Good Morning, I am resending this email in case it ended up in your spam folder.

My name is Otto Wilson, I just recently retired from the Colorado State Patrol. The last seven years I was a member of our Hazardous Materials Team and have responded to countless HM releases and spills throughout northern Colorado. Many of my HM Responses were in Weld County and dealt with petrochemicals tied in one way or another to oil and gas sites. I have also lived in west Loveland for over 21 years.

I missed last night's virtual meeting, but wanted to give you some food for thought. Regardless of what some may say, oil and gas development is necessary for so many products other than gasoline and diesel fuel. That said, drilling so close to already existing development is not necessary and can be dangerous.

Oil companies generally hire subcontractors to complete the drilling site. The commercial vehicles coming in and out of the sites to haul sand and other materials are hired on a low bid basis. What we have found is that those specifically hauling sand and production water are some of the most unsafe vehicles and drivers on the road. This creates a much larger problem when these well pads are drilled in an already developed area.

When these trucks crash, it shuts down roads for countless hours, especially if the vehicle involved is a tanker truck. If there is a hazardous materials spill involved with the crash, then there are possible evacuations of nearby homes and businesses. This will then increase the time an area and roadways are closed. Most people do not know that produced water from those well sites is highly hazardous and flammable. If produced water spills in large quantities, it needs to be cleaned up the same as crude oil, gasoline, diesel and condensate. The State of Colorado requires that anything over 25 gallons of petrochemicals spilled must be cleaned up from the site. One fuel tank on a semi-truck holds 80-120 gallons of diesel fuel and most trucks have two tanks, one on each side.

There are many times per month in Weld County that there are "documented" HM spills. (I have included some links below) There are many that are covered up and never reported. I have been called to crude oil spills on roadways that were miles long due to a valve on a tanker left open. There are also times we never found out what company spilled the product. Then the cleanup is left to the tax-payers.

There is a site on facebook that is devoted to help commercial carriers evade where police are and truck inspections. Many times on duty, I would check this

site and see trucks hauling products associated with oil and gas development actively trying to avoid being inspected. (See link below)

Every Weld County Oil and Gas meeting I attended, I would hear the same thing from Oil and Gas developers...."We want to be good neighbors". When I would bring up this DOT sting location site on facebook, they would just laugh about it. My thoughts are if your drivers and trucks are safe, then there should be no problem going through a roadside inspection.

I have just touched on the commercial vehicle impact that Oil and Gas sites bring to an area. There are many pipeline leaks and emission issues associated with these sites. One pipeline leak of note completely destroyed a family farm off of Weld County Road 13, just south of Berthoud. I would travel this road every other day on Patrol to get to my HM Equipment Shed in Mead. There was a road closure and detour for about 1-1/4 years. I thought this was just a culvert replacement, until I found out what really happened. (See Link below)

Developers will tell you how safe all this is, and there is minimal impact to the areas and environment. This is just not true. It happens so often, the Greeley Tribune puts out a monthly spill report. If you dive into this and know Weld County, many of these spills are located around densely populated areas. (See Link below)

When I hear that oil and gas developers are running out of areas to drill, this is just not true as well. The Denver-Julesburg Basin (DJ-Basin) runs as far as the name implies. There are so many unpopulated areas well east of Greeley that oil developers drill and still can be drilled with little impact to existing residential/ commercial areas. It is a fact that they want to extract oil close to these towns, because it is cheaper to do so. It costs more money to haul equipment necessary to complete a well site out near New Raymer.

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Hello,

I am writing with concerns regarding the proposed fracking site near the Loveland Sports Park. I purchased my home in the Lakes at Centerra neighborhood in June 2021. I specifically asked if there were any plans to frack in or near this neighborhood because I was made aware that McWhinney had retained mineral rights. I was confidently told no, fracking would not occur in or near this neighborhood because it is so close to schools and because the neighborhood itself has the unique designation of being a Natural Wildlife Habitat. How can this man get away with lying to so many people?

I was sickened and very angry to learn last January (2022), just 7 months after closing, that in fact Mr. McWhinney was planning on moving forward with plans to frack and that he had been working on this plan in his words for at least 10 years. Why was this not disclosed to the thousands of individuals who moved to this neighborhood with the message that this is a Natural Wildlife Habitat. We were sold on a lie! This should have been disclosed to anyone buying in this community. Many people have already sold and moved, I unfortunately do not have the ability to pick up and move out of the neighborhood. I saved for years to be able to afford my down payment. With the housing market and interest rates the way they are many of us simply do not have the option to pick up and move as some of his followers have not so kindly encouraged us to do. I would never have bought in this neighborhood had I been told about these plans that McWhinney himself stated in a video conference he had been planning on for at least 10-12 years. A simple disclosure BEFORE buying would have avoided this issue. It is really disheartening situation to be in- being sold on an environmentally friendly neighborhood with an environmental center, wildlife literally living within the neighborhood and then to find this out.

It is common knowledge that fracking causes air pollution. How can the city of Loveland support a fracking site literally right next to a large sports park where thousands of children gather not only from Loveland but from all over the state and possibly outside of the state to play sports?

There are 2 large schools very near to this site as well. Mountain View High School is within eye site of this proposed fracking site and High Plains K-8 is also very close and the planned drilling is set to go right underneath the school. There is also a daycare and new senior housing as well as an assisted living facility within this area as well. If this is approved the city is knowingly putting our most vulnerable residents, the very young and the elderly at risk of exposure to toxic chemicals and worsened air pollution.

I am very concerned that more has not been done to actually inform everyone in the impacted area. I received NO notice of the meeting held last week and as far as I can tell from talking with many neighbors no one else in the neighborhood received notices either. I heard that the city only notifies residents who live within a certain amount of feet of where the drills will be placed. This seems very irresponsible and inappropriate. Every individual who will be impacted by this should be informed about what is happening. Including those who have children attending these schools, sporting events, individuals looking at putting their elderly family members in the assisted living facility etc. Why does the city feel it is not important to be transparent with residents? Doesn't the city have the responsibility to its residents, not just to big developers promising revenue to the city?

In addition, it appears that McWhinney just shared plans to continue building homes right next to the sports park so there are even more individuals who would be directly impacted by this poor decision.

I am very concerned about the soil issues we are having in our neighborhood. Many individuals have shared issues with their soil sinking. Roads, driveways, sidewalks, yards etc have had ongoing issues with sinking and many repairs have had to be done. What will fracking do to worsen this issue and who will be responsible if fracking directly under our neighborhood worsens these issues we are already having to deal with?

What guarantees do we have that the bodies of water he plans to frack under in our neighborhood won't be contaminated?

What research has the city done or is planning to do to ensure the wildlife living in the neighborhood won't be negatively impacted?

