A meeting of the Loveland Historic Preservation Commission was held Monday, June 17, 2019 at 6:00 P.M. in the Development Center at 410 East 5<sup>th</sup> Street, Loveland, Colorado. Historic Preservation Commissioners in attendance were Zach Askeland, Jim Cox, Stacee Kersley, Reyana Jones, Paula Sutton, Josh McCarn, and Laurie White. Councilor Fogle, Nikki Garshelis, and Cita Lauden of Development Services were also present.

**GUESTS:** Julia Ward, prospective student commissioner.

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Commission Chair McCarn called the meeting to order at 6:04 p.m.

#### APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

Commissioner Sutton made a motion to approve the May meeting minutes. Commissioner Cox seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

#### **CITIZEN REPORTS**

None

#### CITY COUNCIL UPDATE

Councilor Fogle provided the following updates:

- The County building is back on the market. *Commissioner Sutton* suggested the County building be documented.
- Councilor Fogle expressed concerns over the high cost of the Fire Sprinkler systems required for some downtown buildings.
- Council is reviewing possible budget cuts for 2020.

#### STAFF UPDATE

Nikki Garshelis reviewed the staff report, which included the following items:

- Instagram The Loveland Historic Preservation site has 940 followers (as of 6.12.19)
- Survey Grant Application The CLG grant agreement was sent June 11, 2019. Staff will be scheduling it as an item for approval to accept the funds from Council. Once approved, the bid process can be implemented and a consultant can be hired to begin the survey work.
- McCreery House Loan for porch restoration A loan check for \$4,229.01 was paid June 7, 2019. It will be due June 7, 2024.
- Medina Cemetery Bill Meirath of the Loveland Historical Society has asked for the help of the HPC to erect a sign at the historic cemetery, which was designated in 2014. The city no longer makes the wooden engraved signs for Loveland parks and vendor costs can be almost \$2,000. An 18"X24" metal sign costs about \$50 and a wooden post approximately the same. The commissioners asked for more selections.
- Odd Fellows/Majestic Opera House Building, Fire and Planning staff met with Odd Fellows members on May 28 to discuss how to bring their building up to code to attract a tenant in their lower floor. Removing the mezzanine to increase exit height in the rear and restrooms was suggested by fire and building staff. A meeting is scheduled with City staff and DDA staff for June 19 to discuss grant assistance and tenant attraction.

• Milner Family Member: Jonathan Cain, a descendant of Sarah Milner (3X his great Grandmother) contacted City staff about his family connection. He lives in Idaho Springs but comes to Loveland occasionally and is interested in meeting. Loveland Historical Society members have been contacted and a meeting will be planned at the Milner-Schwartz House once we know Mr. Cain's schedule here.

#### **CONSIDERATION OF NEW BUSINESS**

#### **DOWNTOWN DESIGN STANDARDS**

  Commission Chair McCarn reported on the Downtown Design Standards meeting with Commissioners Cox and Askeland. A professional design firm has submitted a proposal to reformat and provide graphics for the document. The Commissioners discussed the project and agreed the design firm service was a good idea. The project would cost over \$6000.00 and would require funding from other sources. The Commissioners will work on finding funding partners for the project.

#### PAST FORWARD CONFERENCE - October 10 -12

Commissioner Sutton shared information and pricing for the Past Forward conference. Nikki
Garshelis will get further information as to what is included with registration and will email the
Commissioners to determine who would like to attend. There will be further discussion at the next
meeting in July.

#### GREAT WESTERN RAILROAD & FREIGHT BUILDING UPDATE -

 • Commissioner Sutton reported that the LHS has a new President, Terri Johnson. Ms. Johnson is reviewing the RFP for GWR project. Commissioner Sutton will provide updates at the July meeting.

#### CHILDREN'S TOUR/COLOR BOOK

 Commissioner Kersley reported that the Children's Coloring Book project should be a project for next year which would allow more time to put together photos and materials to be included in the book. Commissioner Kersley will begin taking photos and gathering information over the next several months.

#### **COMMISSIONER COMMENTS**

 • Commissioner Sutton shared that the Historic Bike Tour was cancelled due to lack of attendance and suggested rescheduling it for another date in August or September. A discussion followed.

 • Commissioner Kersley inquired about the status of the Oasis Property. A letter sent to the property owner and has received no response.

**City Council Approved Julia Ward:** At the July 2 City Council Meeting Julia Ward was approved as the next High School Student Commissioner. She will begin her one year term in August 2019.

**Survey Grant:** The grant appropriation fund item is on the July 16 City Council Agenda for approval. If approved the bid process can begin and a consultant can be hired to begin the survey work.

**Heidi Fuhrman**: Heidi Fuhrman has begun her volunteer position for the Historic Preservation project of completing two Intensive Inventory forms for historic properties in Loveland. The property at 111 Roosevelt Avenue will be her first project. Her second project is TBD. Heidi received her B.A. degree in history from Colorado State University in 2018. She also completed an independent study program in May 2018 where she researched and authored a National Register nomination form and preservation plan for the Andrew G. Clark Building on the campus of Colorado State University. She worked with Section 106 compliance, NRHP, conducted research and site visits, authored reports and completed forms and site documentation. In addition, she served in 2017 as a Programs Intern at the National Museum of American History, Smithsonian Institution
