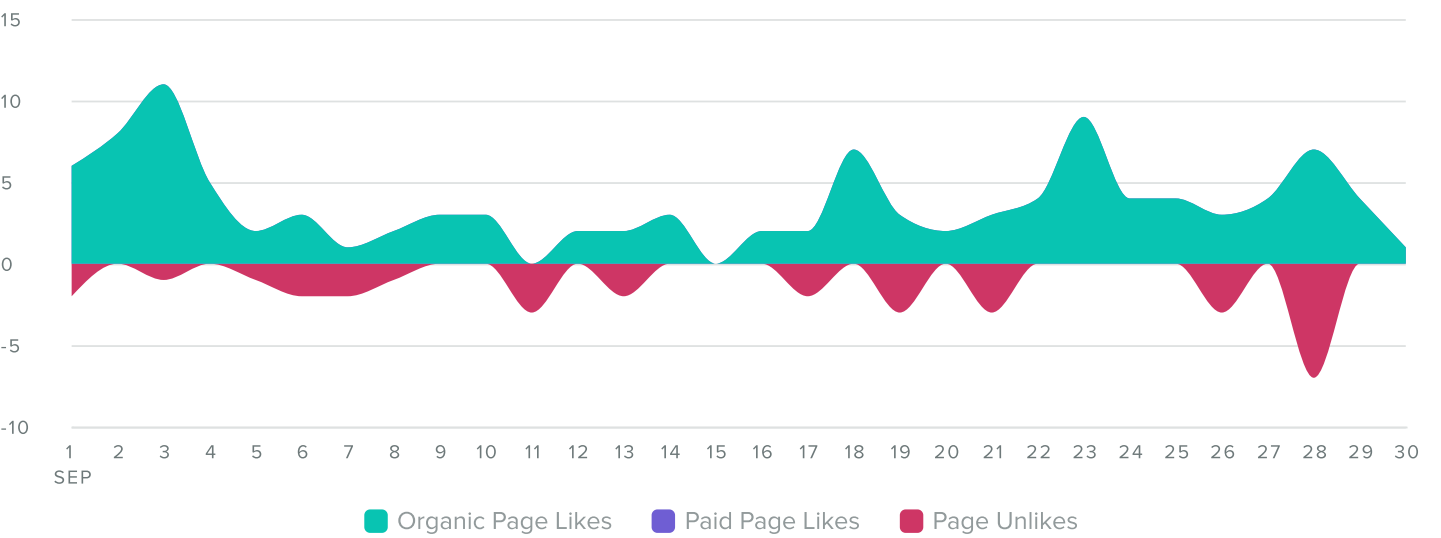

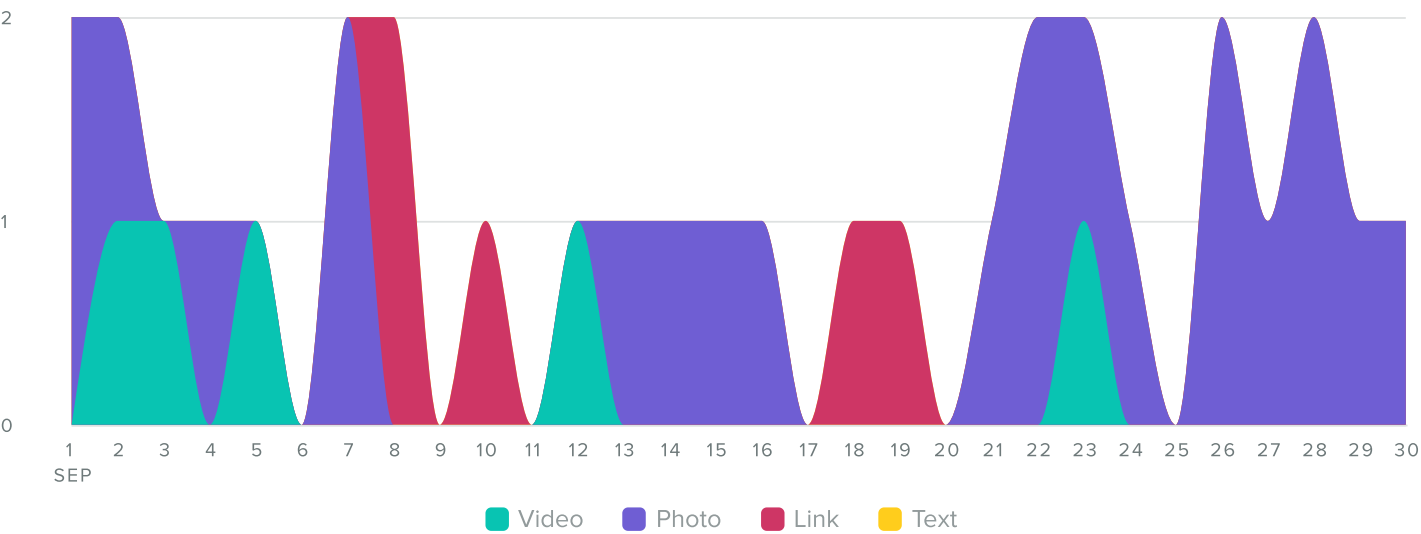

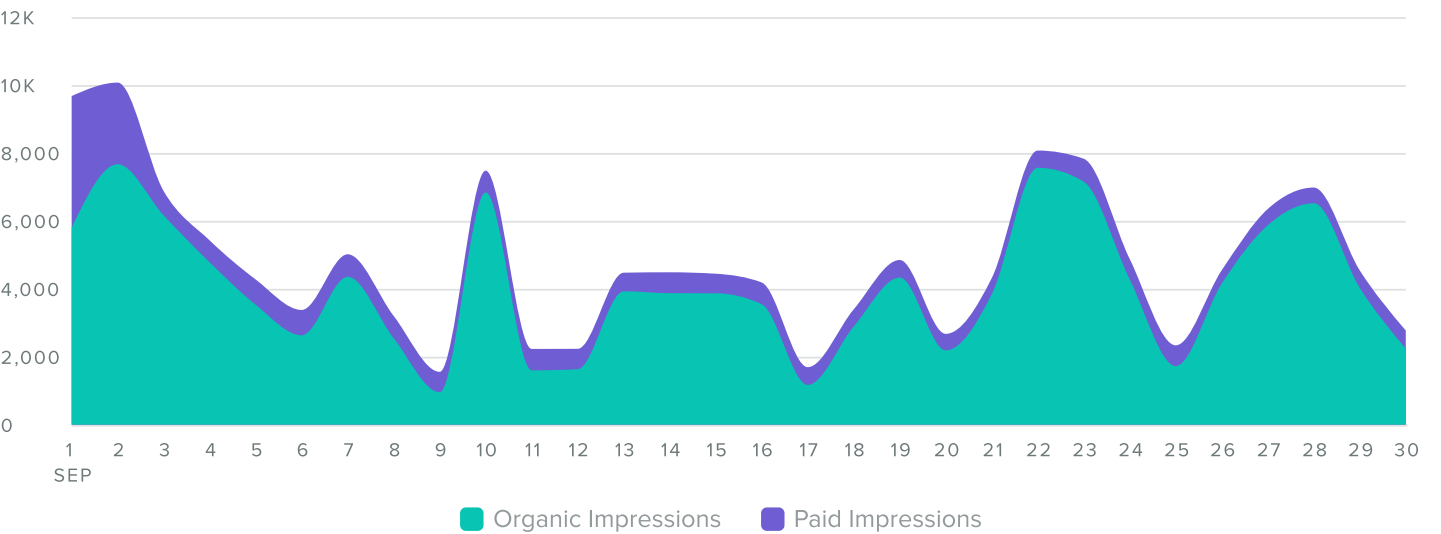

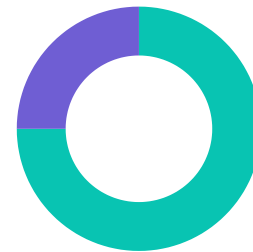

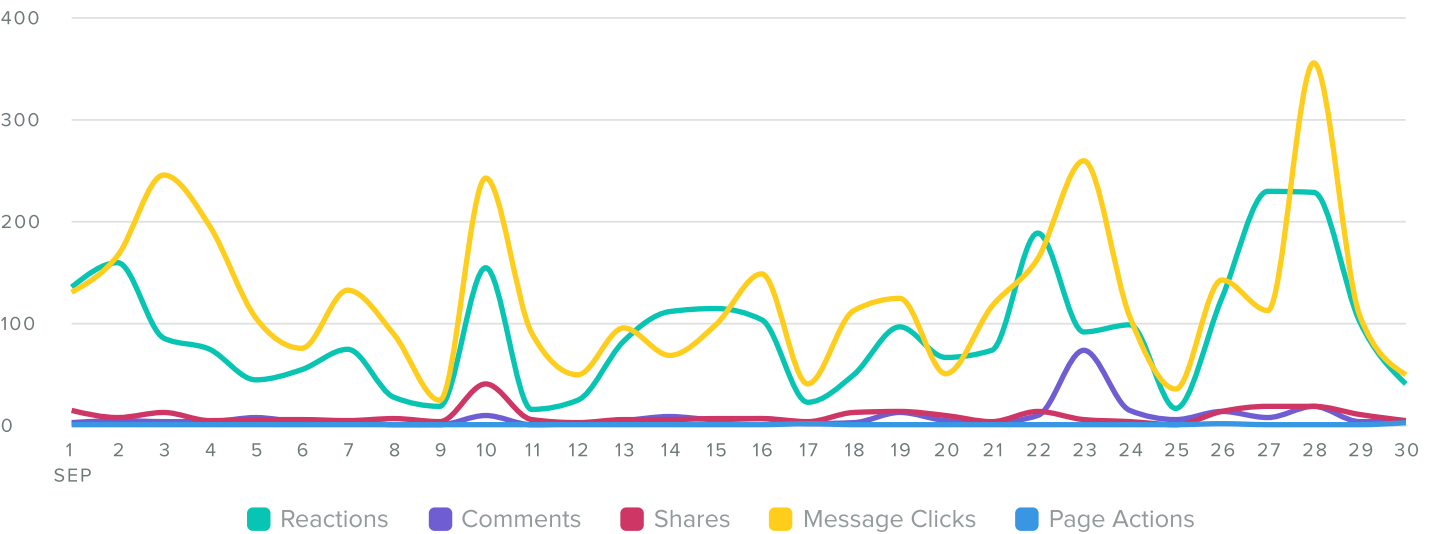

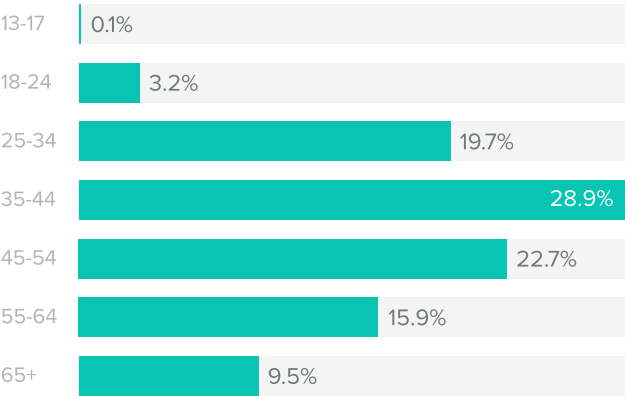

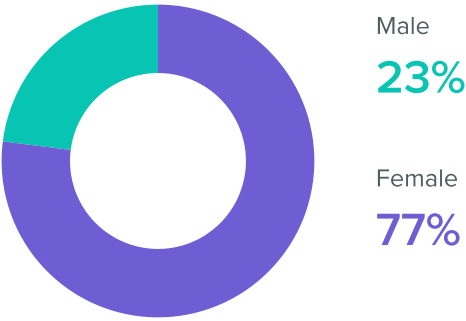

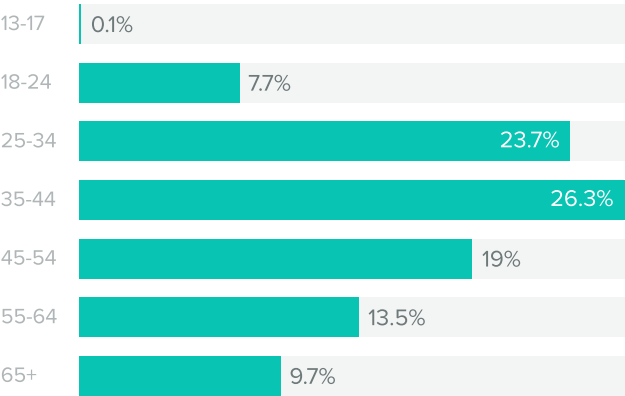

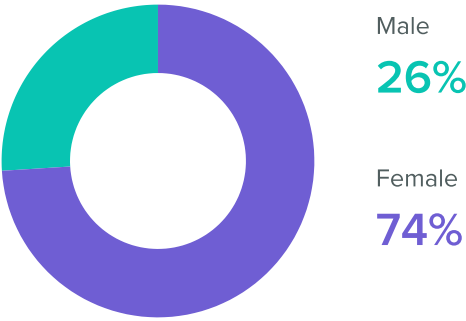

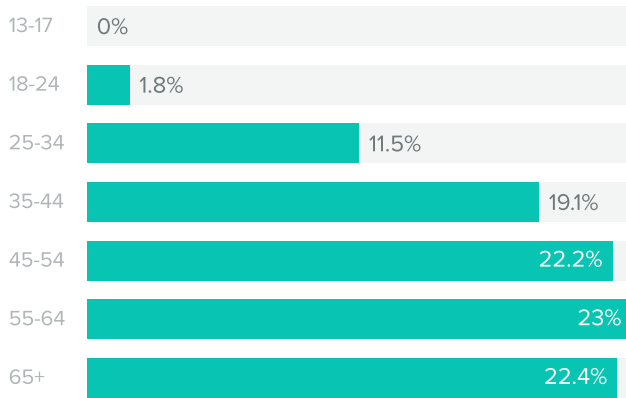

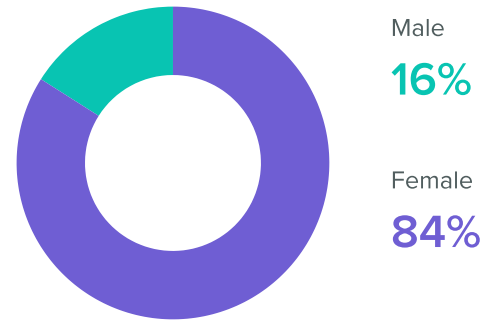

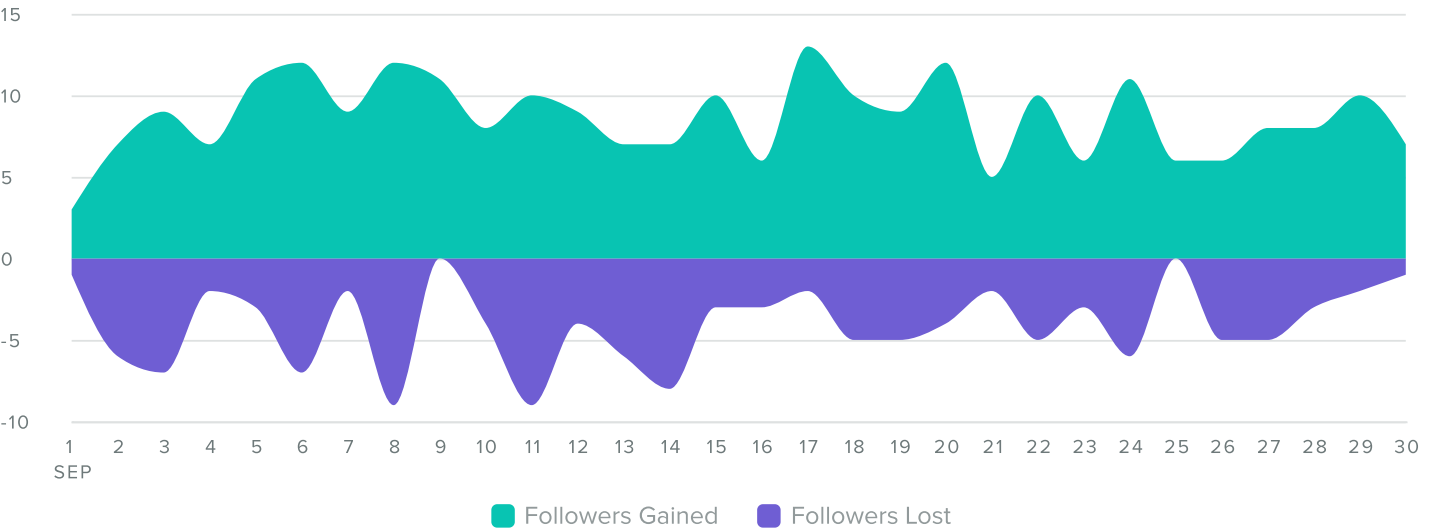

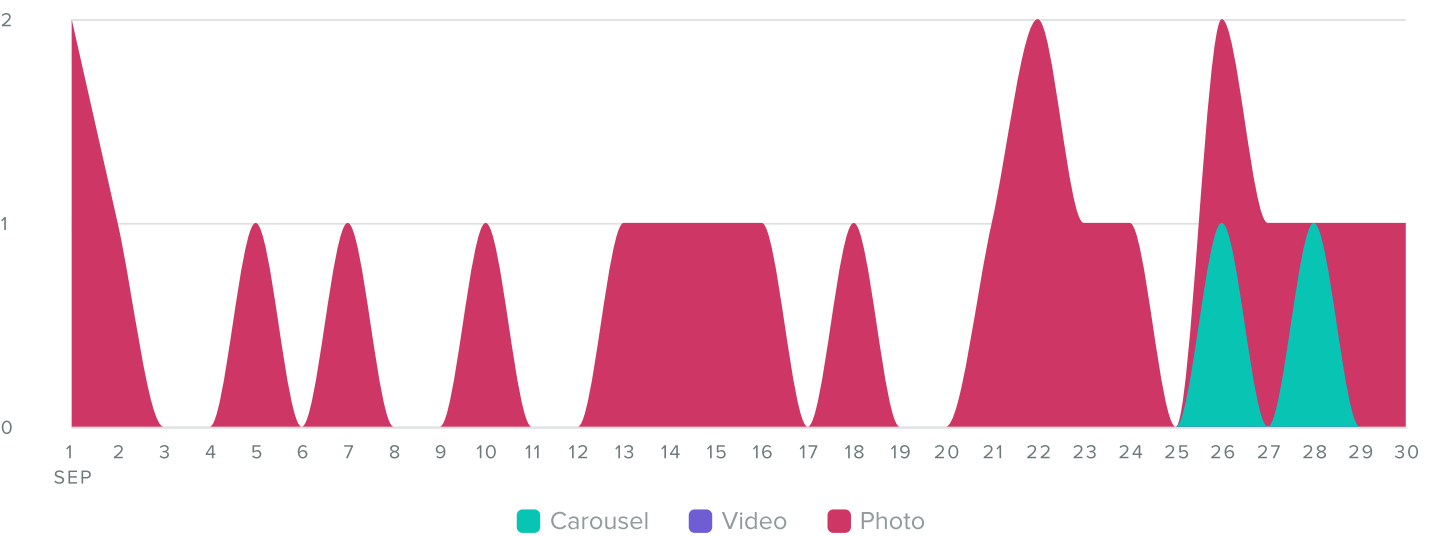

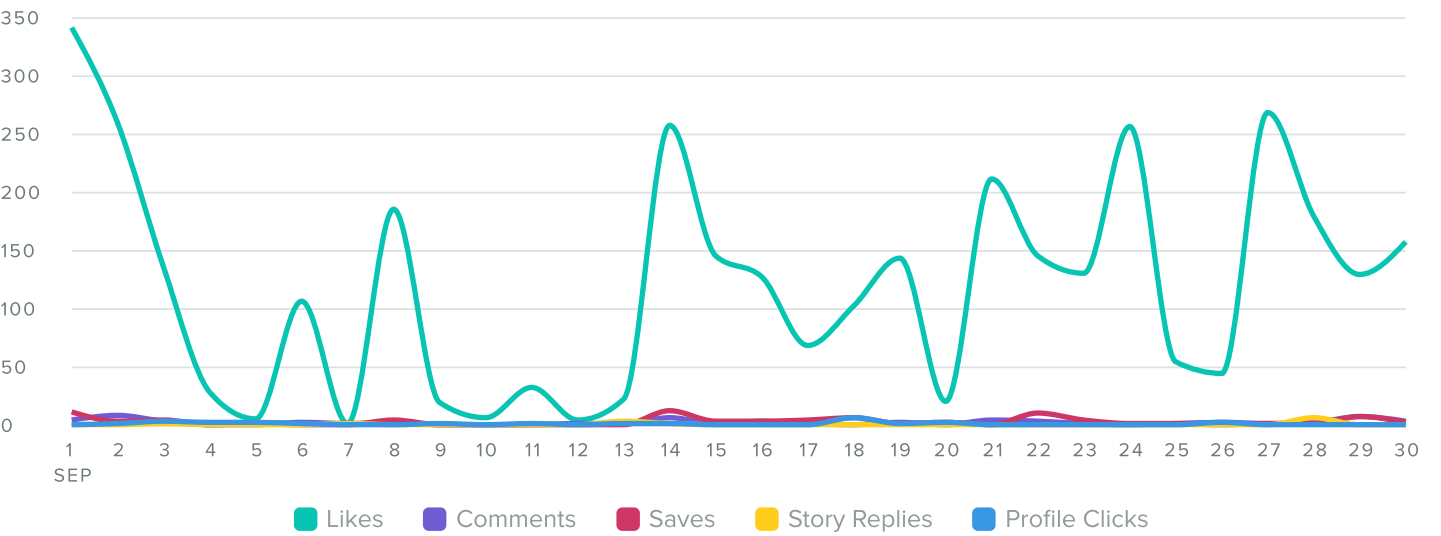

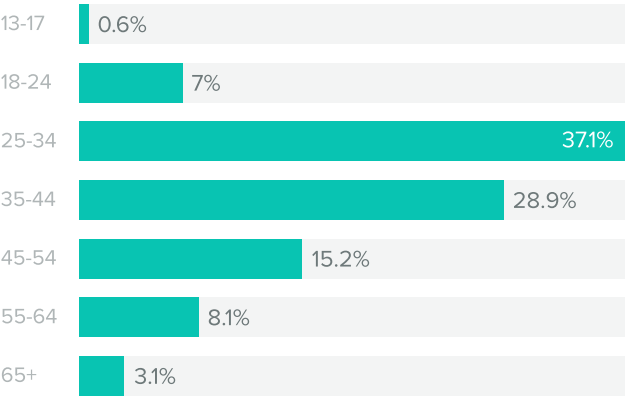

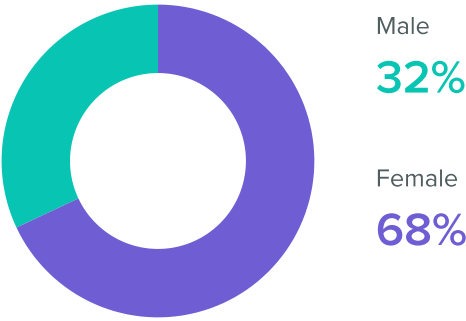

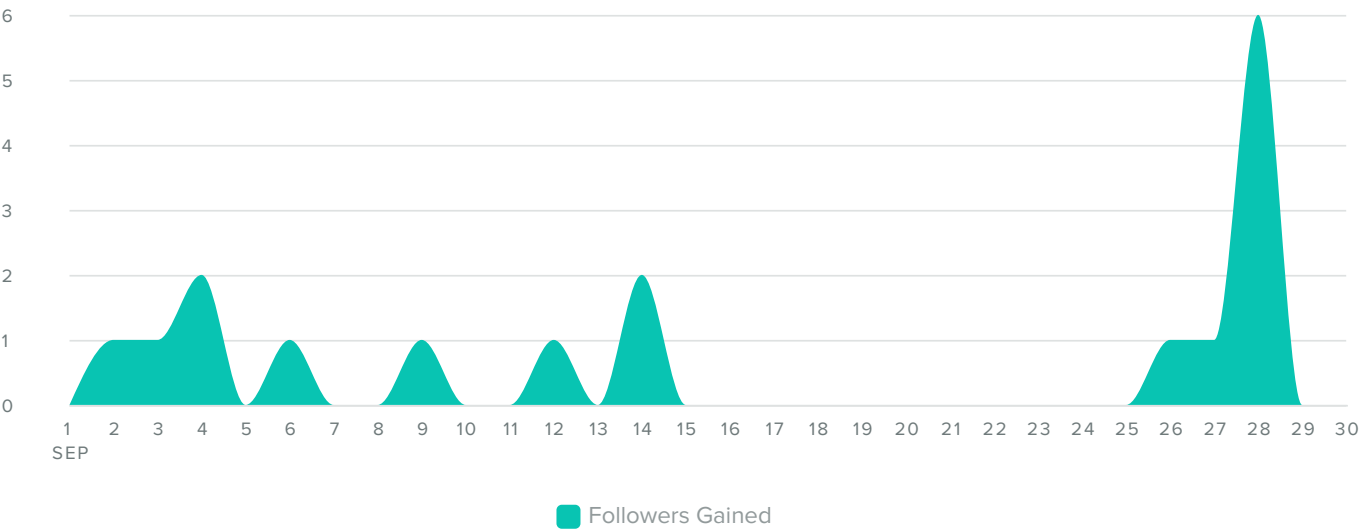

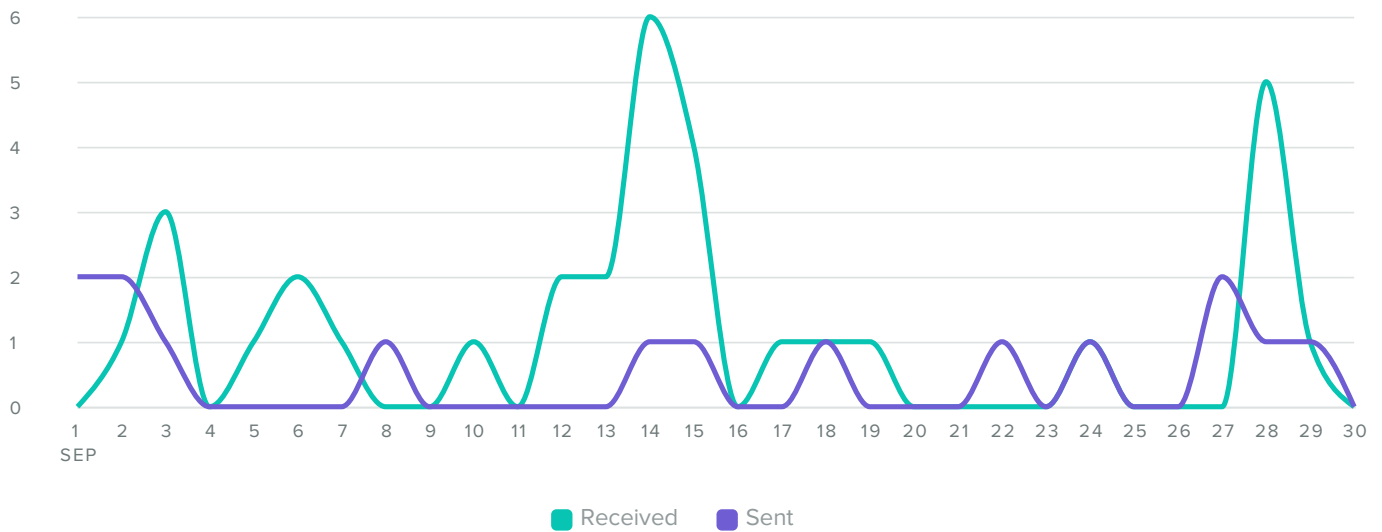

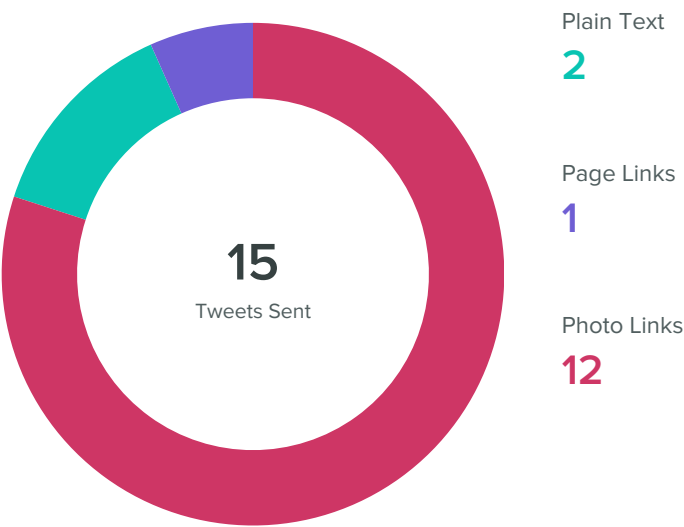

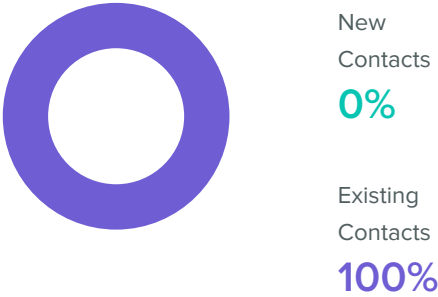

Conversation Behavior (Last 100 Tweets)

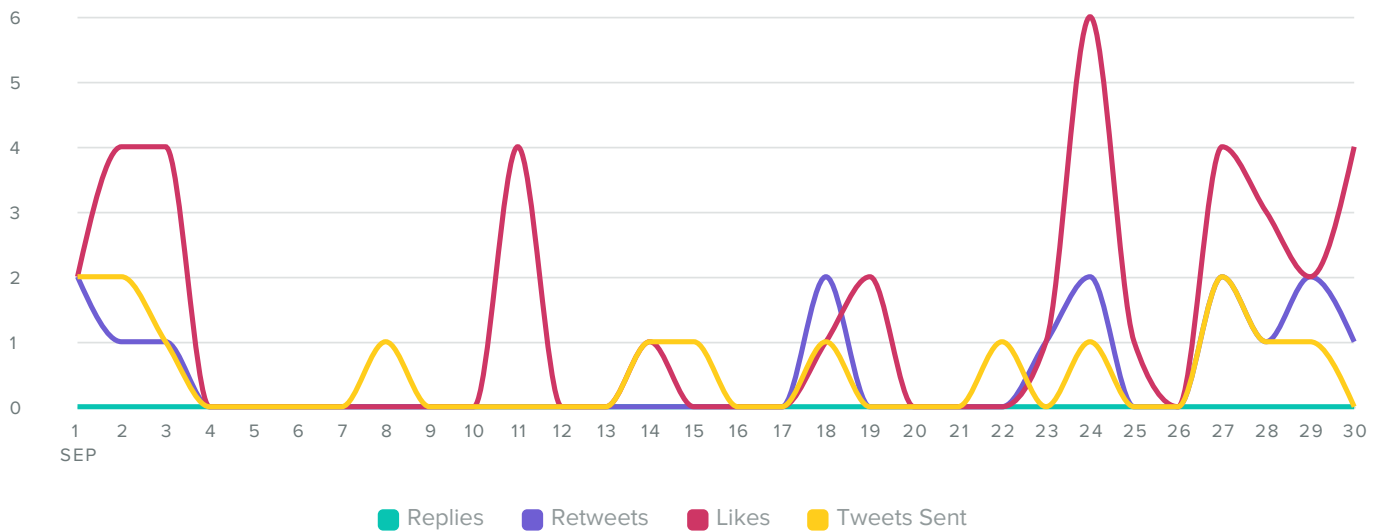

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Where to go stargazing in Colorado, from parks to small towns

Finding a dark place is the most important part of any stargazing trip

Ever since Ann Donoghue became president of the [Northern Colorado Astronomical Society](#), she's harbored an obsessive hatred for bad lighting.

Any lamp that spews light into the sky, instead of, say, onto a sidewalk or puts out enough light to rival the sun earns some

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sidewalk, or puts out enough light to rival the sun earns some gnashing teeth from Donoghue, who lives in Fort Collins.

“It drives me nuts,” she said.

