act that is going to take the national scene by storm, and they already are.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{CV}}\xspace$: Is there any other topics that we did not cover yet, that you might want to share?

Paul: Sure, one other thing that we are proud of is that it has always been free for children 12 and under. It is not just because we want to make it more affordable for families, even though we do, but we also feel children should not be deprived of this kind of festival experience. I wanted to share that and encourage families to consider the ARISE Festival because there is not that many large-scale camping festivals that is free for children. We also have half-priced tickets for ages 13-17. That is again part of the core values



"We end with '1812 Overture' that has cannons and shotguns," said Kay W. Lloyd, executive director. It has become tradition for the group to include real a cannon in their performance.

The Longmont Symphony Orchestra performs at 1 p.m. in Thompson Park, 420 Bross St., Longmont. The group follows the Longmont Youth Symphony at 11:45 a.m. and the Longmont Chorale at 12:30 p.m.

will play before the fireworks at 8:15 p.m. in City Park, 1599 City Park Drive, with fireworks starting at 9:35 p.m.

"It's really wonderful to be at City Park with our whole community gathered," said Mary Kopco, executive director of the Fort Collins

Symphony. The band will be playing of mix of patriotic songs other popular tunes.

"Maestro (Wes) Kenney always has new music and we are going to be doing some John Williams' pieces from 'Star Wars' and 'Lincoln,'" she said. If the weather holds out the fireworks will end the "Sta Obserture"

"My heart always swells when our symphony plays something patriotic ...," Kopco said. "It's very moving."

If you choose to celebrate on your own, there are few things to consider. Illegal fireworks in the state of Colorado include anything that explodes or leaves the ground.

Safety should always be a consideration when handling fireworks. Through a press release, Dr. Lyndsay Deeter at Banner Health's Western States Burn Center in Greeley offered some thoughts on holiday safety.

Deeter suggested leaving the fireworks to the professionals as even sparklers can reach 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit. However, she did offer a few tips for those who want to set off their own.

The first is to be aware of the different kinds of burns. First-degree burns can resemble sunburns, pink or red in color. Treat with a cool cloth, cold running water and lotion. Second to third-degree burns are pink or red but are accompanied by a blistering or breaking of the skin. If this occurs, immediately get treated at the emergency room or urgent care. Use a cool wet cool cloth on the way to the medical facility to stop the burn. Do not use ice as it can cause permanent damage or frostbite.

Other tips include: keep a bucket of water close for proper disposal of all fireworks, have a sober adult present, never relight any fireworks and always keep children and pets at a safe distance.

Capt. Bill Porter of Larimer Humane Society said it will be the busiest time of year for his agency. He recommended residents keep pets safe inside, and turn on music or other noises to help keep them calm during fireworks.



Northern Colorado tennis enthusiasts have their hands full.

Little more than a week following the Debbie Boose Memorial Tournament, which saw more than 200 participants in its final year, they'll take up their racket again already for a full week of competition.

The Loveland Open tennis tournament returns to offer a seven-day event running July 10-16 at North Lake Park, a chance to compete against players from Northern Colorado, Denver and even Wyoming, all while raising money for the local Boys & Girls Clubs of Larimer County.

"It's always a fun time and everybody seems to enjoy it," tournament director Val Hecker said.
"It's a nice way to see people you haven't in a while and to visit with the regulars that come every year."

There will also be a donation box provided by Second Serve for players to donate gently used rackets, clothes and shoes.

The tournament will host matches at all levels, from 2.0 through 4.5, in men's and women's singles as well as doubles and mixed doubles. There will also be open men's and women's singles for those without a rating from the National Tennis Rating Program.

Most years the tournament sees similar faces return to compete, but newcomers are welcome with registration open until noon on Thursday. Hecker said the number of registered participants was around 120 as of Wednesday morning, but usually averages out to closer to 200.

from a week-long event into a two-day competition, offering just doubles matches featuring an alternate scoring format to move quicker, the Loveland Open remains traditional.

