Youth Scholarship Program

The Loveland Parks and Recreation Foundation is a non-profit corporation formed in 1983 to foster and encourage the advancement of parks and recreation opportunities in Loveland.

The program requires that a child (family) be referred to the Foundation by a school representative, social service agency, church or some other community organization which has a working knowledge of the child (family). This program does not operate on strict income requirements; the referrals are the means of identifying family need. It is recommended that individuals being referred to the Foundation also complete the Low Income status application form to stretch available dollars to more families.

Scholarship Criteria & Processes

- Youth Recreation Scholarship Forms are available at the local schools and social service agencies.
- The program is designed to assist youth ages 0 to 18 years old (must live in R2J School District boundaries).
- Most classes or recreation activities listed in the Loveland Parks & Recreation Activity Guide are eligible for scholarship funding.
- Paid admissions to the Chilson Recreation Center are included in the scholarship program only consideration of the Foundation Board.
- Individuals requesting use of the Chilson Center must attach a letter to their application indicating why they have a special circumstance and how often they would utilize the facility. Chilson passes will only be awarded to families who qualify for "Low Income" status to maximize Foundation resources.
- The scholarship program runs on the calendar year (Jan-Dec). Applicants need to file only one scholarship application each year.
- Scholarship funds are allocated on a quarterly basis.
 Participants are limited to one paid scholarship program per quarter, based on available funding.
- There is a maximum scholarship award of \$175 per individual and \$600 per family per calendar year.

How to Apply for Scholarships

Scholarships are granted on a funds available basis. All scholarship requests must be on the official Foundation Scholarship form. Attached to the scholarship form must be a signed Activity Registration Form. Once the application and registration form are received, requests will be processed immediately and the applicants will be notified by mail.

Applications must be received at least one week prior to the start date of the requested activity. Applications are processed on a first come basis, based on available funds.

Low Income Assistance [Reduced Rates for Programs/Activities)

2018 Low Income Fee Policy

(January 1, 2018-December 31, 2018) In order to get reduced rates, families must meet gross income levels (125% of Federal Poverty Level) and be designated as a "Low Income" household.

Applicants must reside WITHIN Loveland City Limits – all participants, no exceptions.

Applicants and family members must have resided within the City Limits for at least 30 continuous days from the date of application with the address as their only residence.



How to Apply for Low Income

Individuals or families wishing to apply for Low Income rates for specific facilities & programs should make application at one of the following agencies:

Pre-Qualification will be the sole responsibility of the agencies listed with the final approval tendered by the Loveland Parks & Recreation Department. Applicants receiving pre-approval from one of the listed agencies will be issued an approval form certifying qualification. The yellow copy of this form should be given to the applicant and, in turn, be presented to the clerk at the reception desk at the Hatfield Chilson Recreation Center for reduced rates on specified facilities and/or classes.

Applications will be approved for reduced rates at the Chilson Center once the original copy and affidavit has been received directly from the qualifying agency.

Parks & Recreation staff will also verify residency prior to issuing the final determination/award.

The reduced fee application must be renewed every six months.

Once a family has the "Low Income Designation", they can register for most (not all) Parks & Recreation activities and classes or purchase a 6 month Chilson Extended Use Pass at a 50% discount.

Passes must be purchased within the 1st six weeks after Low Income approval.

Applicants must re-qualify for Low Income Designation every six months.

Daily "Low Income" admissions for the Chilson Center and Winona are as follows for pre-qualified families with a 6 month Low Income ID card (\$1.00 per cardholder):

to cancel or limit any Low Income qualification for
non-compliance with established City and Departmental
policies, regulations and rules. Any individual or family
member that is suspended from use of City facilities,
for any reason, can jeopardize the Low Income fee
qualification for the entire family.

Pursuant to Colorado HB-1023, natural persons over the age of 18 who are contracting with or receiving "public benefits" from the City of Loveland are required to prove their lawful presence in the United States by executing an affidavit and by presenting certain types of approved identification. Pre-qualifying agencies are required to submit a signed affidavit form and proof of lawful presence along with the original copy of the application form for our records. Failure to provide required documentation will cause the application to be rejected.