Of course, she’s supposed to notice those things. That bad lighting, what stargazers call light pollution, prevents us from seeing all but the brightest stars.

Donoghue hates bright lights more than Gizmo, but she isn’t as star crazy as you might think. She doesn’t own a telescope big enough for you to see Russia from your house or a galaxy far, far away (although some in her organization do have one). She prefers to bring a good but simple pair of binoculars and travel to some dark place.

Finding those dark places, in fact, is the most important part of any stargazing trip.

“It’s like birding,” Donoghue said. “You’re out to see as many things as you can.”

(There’s a list, by the way, for amateur astronomers to check off nebulae and other features of the night sky the same way a birder might check off a Forty-spotted Pardalote.)

A dark sky black enough to show off the Milky Way is an endangered species in Colorado, thanks to all those bright lights, especially in urban centers. The metro area is the biggest culprit, of course — Donoghue even sees that glow from Cheyenne 60 miles away when she’s out on a stargazing trip — but bad lighting can blot out stars anywhere.

Even so, there are many places in Colorado you can go that will offer up a good show, and a few dark places left in the state

Places To Go

- 1. **Lake City:** Lots of mountain towns should have good views of the stars, but Lake City hopes to get a designation from the International Dark Sky Association.
- 2. **Rocky Mountain National Park:** Along with having many places to gaze at the night sky, the park also hosts night sky programs in the summer.