It is my understanding that McWhinney has promised millions of dollars in revenue to the city if his plan is approved. I'd like to know more about his track record in actually following through with paying what he promises to get his plans approved. I am fairly confident I just recently heard in the news that he requested an extension on paying millions back to the city. Why is he getting these breaks while also lying to so many people? At what point is enough, enough?

I am opposed to any plans to frack under this neighborhood for all of the reasons listed above. I have not spoken to anyone who lives here who is in support. The sad reality is so many residents don't feel the city cares. It appears that McWhinney gets to do whatever he wants here and the voices of the residents don't seem to matter much to those in decision making positions. I was told that he is stating that many people are in support of this plan. I would challenge the city to look into any connections McWhinney has with any individual expressing support of this plan. I myself have been addressed by individuals he knows personally trying to get me to change my mind. In doing some simple checking it was easy to find connections that they either work with/for him/his companies or other connections like attending the same church.

If the city really cares about what residents want, their concerns and how this will impact us as a neighborhood/community more effort would be done to make sure everyone is informed and included in the discussion.

I look forward to hearing back regarding how the city will make an informed decision about how approving this would impact residents and wildlife.

January 16 2023 MRG CS Pad Meeting—Comments for the Record

Good evening. Thank you for holding this neighborhood meeting prior to the City of Loveland's Planning and Zoning public meeting which will not be a zoom meeting, but an opportunity to appear before decision makers.

These comments are made for the record, as I signed up for the meeting through zoom, received the meeting identification number, yet never received the password or connection link.

My question, which has been posed to the representative of MRG, but was unanswered is:

1. Are the lines from the wells going under the Flats at Centerra at all? If so, which buildings? Are they going under any residentially zoned, developed and undeveloped sites in the area?

Other questions are:

1. What entity has jurisdiction over the approval of this proposal in its entirety?
2. Is the City Council of Loveland involved in this process at all?
3. When are all the public meetings for every government agency and commission involved in this process and this projects approval or denial being held and locations and times?
4. Do the lines reach the reservoir and lake directly to the north?
5. Why are representatives of MRG or McWhinney unable to answer the questions asked?
6. What studies have been done to guarantee that the disruption of the earth will not lead to issues? I do not want anecdotal answers; I am looking for specific studies done for this location that are signed and sealed by engineers ready to be accountable should their studies be inaccurate.

The map indicates the wells' site, yet does not indicate how and where they go north for 2 miles. There are 11 unknown lines coming from this site—presuming each well has only one line. Even being 1 mile underground does not alleviate my concerns. I purchased my forever home, a condo, at the Flats in 2021, before Mr McWhinney announced the well site location. Mr. McWhinney replied to my question, after an informational meeting he held also by zoom, that he 'thought' it would not go under the Flats. He 'thought' it stopped just before that. His words were much more vague than what I stated here. Yet, still I cannot get a straight answer as to where the lines are located and specifically what developments they go under.

While this may not be in the realm of the City of Loveland's legal responsibility, it is important to many constituents who bought residences without being informed of this potential issue. Therefore, it should be of interest to every elected, appointed and hired representative of Loveland.

In addition, here are some points of observation for future meetings:

1. Zoom is not the easiest way for interested neighbors to express our questions and concerns nor to get them answered.
2. The meeting is being held on a Federal Holiday at a time when many, if they work today, may not be able to attend due to the 5:30 start time.
3. Attachments should be clear for a total comprehension of the project.
4. The announcement for a meeting should have all information required to attend a meeting versus awaiting information that never arrived.

Thank you for your time. I hope to receive the information today and have contacted the City of Loveland and MRG to try to rectify the lack of information to attend.



Dear Mr. Olson,

Economic growth in the City of Loveland is bound by a Uniform Development Code (18.01.01.02) designed to promote public health, safety, and the general welfare. Allowing hydraulic fracturing in the Centerra Region of Loveland violates this code and the city's comprehensive plan. Below are just some of the ways that fracking is NOT compatible with the Uniform Code.

Code: Promote economic opportunity, encourage investment, and promote property values.

Reality: The Oil and Gas Industry provides less than 1% of the states total employment but is projected to cost \$1.36 billion annually in damages to the environment. That is 1.5 times the total taxes and fees oil and gas brings to the state. (CO Fiscal Institute, 2022). Property values decline in areas polluted by noise, heavy large vehicle traffic, and toxic air caused by invisible fracking gas leaks verified by infrared cameras. (Earthworks, 2022) More and more property owners in Centerra are voicing their concerns and protesting the planned 26 wells that they want stopped. (multiple dates, Loveland Reporter Herald.)

Code: Promote good civic design and site layout.

Reality: Loveland allows reverse setbacks that allow drilling only 300 feet from businesses that employ people such as wholesale nurseries, storage yards, heavy industry, composting facilities, and essential utility facilities. Residential development other than high occupancy buildings is located only 500 feet from an existing oil and gas facility. (City of Loveland Planning Division). A majority of members of the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission say "All homes and schools in Colorado should be protected from new oil and gas drilling by a 2,000-foot buffer or setback – four times the current standard for urban areas". (The Colorado Sun, 9-9-20) In areas with dense oil and gas site layout we see lower birth weights, more children with congenital heart defects, and more childhood cancers. (CU Anschutz Professor Lisa McKenzie). Being close to drilling sites is also dangerous for the elderly and those with breathing issues.

Code: Promote fiscally responsible infrastructure and services.

Reality: The Oil and Gas industry has tens of thousands of orphaned wells that could cost tax payers

billions of dollars to clean up. In addition to the financial burden “all of the science indicates that the dangerous gases that spew from wells are major contributors to climate change.” (Joe Salazar, Colorado Rising, 8-31-21). Climate caused disasters alone have cost the state between \$20 billion and \$50 billion since 1980. (Colorado Fiscal Institute)

Code: Lessen the risk of flood, fire, panic, and other dangers.

Reality: Fracking poses unique dangers to residential areas by subjecting families to known carcinogens like benzene. In 2017 fracking gases in Firestone combusted violently in a home causing serious injuries and 2 deaths. “Forced pooling” has allowed gas companies to annex mineral rights and drill beneath homes without the owner’s consent. Climate change caused by greenhouse gas emissions, like methane, contribute to severe weather leading to floods and wildland fires.

Code: Promote the conservation of energy, water, and environmental resources.

Reality: Fracking is a water intensive industrial process. It uses, 1.5 million to 16 million gallons of water per well, according to the [United States Geological Survey](#). We don’t get that polluted water back and we’re currently in a 1200 year drought.

Code: Promote the use of renewable energy.

Reality: To curb our climate crisis, we need to end our dependence on fossil fuels. That may have seemed far-fetched a decade ago given the cost of installing wind and solar at the time, but in 10 years, the price of solar electricity dropped 89%, and the price of onshore wind dropped 70%. (Rocky Mountain Institute, 2019). Continued use of fossil fuels is expensive and unnecessary.