"It will be the regular format, different from the Boose," Hecker said. "It's not all about the tennis, but the tennis players say it's about the tennis. Maybe for the people putting it on, it's not about the tennis, but that's why we're there; to play tennis."

Generally the two events are separated by closer to a month, but this year the gap is only

10 days, meaning tennis players from Loveland and the surrounding area have every opportunity to get their fix.



But hiking trails in Colorado are shared-use areas, where horseback riders, bicyclers, trail runners, hikers and dogs congregate to enjoy the terrain and fresh air. When dog owners follow certain spoken and unspoken trail etiquette, hiking with our furry, four-legged companions will not only be fun for us, but for everyone else too. Here's everything you need to know about hiking with your dog as well as a list of dog-friendly hikes in Colorado.

Leashes

Getting outdoors might feel synonymous with unleashing your dog, but the hard-to-swallow fact for many dog owners is that leashes are required on most trails for many reasons. Unleashed dogs, even if they are well-behaved most of the time, can pose serious problems to other users of the trail as well as the natural flora and fauna. Not all dogs are friendly with other dogs and unleashed dogs may cause aggression issues from leashed ones. Also, the natural way most dogs would greet one another is on a curved path, whereas meeting face-to-face on the trail may excite them in an unpredictable way. Some hikers may not like dogs, some may be allergic, some may be frightened if one runs up without an owner, even if that owner is running behind the dog veiling "Syfle's friendly!"

In order to allow your dog off-leash on trails, it needs to be trained with voice commands to the extent that it will heel, stay and sit before ever running up to another trail user at any time. There are certain areas that have designated "off-leash" areas which are always very clearly marked.

Poop

The least glamorous aspect of being a dog owner, but an important one, is taking responsibility for your dog's poop. Even though wild animals take their number two's in the forest, your dog does not have a wild animal's diet, so your dog's excrement will be an invasive addition to the environment. The number oncule for dog poop is to pack it out — and that does not mean bagging the poop up and leaving it hanging on a nearby bush or tree. For a more environmentally-responsible way to pack it out, buy compostable doggy bags.

Other Trail Users

On shared use trails, hikers should always yield to other trail users (bicycles, horses, trail runners) and that especially applies to hikers with dogs. For this reason, dog-owning-hikers should be extra aware of their surroundings while on the trail to ensure they are ready to step out of the way or off the path to let someone else pass. Generally, on trails with steep elevation changes, the hikers descending should yield to hikers ascending, unless the ascending hikers are stopping for a rest.

No Dogs Allowed

National Parks in Colorado, like Rocky Mountain National Park, do not allow dogs on trails or in the back-country, though they allow them on six-foot leashes in campgrounds and on any roads that vehicles use. Other trails that do not allow dogs will have signage marked at the trailhead, though it is advisable to check online before loading your co-pilot into the Subaru. Once you find a dog-friendly trail (see our mapped guide below), make sure your dog "stays the trail" just like you. Hiking in the wilderness can be a dangerous thing for a dog (or person) unfamiliar with the terrain.

Wildlife and Dogs

There are two kinds of interactions that dog owners should avoid on trails and while camping: their dog as prey and their dog as a predator. Both of these situations are less likely to happen if the dog is on an leash and the owner is in control, but even then, awareness of your surroundings is key. Some animals, like the high alpine pikas and the endangered Preble's meadow jumping mouse, are already at risk without the addition of your dog chasing them down. Other animals can pose a serious threat to you and your dog, like moose, mountain lions, porcupines and snakes. Knowing if those animals have been spotted or are usually in moar are is essential, and keeping your dog on leash from dusk to dawn is most advisable. Hiking and camping always involve risks, which means that hiking and camping with your dog adds extra responsibility to your plate. Keep an eye on your furry friend — whether under leash or voice control — at all times because they may warn you before prev or predator approaches.

Veterans recall World War II as historic aircraft descend upon Northern Colorado

Memories rushed back to Bill Bernstein as he climbed through a B-24J Liberator bomber plane Friday at the Northern Colorado Regional Airport, where four World War II-era aircraft landed Friday afternoon.