- 3. The **Pawnee National Grassland** and **Crow Valley Campground:** The Grassland offers many dispersed camping spots and is dark enough to stargaze.
- 4. **Golden Gate Canyon State Park:** This park near Golden offers good views in a nice area to camp. It’s a popular area, so reserve your spots early.
- 5. Larimer County has several great spots, including **Bobcat Ridge Natural Area**, **Devil’s Backbone**, the **Soaring Eagle Ecology Center** at Red Feather Lakes, and **Boyd Lake** and **Lory** state parks.

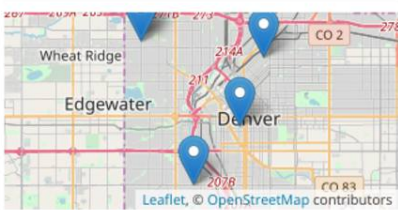

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offer up a good show, and a few dark places left in the state where you can see the Milky Way. And they're not as far as you think.

Rocky Mountain National Park, for instance, is an hour away for most folks, and in the summer the park hosts night sky programs through August. (After a busy summer, Cynthia Langguth, RMNP's night sky coordinator and park ranger, said there may be classes this fall. [Check the website](#) for more details.) There are many lookout spots, and the park even works with Estes Park and Grand Lake to dim their lights and keep the night sky dark in the park, Langguth said.

"The less tangible things the park tries to preserve can be more challenging, such as fresh water or clean air or the night sky because we don't have as much control over those," Langguth said. "But even then, that makes our night sky even more valuable and a springboard to talk about the value of darkness on so many levels, to our animals and plant life but also as our place in the universe."