Please consider the future of our city and adherence to the Uniform Development Code as you make your decision about allowing fracking in Centerra. For everyone’s health, safety, and the general welfare city leaders owe it to its citizens to not permit fracking within city limits. Thank you.

Human health Exposure to Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC's) released during the fracking process can lead to serious long and short-term health impacts, such as: asthma, nosebleeds, headaches, dizziness, preterm births, birth defects, pediatric cancer, endocrine disruption and many others.² Research has also shown mental health issues related to constant noise and light pollution, low-frequency vibrations, loss of sleep, disturbances from increased truck traffic, and degraded quality of life leading to chronic stress and depression. Water On average, one single fracked well uses anywhere from 4-16 million gallons of water; with the potential to use over 100 million gallons during its life cycle. Once used in combination with a cocktail of toxic chemicals, this water is permanently polluted, removing it from our water supply. In the midst of a historic drought, we cannot

afford to dispose of this scarce and precious resource. Air Fracking has been known to increase levels of nitrogen oxides, VOC's, ozone, methane and other hazardous air pollutants.^{4,5}

At a time when Colorado is experiencing its highest number of ozone alerts and our air pollution is already at unhealthy levels, we cannot allow fracking to add to our worsening air quality crisis. Public Safety The risks of toxic leaks, spills, explosions and well blow-outs are very real, as witnessed by more than a dozen tragic incidents at oil and gas sites throughout Colorado in 2018. Several of these incidents injured workers, and one resulted in the death of two innocent residents. Allowing the risk of dangerous life-threatening industrial drilling in our suburban neighborhoods, and near our children's schools is unconscionable. Wildlife Fracking threatens our local parks, nature preserves, and delicate ecosystems.

The lakes at Centerra are home to a bird sanctuary, where birds come to live and nest. It has been documented that fracking disrupts nesting & hunting patterns for a variety of owls. Climate Methane is up to 86 times more potent than CO₂ at trapping heat in Earth's atmosphere over a 20-year period. As fracking emits dangerous amounts of methane, it is contributing to longer droughts, decreased snowpack, and increased frequency and severity of wildfires, all of which we are already suffering the tremendous impacts of. Economic

The City of Loveland has not enacted rules to ensure that McWhinney would be responsible for the total cost of clean up. Cleaning up and plugging abandoned and orphaned wells could cost Loveland taxpayers millions of dollars. In Colorado, bonding requirements are a meager \$10,000 - \$100,000 regardless of the number of wells drilled. The Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission estimates an average cost of \$80,000 - \$120,000 to clean up and remediate one well, rendering the bonds paid by oil and gas companies inadequate. Local municipalities - and taxpayers - are left to foot the bill. Statewide, this already amounts to more than \$8 billion dollars.

Please do not approve Fracking in our backyard!!!!!! It is critical for the next generation and you have the power to stop it. Doesn't McWhinney have enough money?

Much has been written about the dangers of fracking: to human health; water shortage and use; air pollution, by the increase of nitrogen oxides, VOC's, ozone, methane and other hazardous air pollutants; public safety from toxic leaks, spills, explosions and well blow-outs; wild life and the biodiversity; and climate, best exemplified in droughts, decreased snowpack and increased frequency and severity on wildfires. There is a wealth of information available scientifically documenting these dangers. Being responsible, and the well educated and widely experienced elected individuals you are, I am assuming you have exposed yourselves to much of this information. I will only point out that these dangers are present and especially place all children and the elderly at risk and even death.

I believe there is a serious lack of accountability, validation and responsibility among some elected officials locally, state wide, and on the national level, of these risks to our lives. This includes those appointed to positions of decision makers, an example of which is the COGCC which makes decisions to approve or deny proposed fracking in the state. There is also a high level of denial and perhaps ignorance among the same elected officials and decision makers regarding the dangers we face from fracking.

Dear Andrea,

Economic growth in the City of Loveland is bound by a Uniform Development Code (18.01.01.02) designed to promote public health, safety, and the general welfare. Allowing hydraulic fracturing in the Centerra Region of Loveland violates this code and the city's comprehensive plan. Below are just some of the ways that fracking is NOT compatible with the Uniform Code.

Code: Promote economic opportunity, encourage investment, and promote property values.

Reality: The Oil and Gas Industry provides less than 1% of the states total employment but is projected to cost \$1.36 billion annually in damages to the environment. That is 1.5 times the total taxes and fees oil and gas brings to the state. (CO Fiscal Institute, 2022). Property values decline in areas polluted by noise, heavy large vehicle traffic, and toxic air caused by invisible fracking gas leaks verified by infrared cameras. (Earthworks, 2022) More and more property owners in Centerra are voicing their concerns and protesting the planned 26 wells that they want stopped. (multiple dates, Loveland Reporter Herald.)

Code: Promote good civic design and site layout.

Reality: Loveland allows reverse setbacks that allow drilling only 300 feet from businesses that employ people such as wholesale nurseries, storage yards, heavy industry, composting facilities, and essential utility facilities. Residential development other than high occupancy buildings is located only 500 feet from an existing oil and gas facility. (City of Loveland Planning Division). A majority of members of the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission say "All homes and schools in Colorado should be protected from new oil and gas drilling by a 2,000-foot buffer or setback – four times the current standard for urban areas". (The Colorado Sun, 9-9-20) In areas with dense oil and

gas site layout we see lower birth weights, more children with congenital heart defects, and more childhood cancers. (CU Anschutz Professor Lisa McKenzie). Being close to drilling sites is also dangerous for the elderly and those with breathing issues.

Code: Promote fiscally responsible infrastructure and services.

Reality: The Oil and Gas industry has tens of thousands of orphaned wells that could cost tax payers billions of dollars to clean up. In addition to the financial burden “all of the science indicates that the dangerous gases that spew from wells are major contributors to climate change.” (Joe Salazar, Colorado Rising, 8-31-21). Climate caused disasters alone have cost the state between \$20 billion and \$50 billion since 1980. (Colorado Fiscal Institute)

Code: Lessen the risk of flood, fire, panic, and other dangers.

Reality: Fracking poses unique dangers to residential areas by subjecting families to known carcinogens like benzene. In 2017 fracking gases in Firestone combusted violently in a home causing serious injuries and 2 deaths. “Forced pooling” has allowed gas companies to annex mineral rights and drill beneath homes without the owner’s consent. Climate change caused by greenhouse gas emissions, like methane, contribute to severe weather leading to floods and wildland fires.

Code: Promote the conservation of energy, water, and environmental resources.

Reality: Fracking is a water intensive industrial process. It uses, 1.5 million to 16 million gallons of water per well, according to the [United States Geological Survey](#). We don’t get that polluted water back and we’re currently in a 1200 year drought.

Code: Promote the use of renewable energy.