Bernstein, a WWII veteran who said he helped fix planes, paused at a side-turret as he made his way through the interior of the last B-24 still flying. He placed his hands on the machine gun for a moment as he gazed out the window, recalling how many planes he worked on during his deployments to various bases, including in Guam and Okinawa, he said.

"I kept these birds flying," Bernstein said.

He was one of a handful of WWII veterans who attended the Wings of Freedom Tour event hosted by the Collings Foundation, a nonprofit that preserves historic aircraft and offers paying customers the chance to view and fly in the planes that affected the outcome of the Second World War.

Among the planes that descended upon Northern Colorado skies this weekend were a B-17 bomber, a B-25 medium bomber, a P-51 Mustang fighter and the famous B-24 now known as "Witchcraft" which flew under the British flag and saw combat in the Pacific theater before outliving its counterparts to become the last of the model still flying.

his crew, he said.

Bernstein was joined by fellow WWII veterans Lee Bashor, a former B-17 pilot who flew out of a base in England; Joe Hoberman, who fought in France with American infantry; Mel Engeman, a former B-24 pilot who flew in the Pacific theater; Mal Middlesworth, a Marine and Pearl Harbor survivor; and Philip Daily, a former B-17 tail gunner who flew out of an air base in Italy.

In fact, earlier this year, Daily was awarded a Prisoner of War Medal at 91 years old, 72 years after being taken prisoner by German soldiers when he was shot down out of his plane with

While none of the veterans gathered Friday planned to take a flight with the Collings Foundation over the weekend, Engeman said he flew in a B-24 several years ago.

"Before that, the last time I flew one was 65 years ago," Engeman said, adding that the pilot on the plane even allowed Engeman to take over the controls for a while.

"I cruised at about 6,000 feet," he said.

The four planes will be on display at the airport through 5 p.m. Sunday. Admission to explore the aircraft is \$15 for adults and \$5 for children under 12, and 30-minute flights are offered on the B-17 or B-24 for \$450 per person, and on the B-25 for \$400 per person.

Flight experiences are normally scheduled for before and after the ground tour times from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. For reservations and information on flight experiences, call 800-568-8924.



Android Jones is a digital artist who creates his pieces using the most accessible means possible his own software.

Recognizing that a challenge in visual arts is navigating the sheer amount of creative software available to the artist, Jones found a solution in developing his own, called Microdose VR. The software is currently in beta development and only in use by a small circle of testers, according to the Microdose VR Facebook

"It's not perfect but it gives you another dimension," Jones said. "A more intimate interface, a greater degree of flexibility, so that I

can improvise on the spot."

Jones, 40, is a third-generation Colorado resident and was born in the Boulder area. His studio is a repurposed barn in Lyons. He has an online audience of almost 350,000 followers on Facebook, and has created cover art for well-known rock and electronic artists, including Beats Antique. His work has been featured in galleries nationwide, and he currently maintains an online gallery of more than 100 pieces. Images by Jones have been projected on the Sydney Opera House and the Empire State Building, according to the website of the Arise Music Festival, where Jones will appear as the featured visual artist when the festival takes place from Aug. 4-6.

Jones was an intern at George Lucas' Industrial Light and Magic, and he received training in the

arts at the Ringling School of Art and Design in Sarasota, Fla., studying traditional drawing, painting and animation. However, his work is anything but traditional.

"My life has been structured to a devotion of the creative experience," he said. "Regardless of oil, clay, pixels, projections, all these different mediums are like channels and outlets for me to dive deeper into a creative flow state, to connect with a form of creative energy. When I can go deep into a creative mediation, those experiences are the most



precious, mystical states of mind that I've found the ability to access." Jones added that he has tried to build a career and a lifestyle that gives him "as much opportunity to take the residue of that experience and share."

Will perform with Tipper

Balancing digital elements with the inspiration he draws from outdoors, Jones strives to recreate the natural world with as few limitations as he can. His pieces are saturated with bright colors, incorporate complex geometric shapes, and often depict portraits that reflect an enhanced, dreamlike world. In showcases, his physical pieces range from medium- to large-size, which immerses the viewer in the creative consciousness that Jones conveys. He also performs live visual sets, both solo and in collaboration with DJs, where he creates digital paintings on the spot with the music.