The night sky remains vulnerable even when a metro area remains relatively far away. Pawnee National Grassland near Greeley was a popular place to stargaze, but it was dimmed by oil and gas development, Donoghue said. Now, those oil rigs are in place at last, so the bright lights are mostly gone again.

Many stargazers prefer to camp on the **Pawnee**, which is allowed within 300 feet of most Forest Service roads on public land. The Pawnee is a mix of public and private land, so campers may need a visitor map, said Reghan Cloudman, spokeswoman for the U.S. Forest Service. Many others prefer the relative comfort of the nearby **Crow Valley Campground**, which offers a view dark enough to see the Milky Way.

"Obviously the farther out you go, the

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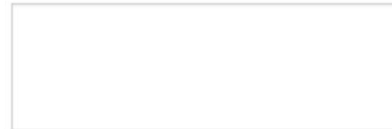

"Obviously the farther out you go, the fewer lights there are," Cloudman said.

Residents of some darker towns in Colorado hope to preserve the night sky. Phillip Virden was living in Texas

in the early 1970s when he took his first camping trip to **Lake City** and saw the Milky Way for the first time. He's been a resident ever since, and owns the town's movie theater.

"I looked up and thought, 'What in the world is that?'" Virden said. "I was deeply moved."

He's since worked to get the town certified by the [International Dark Sky Association](#), an organization that works to preserve the darkest corners of the world and raise awareness about light pollution.