Reality: To curb our climate crisis, we need to end our dependence on fossil fuels. That may have seemed far-fetched a decade ago given the cost of installing wind and solar at the time, but in 10 years, the price of solar electricity dropped 89%, and the price of onshore wind dropped 70%. (Rocky Mountain Institute, 2019). Continued use of fossil fuels is expensive and unnecessary.

Please consider the future of our city and adherence to the Uniform Development Code as you make your decision about allowing fracking in Centerra. For everyone’s health, safety, and the general welfare city leaders owe it to its citizens to not permit fracking within city limits. Thank you.

Dear Mr. Mallo,

As a resident of the Lakes at Centerra, I am extremely concerned about the likely environmental and health impacts of the proposed fracking in and around Loveland. Constant growth and development are not the only considerations that should override all other issues of human health, environmental safety, and quality of life.

If all goes to plan, the order of construction will result in a number of homes located between 500 and 2,000 feet from the east pad. Research from the state health department and the Colorado School of Public Health suggests that residents of those homes will face elevated health risks, particularly from concentrations of the carcinogen benzene and air pollutants toluene and 2-ethyltoluene.


Among other impacts, the state health department study found a higher risk of short-term health impacts like dizziness, nosebleeds, breathing difficulty and headaches during the worst-case-scenario for emissions. The Colorado School of Public Health study found elevated lifetime cancer risk as well as impacts to the brain, blood and bone marrow.

But you can't see or smell all the health and environmental impacts of oil and gas development, project opponents pointed out. In addition to the health risks, fracking degrades air quality, exacerbates climate change and contributes to ozone production. Fracking can also contaminate groundwater and drinking water in the case of spills, fracking fluid leaks and other potential mishaps. The latter is of special concern for the south pad because of its proximity to a wetland and the Big Thompson River.

I urge you in the strongest possible terms to assert the prerogatives of the city council to impose sensible regulations that protect the people you represent and the beautiful environment that makes Colorado such a precious yet fragile treasure. The state has empowered our cities and counties to enact regulations over and above its regulations in order to protect humans and nature from irreparable damage.

Granting a reflexive approval to all pro-business initiatives regardless of the potential harm already seen in many states is irresponsible and dangerous.

Karen, thank you for your email and apologies for not responding in a timely manner.

The quick responses to your questions are below.

- Does Loveland have a reverse setback for planned development located near established oil and gas operations?
Answer. Yes. We have an overlay zone in Division 18.10.04 of the Unified Development Code that works like a setback that prevents certain uses within a certain distance from oil and gas facilities.
- If so, what is the reverse setback distance?
Answer: The oil and gas overlay zone and sub-zone boundaries prohibits new residences within 500-foot from oil and gas facilities and prohibits new high occupancy building units within 1,000 foot setback from oil and gas facilities.

Where is the reverse setback measured from?

Answer: “Oil and gas facilities” are defined as: equipment or improvements that are used or installed at an oil and gas location for the exploration, production, withdrawal, gathering, treatment or processing of oil or gas, and which shall include, without limitation, operating, shut-in, or abandoned wells, any and all storage, separation, treating, dehydration, artificial lift, compression, pumping, metering, monitoring, aboveground flowlines, and other equipment directly associated with oil wells, gas wells, or injection wells. However, “oil and gas facility” shall not include aboveground or underground power supply, underground flow lines, or underground water lines or abandoned wells that the Director finds will not, as a matter of law, be reopened or reentered in the future for any type of oil and gas operation without the City’s prior written consent.

The staff considers the entire production pad as an oil and gas facility (called a “working pad surface” in COGCC rules) for the purpose of measuring the oil and gas overlay zone.

- Where can reverse setbacks be found in the Loveland code?

Answer: Division 18.10.04 of the Unified Development Code.

When referring to “reverse” setbacks, from a City perspective, this would apply to any existing oil and gas development/production site toward future land uses that would be located near such facility. With respect to the City’s Unified Development Code (UDC), we do not refer to the term “reverse” setbacks per se. Rather, the UDC uses overlay zones in creating distances/setbacks for existing oil and gas development/production sites from other future land uses identified under three (3) separate categories (i.e. Critical (CZ), Restricted (RZ), and High Occupancy Building (HO)) in Division 18.10.04 that you referenced in your email. The overlay zones extend 1,000 feet from any existing oil and gas development/production site within City limits. Within this 1,000 feet are the three (3) categories mentioned above. If you were to envision “rings” around an existing oil and gas development/production site, the distances would be as follows:

-200 feet measured from the outer boundary of each existing oil and gas development/production site (for purposes of this boundary the City views this as being the working pad surface area) would permit future land uses identified as the Critical Sub-Zone to include only essential underground public utility facilities and undeveloped access-restricted open space;

-300 feet measured from the outer boundary of the Critical Sub-Zone boundary would permit land uses identified as the Restricted Sub-Zone to include only the following:

- a. Airport, heliport, or helistop;
- b. Composting facility;
- c. Storage yard;

- d. Essential public utility uses, facilities, services and structures;
- e. Heavy industry;
- f. Wireless communications facilities (all types);
- g. Nursery or greenhouse, wholesale;
- h. Recycling collection center (attended);
- i. Recyclable materials processing;
- j. Resource extraction (minerals);
- k. Resource extraction (oil and gas);
- l. Self-storage;
- m. Street;
- n. Heavy logistics center;
- o. Waste transfer station;
- p. Disposal;
- q. Passenger motor vehicle sales or rental;
- r. Heavy motor vehicle sales or rental;
- s. Motorcycle, scooter, or ATV sales or rental, and;

-500 feet measured from the outer boundary of the Restricted Sub-Zone would permit future land uses identified as the High Occupancy Building Sub-Zone which is to say that any use allowed under the underlying zoning district would be permitted except high occupancy buildings and outdoor assembly areas (such uses would have to be located 1,000 feet or more from the oil and gas development/production facility)

Any future land use(s) other than those mentioned above and so long as the underlying zoning would permit such use(s), can be established anywhere between 500 and 1,000 feet as measured from the outer boundaries of the oil and gas development/production site (i.e. outer green circle labeled as HO Zone). Here is a general illustration to help visualize:

Hello everyone

During McWhinney's CE Pad neighborhood meeting I asked about Loveland's reverse setback regulations. I was told the City did have reverse setback regulations (residential building setbacks from established oil and gas facilities) and the City would provide the information on the setback distances. I subsequently sent an email to staff in November, asking where I could find the City's reverse setback regulations in the City's Code. I did not receive a response. I submitted a question regarding reverse setbacks on the City's oil and gas website. I did not receive a response or see the question answered on the City's website. It could be that staff are on leave, no longer work for the City or I have the wrong email address. Other Loveland residents have submitted reverse setback questions and have not received an answer as far as I know.

McWhinney's submitted document regarding the neighborhood meeting states that the McWhinney team and City staff said the City has reverse setback

regualtions. I would like to get an answer to the questions.