Jones recently showcased a short visual set with the DJ Bassnectar during Bassnectar's Freestyle Sessions concert at 1stBank Center earlier this month. He also performs with British producer Dave Tipper at Tipper's shows in the United States and overseas. He will perform with Arise headliner Tipper using Microdose VR during the festival in Loveland.

Jones describes his role as a "visual translator" to Tipper's music, he said. "Every Tipper performance

is completely improvised and spontaneous. It's the way that I respect Tipper's particular genius in his process," Jones said. "I take the sounds that he is creating and turn that into a live, unfolding, visual vocabulary and language so it creates a deeper experience, an immersive experience for the crowd." At Arise, Jones will also participate as a panelist in a discussion featuring visionary artists, and he will present a physical showcase of his work.

It is important to Jones when creating that the process "doesn't feel like I'm manipulating software or code or numbers, (where) I'm able to take the subject and translate my emotions and intentions and intuition, and project it directly from my imagination," he said.

"I feel that out of any type of medium that I could be using, technology gives me the greatest amount of possibilities to explore," Jones said. "I very rarely feel limited by technology. But I do feel limited by time, or learning all the things that I want to learn. I live on a farm, but I see technology as an extension of the natural world. (A computer) is made of magnesium, quartz crystals — (it is) the synthesis of man's perseverance and imagination and efforts — the consciousness of man and Earth together."

The results of Jones' methodology are pieces ripe with access points to the viewer. His penchant for the recreation of the complex beauty of reality is recognizable to many audiences.

"I'd like to think that when people see something in my work and it's something they're responding to, I want them to first connect with the energy of passion and love and excitement that I have when I create a piece," Jones said.

New lane will improve I-25 in Northern Colorado

Reliability. It's a word I think of often in my role as mayor pro tem of Fort Collins. It's the quality of being trustworthy or performing consistently well. We look for this trait in our friends, coworkers and elected officials. We should expect the same of our transportation system to safely take us where we need to go every day.

A safe, reliable transportation system is critical to our quality of life. Yet, for many years, we've been dealing with subpar conditions on Interstate 25 in Northern Colorado, which sees more vehicles on the road every year. In the 40 years I've lived in Fort Collins, our population has increased twofold. Our university has grown, stimulating our economy, attracting the tech industry and innovative manufacturers, and now our region has one of the fastest population growths in the state.

Unfortunately, our transportation infrastructure has not kept up, and we've been dealing with the potholes and congestion. The good news is our time has come. The Colorado Department of Transportation has a vision for implementing improvements for the north I-25 corridor and our local city and county governments have been working with them to find funding to accelerate these critical projects. Starting early next year, state contractors will begin work on the muchanticipated north I-25 express lanes: Johnstown to Fort Collins project. We'll soon have an express lane in both directions of I-25, in addition to the existing free, general purpose lanes.



The express lanes will bring congestion relief with added capacity and mobility choices that include free travel for carpoolers and transit, in addition to the toll-paying options. The bottom line is that we can't build our way out of congestion, as we've seen elsewhere in the country and even in our own state. Research shows new general purpose lanes fill up just like those beside them once they are built. Also, the toll revenue will help to pay for this added infrastructure and the ongoing operations and maintenance costs.

Some people will choose to use the express lanes because they value their time at home, work, or school more than their time in traffic. Others may use them occasionally depending on their urgency to reach their destination. Then there are those who choose to carpool and use the lane free. These express lane users equate to less congestion in the general purpose lanes. Express lanes offer more choices, which results in greater reliability for all the users, in all the lanes. Express lanes give drivers choices about why, when and how to use

Reliability. For me, that means getting my grandsons to see their cousins and the Rockies when we need to be there. My two young grandsons refer to the express lane as "Grandpa's Lane." When we go with them to Denver, I always use the lane and they love it - they are early converts to

This project will help accommodate population growth, allow our economic growth to continue and will set us up to meet future mobility needs. I'm excited and hope you are too.


