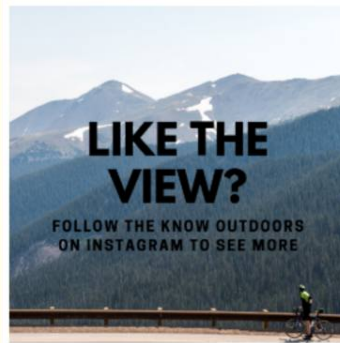
In Colorado, Norwood, Westcliffe and Silver Cliff are already designated Dark Sky Communities.

"That dark sky designation would be wonderful," Virden said, "but the real idea is to increase awareness about it. The problem is getting worse, and people aren't even aware of it. I think it's an urgent matter."

The good news, Virden said, is that the interest to keep our skies dark way is growing.

"I've visited so many of these places, and they're wonderful," he said. "The night sky is for everyone."

Brace yourself – wintery weather is on the way to certain parts of the state. It might still be summer, but snow is a possibility with storms headed to Colorado’s high-altitude mountain peaks.

According to a **report** from OpenSnow meteorologist Joel Gratz, multiple storms expected to hit northwest Colorado between now and Tuesday, September, 17. will produce **cooler temperatures and possibly light snow** in high-elevation areas.

Gratz predicts air temperatures will likely drop into the freezing level just below 10,000 feet on Wednesday night, September 11, headed into Thursday morning, September 12. While the coldest air is not expected to arrive until after most of the precipitation has fallen on

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coldest air is not expected to arrive until after most of the precipitation has fallen on Wednesday afternoon, we might get lucky with a few high-elevation flurries.

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If the **third storm hangs north with cold air in place, Colorado's highest peaks could also see a few snowflakes on Tuesday, September 17**. While it's a little too early to make a firm and final prediction, ski enthusiasts are eager for any chance of snowfall to touch down in the Centennial State.

The possibility of this "first snow" is a sure indicator that summer is coming to an end and winter is well on its way – with the opening of the slopes falling shortly behind. **Arapahoe Basin** announced earlier last week that they've already started firing up the snowguns in preparation for the 2019-20 ski season. The high-altitude resort is known for its extended season with its longest season ever ending **on August 10, 1995**.

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Gratz also mentions in the report that snowfall like this can be typical in September. It's not necessarily telling of what the upcoming ski season will be like.

Other weather reports about the upcoming season predict a "**polar coaster**," though the **end of El Niño** could also impact snowfall.

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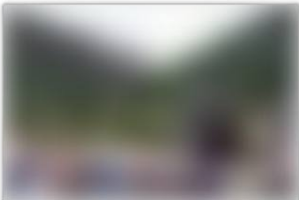

Miracle Stag Meadery Highlights Local Honey in Loveland

Arpad László Kovacs combined his desire to make wine with his family's experience in beekeeping to open **Miracle Stag Meadery** in Loveland, where he creates a wide variety of meads with Rocky Mountain water and local wildflower honey. "Honey is obviously the most important part of the product," he explains, so he uses natural and organic ingredients, with no preservatives, whenever available.

One of his most popular small-batch meads, Dragonblood, is inspired by *Game of Thrones*. "It gets its wonderful red color from cherries, raspberries, blueberries and blackberries," Kovacs notes, adding that Dragonblood has a rounded character from oak aging, but the fruitiness still comes through in the finish.

Honeymoon, which is also oak-aged, is made with raisins and dates. "The oak flavor makes it perfect for making mixed drinks with whiskey or bourbon," the mead maker points out. "In general, meads tend to have a bit of a sharp, boozy quality initially, which smooths out with oxygenation. It's something not far from what you'd experience in whiskey or bourbon."

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Just in time for fall, Yule Lad is a spiced mead similar to apple cider. "It's the flavors you'd find in an apple



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just honey, water and yeast.

"People are realizing it's another gluten-free option," Kovacs notes of mead's recent increase in popularity. He adds that he has seen an increased interest from bars that want to offer mead to customers.

Because mead has the potential for aging well, Miracle Stag's bottles are labeled with a "born on" date, and they're also marked dry, semi-sweet or sweet to help you pick the right mead for your palate.

Currently, Miracle Stag Meadery is available by the pour at **Brix Brew & Tap** in Greeley, **Loveland Tap & Tavern**, and The Barrel and the Wapiti Colorado Pub, both in Estes Park. You can also buy it by the bottle in liquor stores throughout northern Colorado, including **Argonaut Wine & Liquor** in Denver, Boulder Wine & Spirits and Wyatt's Wet Goods in Longmont. Very true. I honestly can't even find a place in Denver that does chopped roasted chilies like New Mexico. Not to mention red chili that even exists on the same plane as what's down there. The only reason people think Colorado is better is because they never visited New Mexico. That's all there is to it.

Many Denver diners disagree. We recently served up our list of the **ten best places for green chile** in town, and that, too, proved controversial. Says Susan:

I don't buy La Fogata as the best, although it can be pretty good.

Adds Andrea:

Santiago's all the way. Also, some of these choices, like El Taco de Mexico, are not "green chile."

Comments Teresa:

Oh, who cares? As long as it's actually green chile and not some tomatillo knock-off trying to be green chile.

Agrees Sara:

Forget New Mexico; Colorado's green chile is in a league of its own.

And then there's one more controversy, over the spelling of the green stuff, no matter which one you prefer. Says Patricia:

NOT Chile, which is a country. Please fix this.

Adds Mario:

Colorado doesn't know the difference between chili and chiles.

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Oh, yes, we do. Since *Westword* started

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great green sauce, whether made in New Mexico or Colorado, with the chili con carne of Texas or the chili of Cincinnati. But that debate, like the discussion of which bowls are best, will continue.

Meanwhile, stymied by scheduling difficulties in arranging a meet with Grisham, Polis ventured down to Pueblo on September 27 for a chili tasting with the Pueblo Chile Growers Association at Musso Farms. "We are always up to the challenge, because we know that Pueblo chiles are the best, most delicious chiles in the world," he says. "I ate a dozen last weekend. Maybe next year New Mexico will be able to stand the heat and make it work."

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Mayor William "Bud" Starker built plenty of restaurants for other people before he decided to build one for himself. Starker, now two years into his first four-year term as the mayor of Wheat Ridge, also owns Starker Construction Company, and restaurants have been among the company's many projects. He built, for example, the second Chipotle from the bones of the former House of Pies at East Eighth Avenue and Colorado Boulevard.

But the mayor wanted a place he could walk to from his Wheat Ridge home, a place he could take friends and family that would remind him of visits to Europe while capturing a little Wheat Ridge history. He found that piece of history at an old general store at 5560 West 29th Avenue, so he purchased the lot, refurbished the building and turned it into **West 29th Restaurant and Bar**.

"She's just the gold standard of what an employee should be," said Clay Caldwell, owner of Mo' Betta Gumbo. He said he nominated Palmer for the award, the first time he has entered an employee nomination in the statewide competition.

"It's a big honor to be able to acknowledge her," he said.

The awards were dominated by Denver and Boulder restaurants, so Palmer's honor as the only winner from the Northern Front Range shows that "we have quality people here," Caldwell said.

Sonia Riggs, CEO of the Colorado Restaurant Association, said in an email interview that the award program is the only one in the state that "honors the people who make restaurants run and celebrates people in every position of the restaurant."

"Earning this award means the individual conducts themselves professionally in a way that his or her peers should strive for," Riggs said.

Caldwell rattled off a long list of Palmer's attributes.

"She's loyal, she's honest; I can always count on that she'll make the right decision for the business. ... She'll always take care of what's right for the business, which most of the time is what's right for the guest," he said. "She's always on time, ready, mentally in the game, does her work, has a great attitude, pitches in with great ideas."



Palmer said she was surprised by the award.

"I didn't even know I was nominated," she said. "It feels pretty incredible."

Palmer started working in the restaurant business when she was 14, she said, and has worked at Mo' Betta Gumbo five or six years.

"One thing I've always loved about it is taking somebody who's had a really bad day and making it better through conversation and great food and laughter," she said. "I like making people's days better. This is a great business for it."

Palmer laughed at the suggestion that she could ask Caldwell for a raise, in light of her award.

"You know, I find that I make my raises through the customers. I do pretty well there," she said. "I have a lot of amazing regulars."

Palmer's award is the second time the Colorado Restaurant Association has recognized Mo' Betta Gumbo. In 2017, Caldwell received the Regional Outstanding Professional award.

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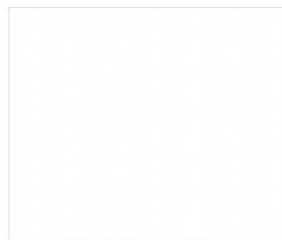

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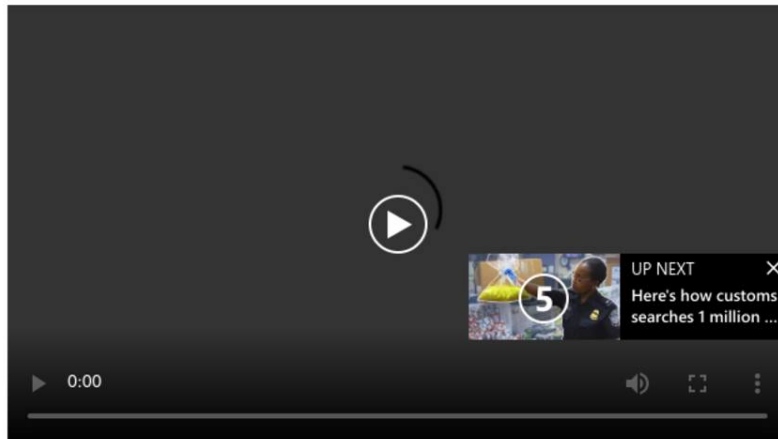
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Fall colors colorado quick drives with kids from fort collins, loveland

Northern Colorado parents, we hear you.