The questions I have are:

- Does Loveland have a reverse setback for planned development located near established oil and gas operations?
- If so, what is the reverse setback distance?
- Where is the reverse setback measured from?
- Where can reverse setbacks be found in the Loveland code?

I printed and attached the City's oil and gas regulations. I'm not sure but I think its the complete City oil and gas regs. I have tried to find a reference to reverse setbacks in the code.

18.10.04.02 Oil and Gas Overlay Zone and Sub-Zone Boundaries seems to address what we call reverse setbacks as does Table 18.02.02.02 outside of the oil and gas regulations. I can't find reference to reverse setbacks for development near to established oil and gas facilities, though high occupancy buildings and outdoor assembly areas are mentioned.

Is the City's reverse setback from established oil and gas facilites 1000 ft? I'm referring to, "The boundaries of the Oil and Gas Overlay ("OGO") Zone extend 1,000 feet from the boundaries of each oil and gas facility within the City limits, or within 1,000 feet outside of the City limits. OGO Zone boundaries surrounding oil and gas facilities outside of the City limits shall only be mapped within the City limits" (18.10.04.02).

If not, and if there is a reverse setback in the code, what is the reverse setback distance? And where can it be found in the code?

My wife and I have been residents of Loveland for a little over a year. We love it here and are glad we chose this city for our home. We would like to add in our two cents regarding the Centerra South plan and more importantly the Fracking associated with it.

From what I understand, the investment from the city for this project (~90 Million) will be many times the funds provided by the developer (~6 Million), McWhinney, to complete this project. That math simply does not add up under normal, legal, and moral business dealings. The most serious concern is the fracking pad with 11 wells that will be within the city limits, and adjacent to the Sports park.

Fracking, or hydraulic fracturing, is a highly controversial method of extracting oil and gas from the ground. While it has the potential to yield economic benefits (read corporate profits), it also poses numerous risks to public health, safety, and the environment. As such, I would strongly advise the Loveland City Council against allowing fracking within city limits.

First and foremost, fracking poses a significant risk to the safety and health of residents. The process involves injecting large volumes of chemicals and other toxic substances into the ground, which can contaminate nearby water sources and soil. This can lead to serious health problems for those who come into contact with these pollutants, including respiratory problems, neurological damage, and cancer.

Thank you for taking time to express your concerns. You have covered a lot of ground. I would like to address a couple of your concerns.

Regarding fracking. It seems a little unfair to associate the desire to recover an investment in mineral rights as greed. Such rights generally require a significant investment and Colorado statutes give an holder significant rights in harvesting those minerals. Given the concerns of citizens, extensive controls and regulations have been established to ensure that adverse environmental impacts of oil and gas production are minimized and in many cases eliminated. For instance, oil and gas production is largely a closed loop system that eliminates the releases of gases into the environment.

In addition, if any organization is compliant with all the regulations and standards that have been established by the state and the city, on what basis can the city deny a property owners the right to use their property or to exercise their rights harvest minerals to which they are entitled? To deny the legal exercise of property rights without cause would likely be considered arbitrary and capricious in a court of law and considered *a taking* which would subject the city to having to compensate the owner for their loss. Every community that has initiated a "fracking" ban has been overturned. Also, the citizens on Loveland voted to NOT have a fracking ban in Loveland.

Regarding your comment about taxpayers being stuck with the bill. You have been given incorrect information. There is a lot of mis-information and outright false information being circulated. Right now, that 140 acres generates only about \$2,800 in taxes averaged over the last 20 years.

Infrastructure has to be constructed by any developer. There are various ways to pay for that. There is NO tax revenue that is being taken from the city as the taxes being generated on most undeveloped land are \$ZERO or as in the gase next to zero. Assuming the a proposed development does in fact generate sales and property tax, it is because the developer has generated those sales taxes by the retail they have brought in. A community may choose to share sales or property tax with a developer that is installing the infrastructure required by the city which, by the way, is turned over to the city at no cost to the city or the citizens. We are REIMBURSING a developer for the costs incurred to put in infrastructure and public improvements. If you object to any sales tax you pay going to a particular project the solution is easy. Don't shop there. Regardless, you and anybody else can take advantage of the infrastructure and the public improvements at NOT COST to you or any other outside user.

I write to express my wholehearted dissent to any application for fracking in the Centerra area of Loveland, specifically docket number 220700198.

I'm opposed to this particular well because of its location, impact on the environment, and potential for hazards to human and animal health. This part of Loveland is particularly beautiful, thanks in large part to the reservoirs and wildlife habitat. The city's efforts to establish this habitat will be wasted if there are large numbers of trucks driving through the area and high noise levels from the well itself. What if birds stop nesting at the lakes? Why bother to build a habitat, only to let fracking disrupt it? 

Dear Mr. Olson,

Economic growth in the City of Loveland is bound by a Uniform Development Code (18.01.01.02) designed to promote public health, safety, and the general welfare. Allowing hydraulic fracturing in the Centerra Region of Loveland violates this code and the city's comprehensive plan. Below are just some of the ways that fracking is NOT compatible with the Uniform Code.

Code: Promote economic opportunity, encourage investment, and promote property values.

Reality: The Oil and Gas Industry provides less than 1% of the states total employment but is projected to cost \$1.36 billion annually in damages to the environment. That is 1.5 times the total taxes and fees oil and gas brings to the state. (CO Fiscal Institute, 2022). Property values decline in areas polluted by noise, heavy large vehicle traffic, and toxic air caused by invisible fracking gas leaks verified by infrared cameras. (Earthworks, 2022) More and more property owners in Centerra are voicing their concerns and protesting the planned 26 wells that they want stopped. (multiple dates, Loveland Reporter Herald.)

Code: Promote good civic design and site layout.

Reality: Loveland allows reverse setbacks that allow drilling only 300 feet from businesses that employ people such as wholesale nurseries, storage yards, heavy industry, composting facilities, and essential utility facilities. Residential development other than high occupancy buildings is located only 500 feet from an existing oil and gas facility. (City of Loveland Planning Division). A majority of members of the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission say "All homes and schools in Colorado should be protected from new oil and gas drilling by a 2,000-foot buffer or setback – four times the current standard for urban areas". (The Colorado Sun, 9-9-20) In areas with dense oil and gas site layout we see lower birth weights, more children with congenital heart defects, and more childhood cancers. (CU Anschutz Professor Lisa McKenzie). Being close to drilling sites is also dangerous for the elderly and those with breathing issues.

Code: Promote fiscally responsible infrastructure and services.

Reality: The Oil and Gas industry has tens of thousands of orphaned wells that could cost tax payers

billions of dollars to clean up. In addition to the financial burden “all of the science indicates that the dangerous gases that spew from wells are major contributors to climate change.” (Joe Salazar, Colorado Rising, 8-31-21). Climate caused disasters alone have cost the state between \$20 billion and \$50 billion since 1980. (Colorado Fiscal Institute)

Code: Lessen the risk of flood, fire, panic, and other dangers.

