



Comparison of Municipal and District Libraries - Governance

Municipal

- Least amount of autonomy
- Library Board responsibility determined by municipal government (City Council)

District

- Highest degree of autonomy
- Library Board powers specified in “Library Law” CRA 24-90-109
- Board has full governing and decision making authority

Comparison of Municipal and District Libraries - Funding


Municipal

- Funding from municipal general funds (sales tax)
- Budget determined by municipal government (City Council)
- TABOR limits apply


District

- Funding from set mill levy passed by voters
- Property tax is principle source of funding
- Library board responsible for budget
- TABOR and Gallagher limits apply


Median Operating Expenditures Per Capita 2013-2017




Median Operating Revenue Per Capita 2013-2017




Median Visits Per Capita 2013-2017




Median Circulation Per Capita 2013-2017




The Library Board recommends that the City and Library administration continue to monitor Colorado library law and local political and economic conditions to understand that forming a library district is an option that must be approved by the voters at a November general election.






Loveland Library Funding Trends

Mill Levy Calculation Assumptions

- District boundaries would be TSD minus Berthoud Library District
- One mill would be ~\$1,617,782 (minus 2% collection fee)
- At three mills, the Library's budget would be ~\$4.85M
- Library's budget in 2018 is \$4.46M (with cost allocations)