You want to take a nice, leisurely drive to check out the fall colors. The only problem? Your kids are less than enthusiastic about spending all day in the car.

If you want to see some of the best fall foliage Colorado has to offer, you will have to jump in the car for at least a little while. But we have some suggestions on where to go to keep the drive time manageable:

Cache la Poudre-North Park Scenic and Historic Byway: Don't expect to run into aspen once you start this drive up Colorado Highway 14 in the Poudre Canyon. It takes awhile for the show to start. You will likely first notice cottonwoods and willows turning bright yellow and three-leaf sumac turning orange-red. As you gain elevation the aspen



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leaf sumac turning orange-red. As you gain elevation, the aspen viewing will pick up. The best aspen viewing along this stretch starts about 45 miles up the canyon through the eastern third of North Park. One of the best stands is near Gould and the Colorado State Forest State Park Moose Visitor Center.

Pennock Pass: Before the fire several years ago, this was one of the best aspen viewing areas close to Fort Collins. It's still pretty good, though some of the northern part of this large stand was burned. Take Rist Canyon Road (Larimer County Road 52E) west for about 13 miles to Stove Prairie Road (County Road 27).

Take this road south for 3.5 miles to County Road 44H. Take County Road 44H west for about 12 miles to Pingree Park Road (County Road 131). This is where the best stands of aspen are found. Pennock Pass is about 10 miles.

◀ Fall long drives: [Where to find best fall colors in Colorado](#)

Rocky Mountain National Park: The higher elevations of the park usually offer the first color of the season. A good loop drive is to take the slower and less crowded gravel Fall River Road up and take the paved and more crowded Trail Ridge Road down. Stop at the Alpine Visitor Center, which offers spectacular views and lunch options. Hidden Valley Play Area on the lower part of Trail Ridge Road is one of the best viewing spots. Aspen are not overly abundant in the park, but there are streaks of color throughout.

The show is open to all artists from states that stretch west of Colorado (Montana, Idaho, Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, Arizona and Utah) as well as the border states (Kansas, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Wyoming).

"We expanded it this year just to try to get more entries," Gallery director Jill Atchison said. "We've been trying to build this show up, and it worked."

Local artist Patti Andre takes on the hat of juror this year, and she has selected every piece hanging for the show. She also had the honor to pick the best piece in each category as well as Best In Show, which will be announced Friday at the opening reception.

"Different jurors pick different things, so we like to keep it mixed up, we like to use someone who has a lot of clout, and who's done it before," Atchison said.

The six categories are oil, watercolor, pastel/drawing, mixed media and acrylic, 3D/sculpture, and photography. But even within these divisions, each piece is unique to its neighbor. Visitors can see a stitched portrait of a cat just a few spaces down from a classic painting of a cowboy, hanging above a miniature abstract collage.

"We felt that this show was really strong," Atchison said. "It's got a great variety and a lot of good quality in it."

The show showcases artists that are not members of the Thompson Valley Art League, owners of the Lincoln Gallery. The recently expanded show will hang through Oct. 4, with all works available for purchase. Miniature pieces are available in the rear of the gallery for a discounted price, meaning that the works are even more accessible for those who wish to take a piece home.

At the opening reception, community members will be able to cast their own ballots for the people's choice awards of the festival. Awards will be announced at 6:30 p.m. Friday.

"It's kind of fun to watch what people are drawn to, and it's funny they're actually drawn to the pieces that are doing very well in the show. That always amazes me, it's like, 'Oh, OK, there's a reason,'" Atchison said.

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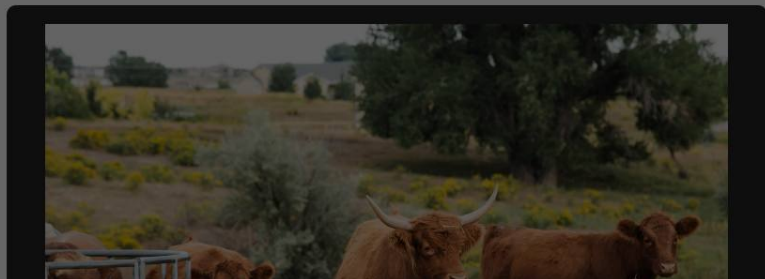
The Family Jones Opens Tasting Room at Loveland Distillery

On Saturday, September 21 The Family Jones will open a tasting room at their Loveland distillery. The space will provide a sister-location to the Highland's spirit house. The new bar is located barely 15-minutes from Colorado Stock and Grain, an organic farm from which Jones sources a selection of the crops that comprise the product line. The bar program will reproduce many of the cocktails from the Denver location, with a few new drinks being added specifically to the northern watering hole.

The Loveland location opened in early 2016 and has been producing the lion's share of the company's product. Up until now, the location served only for production and distribution. The newly outfitted tasting room will have an assortment of packaged snacks will be available, with Little Man Ice Cream sandwiches and local food trucks posting up on select days. Tours of the distillery itself will be available at 11 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday for \$15 per person with additional tours available as time permits.



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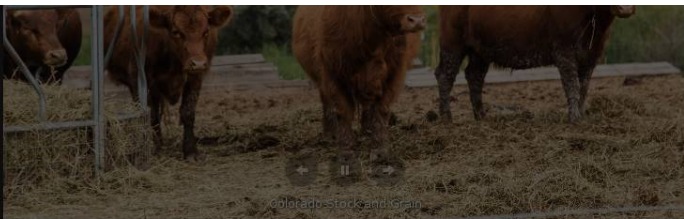
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Anyone who has visited the Denver location is aware of the impressive focus the Justin Cucci-affiliated spirit-maker has placed on creating an inviting place to imbibe and congregate. The glamorous upstairs still sits shrine-like above the bar, with expertly-crafted drinks flowing from below. Since opening two years ago, The Family Jones has continued to update its line of locally-sourced hooch, creating some of the more inventive cocktails in the city. **On October 15 it will release Atticus Jones — the hotly-anticipated straight rye whiskey produced entirely from grains originating from Colorado farms.**

For those interested in trying the beverage early, there will be a drink-paired distiller's dinner taking place **October 7** at the Denver tasting room. An open house will follow on October 12 from 11 a.m. – 3 p.m. for anyone who wants to try the beverage in a more informal setting. Atticus is 75% rye, 15% corn and 10% malt and is one of the smoother ryes the state has yet to produce.



The Family Jones creates all the spirits on the menu. Sourcing grains from only three origins — the Whiskey Sisters, Colorado Stock and Grain and Root Shoot Malting — Jones is leading the charge in local production. The distillery is serious about developing relationships with local farmers, working closely with Stock and Grain's owner and operator RJ Ottaviano to construct a product everyone involved can be proud of. The blended whiskey has been aged at least two years — the craftsmanship is evident in every sip.



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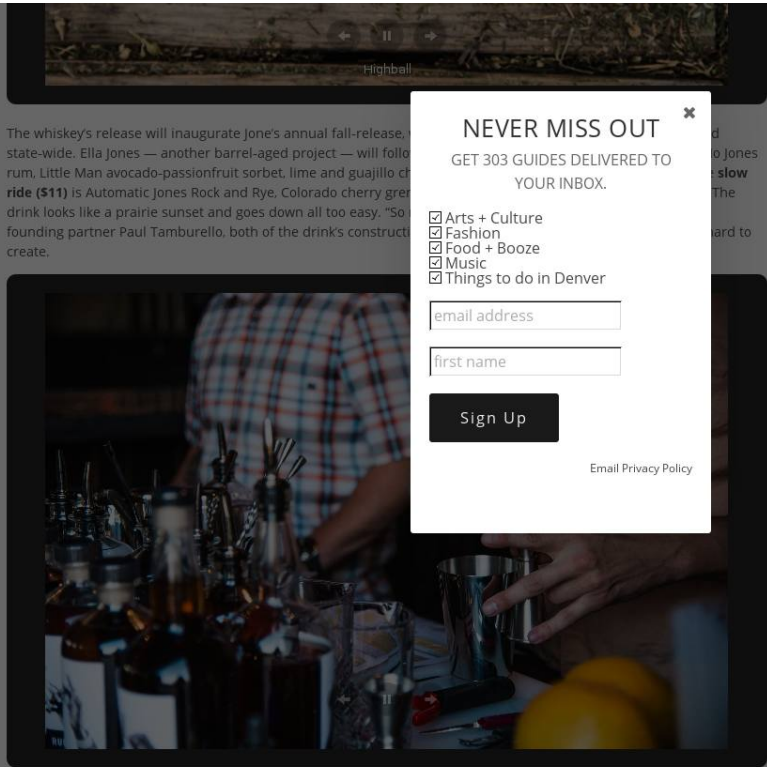
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The whiskey's release will inaugurate Jones's annual fall-release, state-wide. Ella Jones — another barrel-aged project — will follow with rum, Little Man avocado-passionfruit sorbet, lime and guajillo chile. **ride (\$11)** is Automatic Jones Rock and Rye. As Colorado continues to cultivate its craft distilling scene, the Family Jones is making an impressive effort in distinguishing itself for both impressive product and a deep commitment to local assembly and heritage grains. With roughly half the state's acreage being used for agriculture, the business' focus on local manufacturing nicely orients it within the community. Atticus Jones will retail for roughly \$50 a bottle and has a place on any whiskey aficionado's shelf.