Reality: Fracking poses unique dangers to residential areas by subjecting families to known carcinogens like benzene. In 2017 fracking gases in Firestone combusted violently in a home causing serious injuries and 2 deaths. “Forced pooling” has allowed gas companies to annex mineral rights and drill beneath homes without the owner’s consent. Climate change caused by greenhouse gas emissions, like methane, contribute to severe weather leading to floods and wildland fires.

Code: Promote the conservation of energy, water, and environmental resources.

Reality: Fracking is a water intensive industrial process. It uses, 1.5 million to 16 million gallons of water per well, according to the [United States Geological Survey](#). We don’t get that polluted water back and we’re currently in a 1200 year drought.

Code: Promote the use of renewable energy.

Reality: To curb our climate crisis, we need to end our dependence on fossil fuels. That may have seemed far-fetched a decade ago given the cost of installing wind and solar at the time, but in 10 years, the price of solar electricity dropped 89%, and the price of onshore wind dropped 70%. (Rocky Mountain Institute, 2019). Continued use of fossil fuels is expensive and unnecessary.

Please consider the future of our city and adherence to the Uniform Development Code as you make your decision about allowing fracking in Centerra. For everyone’s health, safety, and the general welfare city leaders owe it to its citizens to not permit fracking within city limits. Thank you.

As a homeowner in High Plains Village we would not be pleased if McWhinney's application for Centerra East Fracking Pad was approved. It is not safe or good for our health. There are home and K-12 schools in the area and we know it releases toxins that cause health problems. We would not have moved here if there was fracking so close to our home. We have owned since 2016 and planned this to be our forever home, we watched the area grow and walk the lakes regularly. Please don't kill our wildlife.

The Centerra East pad is within 1/2 mile of wetlands along the corridor of the Loveland Greeley Canal. My understanding is that an estimated 20,892 truck trips hauling water, chemicals and toxic waste will be required throughout the first year 33,600 gallons of produced water (highly toxic fracking water) will be stored on site 116,550,000 gallons of fresh surface water estimated to be used and permanently polluted Emissions will include methane, benzene and many other hazardous air pollutants MRG has zero experience drilling new wells.

The only experience they have is taking over a small number of old wells and managing them poorly. Fracking is a dangerous process, we can't roll the dice with MRG. Human health Exposure to Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC's) released during the fracking process can lead to serious long and short-term health impacts, such as: asthma, nosebleeds, headaches, dizziness, preterm births, birth defects, pediatric cancer, endocrine disruption and many others.² Research has also shown mental health issues related to constant noise and light pollution, low-frequency vibrations, loss of sleep, disturbances from increased truck traffic, and degraded quality of life leading to chronic stress and depression. Water On average, one single fracked well uses anywhere from 4-16 million gallons of water; with the potential to use over 100 million gallons during its life cycle. Once used in combination with a cocktail of toxic chemicals, this water is permanently polluted, removing it from our water supply. In the midst of a historic drought, we cannot

afford to dispose of this scarce and precious resource. Air Fracking has been known to increase levels of nitrogen oxides, VOC's, ozone, methane and other hazardous air pollutants.^{4,5}

At a time when Colorado is experiencing its highest number of ozone alerts and our air pollution is already at unhealthy levels, we cannot allow fracking to add to our worsening air quality crisis. Public Safety The risks of toxic leaks, spills, explosions and well blow-outs are very real, as witnessed by more than a dozen tragic incidents at oil and gas sites throughout Colorado in 2018. Several of these incidents injured workers, and one resulted in the death of two innocent residents. Allowing the risk of dangerous life-threatening industrial drilling in our suburban neighborhoods, and near our children's schools is unconscionable. Wildlife Fracking threatens our local parks, nature preserves, and delicate ecosystems.

The lakes at Centerra are home to a bird sanctuary, where birds come to live and nest. It has been documented that fracking disrupts nesting & hunting patterns for a variety of owls. Climate Methane is up to 86 times more potent than CO₂ at trapping heat in Earth's atmosphere over a 20-year period. As fracking emits dangerous amounts of methane, it is contributing to longer droughts, decreased snowpack, and increased frequency and severity of wildfires, all of which we are already suffering the tremendous impacts of.

Economic

The City of Loveland has not enacted rules to ensure that McWhinney would be responsible for the total cost of clean up. Cleaning up and plugging abandoned and orphaned wells could cost Loveland taxpayers millions of dollars. In Colorado, bonding requirements are a meager \$10,000 - \$100,000 regardless of the number of wells drilled. The Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission estimates an average cost of \$80,000 - \$120,000 to clean up and remediate one well, rendering the bonds paid by oil and gas companies inadequate. Local municipalities - and taxpayers - are left to foot the bill. Statewide, this already amounts to more than \$8 billion dollars.

Please do not approve Fracking in our backyard!!!!!! It is critical for the next generation and you have the power to stop it. Doesn't McWhinney have enough money?

This means that Loveland would be left to foot the bill for the difference. This does not even account for any unfortunate events such as a spill or fire at the site. State wide the difference has amounted to over \$8 billion.

Will MRG be responsible for the total cost of clean up? This does not seem to be the case as the City of Loveland doesn't have any rules stipulating this. Clean up and plugging abandoned wells could cost the city a considerable amount of money. Bonding requirements in Colorado are only \$10,000 - \$100,000 regardless of the number of wells drilled. Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission estimates an average cost of \$80,000 - \$120,000 to clean up and remediate one well. This means that Loveland would be left to foot the bill for the difference. This does not even account for any unfortunate events such as a spill or fire at the site. State wide the difference has amounted to over \$8 billion.

Clean up and plugging abandoned wells could cost the city a considerable amount of money. Bonding requirements in Colorado are only \$10,000 - \$100,000 regardless of the number of wells drilled. Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission estimates an average cost of \$80,000 - \$120,000 to clean up and remediate one well. This means that Loveland would be left to foot the bill for the difference. This does not even account for any unfortunate events such as a spill or fire at the site. State wide the difference has amounted to over \$8 billion.

Honorable Mayor and Council members,

I am a resident of Loveland and live in the Centerra area. I also have 2 daughters, and 4 grandchildren ranging in age from 8 to 13 years, that reside Larimer county.

Much has been written about the dangers of fracking: to human health; water shortage and use; air pollution, by the increase of nitrogen oxides, VOC's, ozone, methane and other hazardous air pollutants; public safety from toxic leaks, spills, explosions and well blow-outs; wild life and the biodiversity; and climate, best exemplified in droughts, decreased snowpack and increased frequency and severity on wildfires. There is a wealth of information available scientifically documenting these dangers. Being responsible, and the well educated and widely experienced elected individuals you are, I am assuming you have exposed yourselves to much of this information. I will only point out that these dangers are present and especially place all children and the elderly at risk and even death.