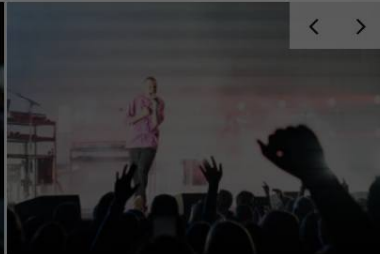

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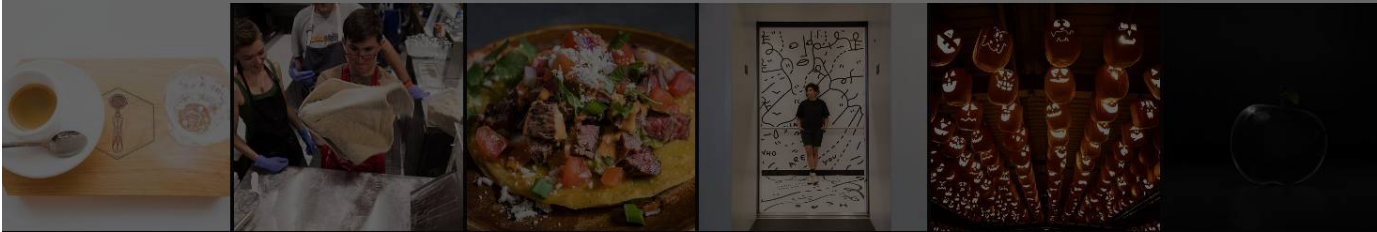

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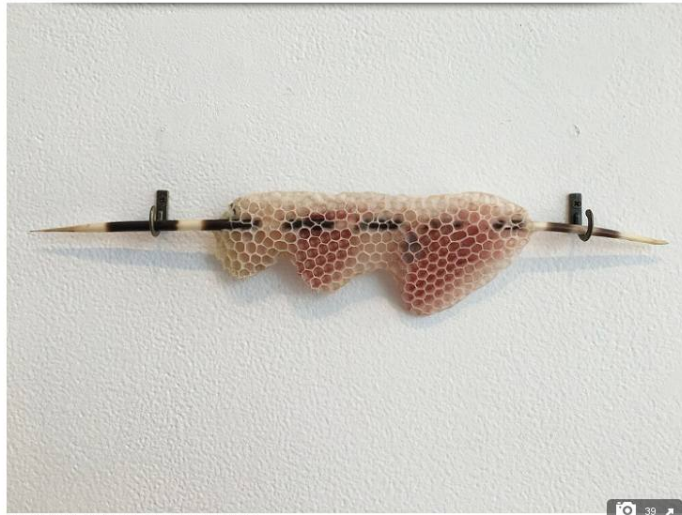

Reviewed: We Were Here , Six More Shows to See Now!

This weekend is your last chance to see the Mai Wyn half of *Lauri Lynnxe Murphy: We Were Here*, extended through October 5. Keep reading for a capsule review of that show, as well as six more exhibits around town, in the order that they're closing.

Lauri Lynnxe Murphy. In *Lauri Lynnxe Murphy: We Were Here*, Murphy uses natural processes and materials to create her work. The pieces are mostly small, though there is a large floor piece made up of found tree trunks and an abandoned wasp's nest to which the artist has added multi-colored

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an abandoned wasp's nest, to which the artist has added multi-colored pompons in a distinctly Murphy touch. For other pieces, Murphy had snails crawl across sheets of paper, leaving behind trails of slime (a process she's used for several years); she then cut out the trails, which look like all-over scribbles, and mounted them. Mai Wyn has a handsome lineup of these, with black on dazzling-white backing paper. Murphy's most recent pursuit is collaborating with bees. Using apiary techniques, she encourages bees to create combs according to designs she's conceived, then displays the small, three-dimensional honeycomb pieces. Kaitlyn Tucek/Overlook: Artist Kaitlyn Tucek questions the canon of Western art history in this solo, implicitly taking on the white-male domination of the discipline. Her taking-off point is Artemisia Gentileschi, the early seventeenth-century Italian Baroque painter. Gentileschi was appreciated in her own time, but then forgotten until the 1970s. Tucek lays out her intentions for this solo in the installation in the entrance. The east wall is covered in layered drapes, with a braided cord tipped in tassels poetically looped like a tie-back on one side, like backdrops in Gentileschi's works. Adjacent are two paintings, both of which have surfaces not of stretched canvas, but of sewn-together pieces of fabrics, extending the drapery reference from the wall to the paintings. Tucek's style of rendering has a fresh, quick-sketch quality that lends the pieces an air of spontaneity, even though they must have been time-consuming to make. There's also a "table," its top and sides made of stretched chiffon, with a dagger inside, visible through the gauzy cloth. The rest of the show follows suit, with Tucek taking the iconography of a Gentileschi painting and deconstructing it. 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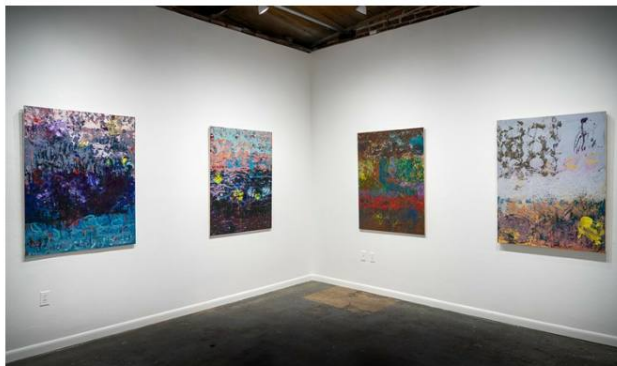

Heidi Jung and Andrew Roberts-Gray. Colorado artist Heidi Jung takes over the front spaces of Michael Warren Contemporary with her signature drawings in *New Work by Heidi Jung*. To a limited extent, Jung's drawings are reminiscent of pinhole photographs because of their often murky grounds as well as the illusions of transparency. Jung spent the better part of a year creating this new body of work, mostly oversized renderings of plants and flowers done in sumi ink and charcoal on sheets of Mylar laid flat on wooden panels. Seen unframed and without glass, they function as stand-ins for paintings. The quiet appeal of the Jung pieces contrasts mightily with the bright palette and industrial quality of the altered clear plexiglass panels that have been incised, etched and reverse-painted for the engaging *Analog – New Work by Andrew Roberts-Gray* in the back gallery. For Roberts-Gray, who lives in Carbondale, the finished works are the intersection of a number of interests, including the landscape, the computer, the Hindu god Ganesh and abstraction, all employed for their compositional values. On the eve of the [Great American Beer Festival](#), which takes place October 3 through 5 at the Colorado Convention Center, the Boulder-based [Brewers Association](#) has released its annual economic survey on the craft-brewing industry.



The headline-grabber? Small and independent craft brewers contributed \$79.1 billion to the U.S. economy in 2018 and provided more than 550,000 total jobs, with 150,000 of those at breweries and brewpubs. That figure "is derived from the total impact of beer brewed by craft brewers as it moves through the three-tier system (breweries, wholesalers and retailers), as well as all non-beer products like food and merchandise that brewpub restaurants and brewery taprooms sell," the BA says. It doesn't include numbers from breweries that the association doesn't consider to be craft breweries — some of the biggest in the nation.

Colorado came in sixth among the fifty states, with an economic impact of \$3.285 billion. However, it came in fourth in jobs, with 25,329, and first in terms of economic impact per capita for people over 21.

Black Shirt Brewing releases Hug Like You Mean It, a 7.3 percent ABV "wheat-free" New England-style IPA brewed with Amarillo and Mosaic hops. The beer will be on tap and in Crowlers to go.

Traveling One Barrel Wednesday introduces the first beer hailing from **Dead Hippy Brewing**, which has replaced the Brew on Broadway (which closed this past summer) as part of the four-brewery group. The Real Dill Thai Chili B.A.B. Belgian Strong Ale was brewed as a strong ale and then a Thai chili brine made with the Real Dill was added. "Look for the spice to balance the fruity esters of this Belgian strong ale," Dead Hippy says. It's always a good day when **Great Divide Brewing** pumps up the hops, and the brewery will release a brand-new beer, Hopnaut Double Juicy IPA, in both of its taprooms today on draft and in six-packs. The 8 percent ABV beer replaces Hop Disciples in Great Divide's Dank Farm series. "Brewed and double-dry-hopped with an unearthly amount of Simcoe, El Dorado, Mosaic and Huell Melon hops, this beer lifts off with over a pound and a half of hops per barrel. Showcasing bold tropical fruit and citrus notes along with hints of berry, stone fruit, pine and bubblegum, Hopnaut Double Juicy IPA is an extraterrestrial sensory experience," the brewery says.

Pleasure to Meet You, the second of the brewery's bottle-conditioned, mixed-culture saisons, this time dry-hopped with Mosaic hops, will be released. This year, there will be more than thirty OMF beers on tap from 2 to 10 p.m., including special bottle and can releases. There will also be food trucks, merchandise giveaways, a photo booth and more.