I believe there is a serious lack of accountability, validation and responsibility among some elected officials locally, state wide, and on the national level, of these risks to our lives. This includes those appointed to positions of decision makers, an example of which is the COGCC which makes decisions to approve or deny proposed fracking in the state. There is also a high level of denial and perhaps ignorance among the same elected officials and decision makers regarding the dangers we face from fracking.

I understand that local officials have only a limited scope of influence on these serious risks. Much action to address them rests with other "higher levels" of government and private industry. But I believe, that is no reason to act, and do what we can on the local level.

That brings us to the present decision you have to make as elected representatives of the Loveland City council and government. A decision based on the oath you affirmed when assuming office to, "Act in the Best Interests of the Citizens of Loveland" and "To Insure the Health and Welfare of those Citizens, including their Children". It is obvious to me, and would be to anyone who has taken the time and made the effort to consider the risks of fracking to our lives, that the only responsible decision to be made is denial of the proposed fracking in Loveland and confirming your commitment to the oaths you have taken. To do anything else would be a violation of that oath, and even criminal, considering your power and responsibility on this matter.

Economic growth in the City of Loveland is bound by a Uniform Development Code (18.01.01.02) designed to promote public health, safety, and the general welfare. Allowing hydraulic fracturing in the Centerra Region of Loveland violates this code and the city's comprehensive plan. Below are just some of the ways that fracking is NOT compatible with the Uniform Code.

Code: Promote economic opportunity, encourage investment, and promote property values.

Reality: The Oil and Gas Industry provides less than 1% of the states total employment but is projected to cost \$1.36 billion annually in damages to the environment. That is 1.5 times the total taxes and fees oil and gas brings to the state. (CO Fiscal Institute, 2022). Property values decline in areas polluted by noise, heavy large vehicle traffic, and toxic air caused by invisible fracking gas leaks verified by infrared cameras. (Earthworks, 2022) More and more property owners in Centerra are voicing their concerns and protesting the planned 26 wells that they want stopped. (multiple dates, Loveland Reporter Herald.)

Code: Promote good civic design and site layout.

Reality: Loveland allows reverse setbacks that allow drilling only 300 feet from businesses that employ people such as wholesale nurseries, storage yards, heavy industry, composting facilities, and essential utility facilities. Residential development other than high occupancy buildings is located only 500 feet from an existing oil and gas facility. (City of Loveland Planning Division). A majority of members of the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission say "All homes and schools in Colorado should be protected from new oil and gas drilling by a 2,000-foot buffer or setback – four times the current standard for urban areas". (The Colorado Sun, 9-9-20) In areas with dense oil and

gas site layout we see lower birth weights, more children with congenital heart defects, and more childhood cancers. (CU Anschutz Professor Lisa McKenzie). Being close to drilling sites is also dangerous for the elderly and those with breathing issues.

Code: Promote fiscally responsible infrastructure and services.

Reality: The Oil and Gas industry has tens of thousands of orphaned wells that could cost tax payers billions of dollars to clean up. In addition to the financial burden “all of the science indicates that the dangerous gases that spew from wells are major contributors to climate change.” (Joe Salazar, Colorado Rising, 8-31-21). Climate caused disasters alone have cost the state between \$20 billion and \$50 billion since 1980. (Colorado Fiscal Institute)

Code: Lessen the risk of flood, fire, panic, and other dangers.

Reality: Fracking poses unique dangers to residential areas by subjecting families to known carcinogens like benzene. In 2017 fracking gases in Firestone combusted violently in a home causing serious injuries and 2 deaths. “Forced pooling” has allowed gas companies to annex mineral rights and drill beneath homes without the owner’s consent. Climate change caused by greenhouse gas emissions, like methane, contribute to severe weather leading to floods and wildland fires.

Code: Promote the conservation of energy, water, and environmental resources.

Reality: Fracking is a water intensive industrial process. It uses, 1.5 million to 16 million gallons of water per well, according to the [United States Geological Survey](#). We don’t get that polluted water back and we’re currently in a 1200 year drought.

Code: Promote the use of renewable energy.

Reality: To curb our climate crisis, we need to end our dependence on fossil fuels. That may have seemed far-fetched a decade ago given the cost of installing wind and solar at the time, but in 10 years, the price of solar electricity dropped 89%, and the price of onshore wind dropped 70%. (Rocky Mountain Institute, 2019). Continued use of fossil fuels is expensive and unnecessary.

Please consider the future of our city and adherence to the Uniform Development Code as you make your decision about allowing fracking in Centerra. For everyone’s health, safety, and the general welfare city leaders owe it to its citizens to not permit fracking within city limits. Thank you.

I'm reading local email strings that report the City is going to allow the McWhinneys to set up a fracking operation within the City limits. Is there a plan to capture the inevitable release of methane from the wells to avoid making global warming worse? Also, according to the API (<https://www.api.org/oil-and-natural-gas/energy-primers/hydraulic-fracturing/what-chemicals-are-used-in-fracking>) "*The chemicals that gas companies use - which can include water, sand, salt, citric acid, benzene or lead, according to a federal report – can be hazardous if not properly isolated and stored.*"

Have McWhinneys and their fracking company clearly described how benzene and lead will be isolated, stored, and controlled against leakage into the environment. Also, these chemicals will arrive by rail and truck – are the City emergency Services equipped to deal with an accidental spill? I don't think any of us want the City to become a potential East Palestine in the event of an accident. With the Big Thompson within a mile (downhill) of the Centerra area any spill could have disastrous consequences in the event of a release.

According to the same API site "*state and federal lawmakers are working to establish a system of rules to regulate the drilling, and most gas and oil companies have said maintaining the environment and preventing leaks are paramount concerns for them as well.*" This says the rules don't yet exist so how can the City, in clear conscience, allow this still unregulated process within the City limits?

Dear Mr. Mallo,

As a resident of the Lakes at Centerra, I am extremely concerned about the likely environmental and health impacts of the proposed fracking in and around Loveland. Constant growth and development are not the only considerations that should override all other issues of human health, environmental safety, and quality of life.

If all goes to plan, the order of construction will result in a number of homes located between 500 and 2,000 feet from the east pad. Research from the state health department and the Colorado School of Public Health suggests that residents of those homes will face elevated health risks, particularly from concentrations of the carcinogen benzene and air pollutants toluene and 2-ethyltoluene.

Among other impacts, the state health department study found a higher risk of short-term health impacts like dizziness, nosebleeds, breathing difficulty and headaches during the worst-case-scenario for emissions. The Colorado School of Public Health study found elevated lifetime cancer risk as well as impacts to the brain, blood and bone marrow.

But you can't see or smell all the health and environmental impacts of oil and gas development, project opponents pointed out. In addition to the health risks, fracking degrades air quality, exacerbates climate change and contributes to ozone production. Fracking can also contaminate groundwater and drinking water in the case of spills, fracking fluid leaks and other potential mishaps. The latter is of special concern for the south pad because of its proximity to a wetland and the Big Thompson River.