Fiction Beer Company marks its five-year anniversary with a "carnival"

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Fiction Beer Company marks its five-year anniversary with a "carnival" starting at 1 p.m. with live music from the Dollhouse Thieves at 5 p.m.; food from Brava Pizzeria; carnival games like plinko, tic-tac-toe toss, Skee-Ball, frog hop and hole-in-one putting; and two can releases: the Recurrence Quadruple Dry-Hopped Triple New England Style IPA, and Steep Imperial Coffee Stout brewed in collaboration with Pablo's Coffee. Fiction will also have two rare beers on draft. The first is Barrel Aged Caramel Macchiato Malice & Darkness, a version of the brewery's 14 percent imperial stout aged on "a touch of caramel and vanilla," the brewery says. "Both flavors are naturally present in toasted oak barrels. Adding just a little caramel and vanilla helps to make these background complexities become the center focus of this version. A mellow sweetness from the beer and the additions complements the bitter dark chocolate flavor of the base beer. All of this amazing flavor is wrapped in a cocoon of subtle bourbon flavor." The second beer is Antiquarian No. 7 American Golden Sour aged on fresh orchard-picked apricots from Paonia. There will also be Nuggs Pablo's Coffee ice cream scoop floaters for the draft pours of the coffee stout, and root beer floats for the kiddos.

Try exclusive GABF beers when returning to the Alamo for the tap takeover GABF Kick Off Party with live music at 7 p.m. [Go to the Facebook page for details](#). The six breweries are WestFax, Joyride, Hogshead, Oasis, Strange and Seedstock.

Cannonball Creek Brewing in Golden brings the heat for its second annual Pepper-Palooza, starting at noon. The brewery will pour special chile beers and will be roasting and giving away green chiles for free (while supplies last). From 2 to 4 p.m., there's a homemade salsa contest (see Cannonball's Facebook page for details on entering), and from 5 to 7 p.m., there's live music from the One and Only Jon Ham.

The zombie apocalypse arrives at **Lone Tree Brewing** at 11 a.m. with the annual release of Hop Zombie Imperial Red IPA. "Weighing in at 9 percent ABV and 90 IBUs, this beer is certain to raise the dead...or at least we hope," the brewery says. The start of October turned out to be a busy few days in the restaurant world, as several new eateries and bars debuted. 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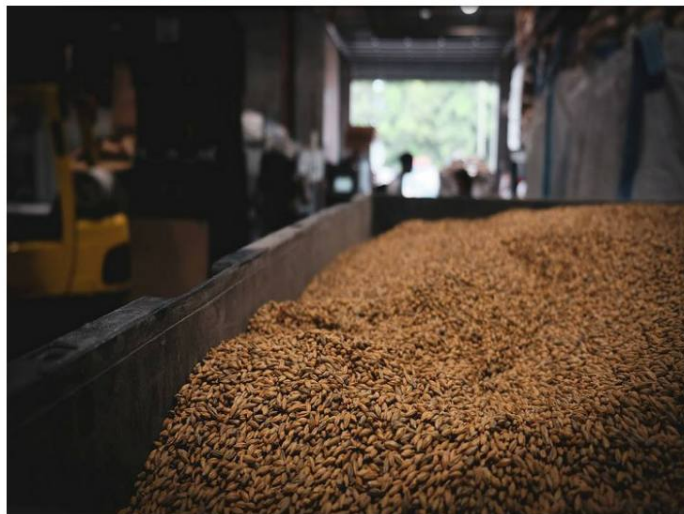

Beer Calendar: Raise a Toast at Bierstadt, Burns, Diebolt and Dos Lucos

The field of craft malting has grown quickly in the past few years to the point where there are now 300 members of the North American Craft Maltsters Guild, a six-year-old trade association that promotes and supports small malthouses. They owe their existence mainly to the craft brewing and distilling industries, which tend to prefer local ingredients from producers who share a similar mindset.



As such, the guild just introduced a **Certified Craft Malt Seal** that will allow beer and spirits producers, as well as retailers and consumers, a way to identify who is a member. The incorporation of craft malt "typically adds additional cost to production but yields a unique, flavor-differentiated product," the guild explains, and helps "connect local agriculture to an individual brewery. This connectivity story mirrors the work done by farmers' markets and farm-to-table dining establishments across the nation."

To qualify as a guild member, a malthouse must produce 5,000 to 10,000 metric tons of malt annually and should source more than 50 percent of its raw materials from within 500 miles of its malthouse. In Colorado, a huge number of small breweries rely on local maltsters such as Troubadour Maltings, Root Shoot Malting, Grouse Malt House, Proximity Malting and Colorado Malting Company.

Black Project Spontaneous & Wild Ales will release three beers in sixteen-ounce canned four-packs, a first for the brewery, which up until now has only packaged in bottles. The first is Shadow Factory, a Black Project flagship; this version was brewed with heavy amounts of blackberry and raspberry. The second is another brewery regular, Magic Lantern, which was "lightly salted with peach, apricot and passion fruit," the brewery says. The type of fruit in both beers rotates on a regular basis. The final beer is Dagger, made from a mix of second-use fruits from the first two beers. All three are spontaneously fermented "solera" ales made with a wheat base. Goldspot Brewing taps You Leave Me Peachless at 3 p.m. This IPA was made with 150 pounds of Palisade peaches and dry-hopped with Rakau and El Dorado. Goldspot describes it as "juicy, aromatic and balanced with just the right amount of bitterness."

Ratio Beerworks taps Dimed Out Juicy Double IPA at noon. "Opening with luscious hints of peach and pineapple, and finishing deceptively smooth with rounded vanilla notes, Dimed Out showcases a fistful of hops, featuring a double dry-hop of Denali and Citra, and Mosaic," the brewery says.

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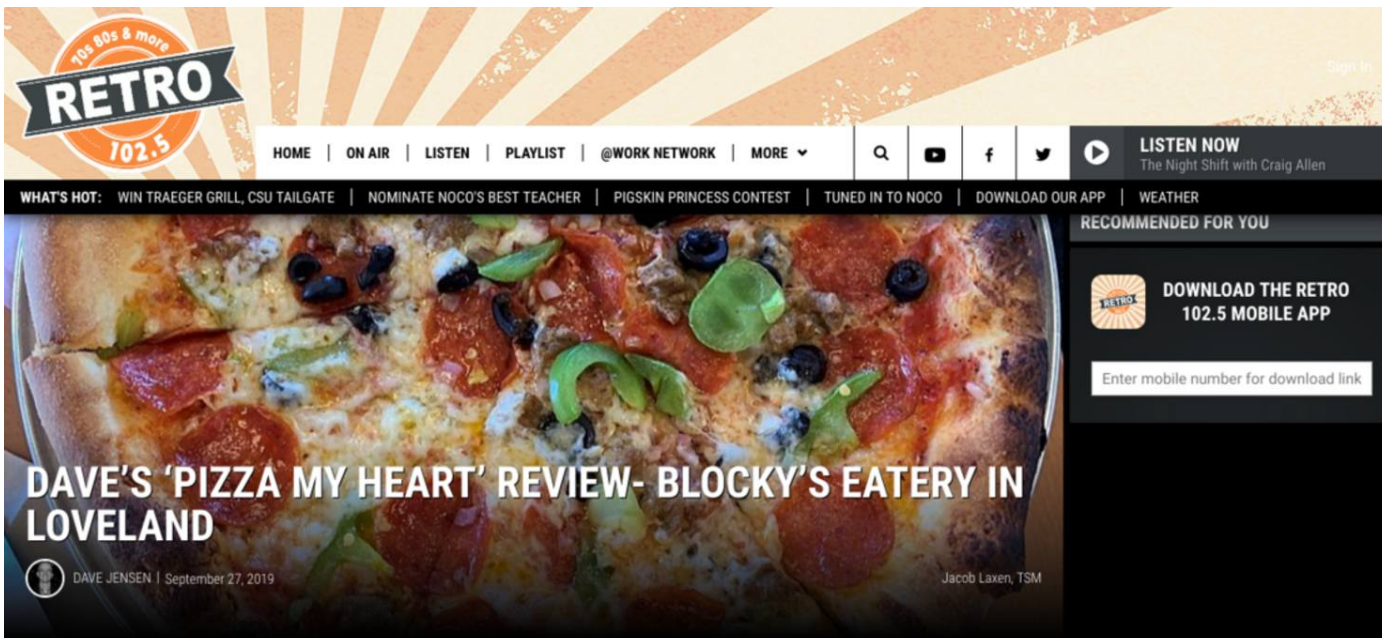


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Join me as I travel around Northern Colorado in search of **NoCo's Greatest Pie**. This week, a stop at Blocky's in Loveland.

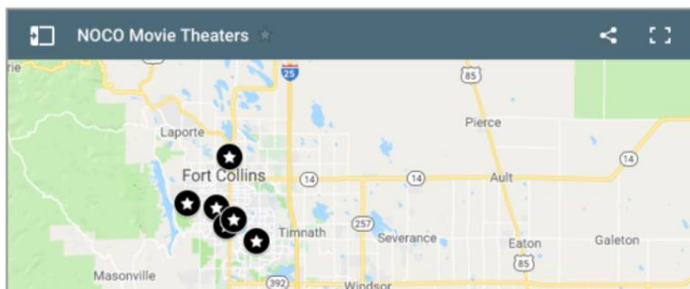
If you have ever been on any social media platform, you will know about the current trend of bingeing television series' and movies through your very own television or mobile device.