I urge you in the strongest possible terms to assert the prerogatives of the city council to impose sensible regulations that protect the people you represent and the beautiful environment that makes Colorado such a precious yet fragile treasure. The state has empowered our cities and counties to enact regulations over and above its regulations in order to protect humans and nature from irreparable damage.

Granting a reflexive approval to all pro-business initiatives regardless of the potential harm already seen in many states is irresponsible and dangerous.



Karen, thank you for your email and apologies for not responding in a timely manner.

The quick responses to your questions are below.

- Does Loveland have a reverse setback for planned development located near established oil and gas operations?
Answer. Yes. We have an overlay zone in Division 18.10.04 of the Unified Development Code that works like a setback that prevents certain uses within a certain distance from oil and gas facilities.
- If so, what is the reverse setback distance?
Answer: The oil and gas overlay zone and sub-zone boundaries prohibits new residences within 500-foot from oil and gas facilities and prohibits new high occupancy building units within 1,000 foot setback from oil and gas facilities.

Where is the reverse setback measured from?

Answer: “Oil and gas facilities” are defined as: equipment or improvements that are used or installed at an oil and gas location for the exploration, production, withdrawal, gathering, treatment or processing of oil or gas, and which shall include, without limitation, operating, shut-in, or abandoned wells, any and all storage, separation, treating, dehydration, artificial lift, compression, pumping, metering, monitoring, aboveground flowlines, and other equipment directly associated with oil wells, gas wells, or injection wells. However, “oil and gas facility” shall not include aboveground or underground power supply, underground flow lines, or underground water lines or abandoned wells that the Director finds will not, as a matter of law, be reopened or reentered in the future for any type of oil and gas operation without the City’s prior written consent.

The staff considers the entire production pad as an oil and gas facility (called a “working pad surface” in COGCC rules) for the purpose of measuring the oil and gas overlay zone.

- Where can reverse setbacks be found in the Loveland code?

Answer: Division 18.10.04 of the Unified Development Code.

When referring to “reverse” setbacks, from a City perspective, this would apply to any existing oil and gas development/production site toward future land uses that would be located near such facility. With respect to the City’s Unified Development Code (UDC), we do not refer to the term “reverse” setbacks per se. Rather, the UDC uses overlay zones in creating distances/setbacks for existing oil and gas development/production sites from other future land uses identified under three (3) separate categories (i.e. Critical (CZ), Restricted (RZ), and High Occupancy Building (HO)) in Division 18.10.04 that you referenced in your email. The overlay zones extend 1,000 feet from any existing oil and gas development/production site within City limits. Within this 1,000 feet are the three (3) categories mentioned above. If you were to envision “rings” around an existing oil and gas development/production site, the distances would be as follows:

-200 feet measured from the outer boundary of each existing oil and gas development/production site (for purposes of this boundary the City views this as being the working pad surface area) would permit future land uses identified as the Critical Sub-Zone to include only essential underground public utility facilities and undeveloped access-restricted open space;

-300 feet measured from the outer boundary of the Critical Sub-Zone boundary would permit land uses identified as the Restricted Sub-Zone to include only the following:

- a. Airport, heliport, or helistop;
- b. Composting facility;
- c. Storage yard;

- d. Essential public utility uses, facilities, services and structures;
- e. Heavy industry;
- f. Wireless communications facilities (all types);
- g. Nursery or greenhouse, wholesale;
- h. Recycling collection center (attended);
- i. Recyclable materials processing;
- j. Resource extraction (minerals);
- k. Resource extraction (oil and gas);
- l. Self-storage;
- m. Street;
- n. Heavy logistics center;
- o. Waste transfer station;
- p. Disposal;
- q. Passenger motor vehicle sales or rental;
- r. Heavy motor vehicle sales or rental;
- s. Motorcycle, scooter, or ATV sales or rental, and;

-500 feet measured from the outer boundary of the Restricted Sub-Zone would permit future land uses identified as the High Occupancy Building Sub-Zone which is to say that any use allowed under the underlying zoning district would be permitted except high occupancy buildings and outdoor assembly areas (such uses would have to be located 1,000 feet or more from the oil and gas development/production facility)

Any future land use(s) other than those mentioned above and so long as the underlying zoning would permit such use(s), can be established anywhere between 500 and 1,000 feet as measured from the outer boundaries of the oil and gas development/production site (i.e. outer green circle labeled as HO Zone). Here is a general illustration to help visualize:

Hello everyone

During McWhinney's CE Pad neighborhood meeting I asked about Loveland's reverse setback regulations. I was told the City did have reverse setback regulations (residential building setbacks from established oil and gas facilities) and the City would provide the information on the setback distances. I subsequently sent an email to staff in November, asking where I could find the City's reverse setback regulations in the City's Code. I did not receive a response. I submitted a question regarding reverse setbacks on the City's oil and gas website. I did not receive a response or see the question answered on the City's website. It could be that staff are on leave, no longer work for the City or I have the wrong email address. Other Loveland residents have submitted reverse setback questions and have not received an answer as far as I know.

McWhinney's submitted document regarding the neighborhood meeting states that the McWhinney team and City staff said the City has reverse setback

regualtions. I would like to get an answer to the questions.

The questions I have are:

- Does Loveland have a reverse setback for planned development located near established oil and gas operations?
- If so, what is the reverse setback distance?
- Where is the reverse setback measured from?
- Where can reverse setbacks be found in the Loveland code?

I printed and attached the City's oil and gas regulations. I'm not sure but I think its the complete City oil and gas regs. I have tried to find a reference to reverse setbacks in the code.

18.10.04.02 Oil and Gas Overlay Zone and Sub-Zone Boundaries seems to address what we call reverse setbacks as does Table 18.02.02.02 outside of the oil and gas regulations. I can't find reference to reverse setbacks for development near to established oil and gas facilities, though high occupancy buildings and outdoor assembly areas are mentioned.

Is the City's reverse setback from established oil and gas facilites 1000 ft? I'm referring to, "The boundaries of the Oil and Gas Overlay ("OGO") Zone extend 1,000 feet from the boundaries of each oil and gas facility within the City limits, or within 1,000 feet outside of the City limits. OGO Zone boundaries surrounding oil and gas facilities outside of the City limits shall only be mapped within the City limits" (18.10.04.02).

If not, and if there is a reverse setback in the code, what is the reverse setback distance? And where can it be found in the code?

Thanks in advance for any information and explanation you can provide.

In accordance with city of Loveland oil and gas regulations, MRG, LLC, will be holding a virtual neighborhood meeting on Monday to discuss its plans for new drilling in southeast Loveland.

Representatives from MRG, a McWhinney-affiliated company, will share details of the proposed South (CS) well pad, which will be located east of Loveland Sports Park, near County Road 20E.

MRG filed a letter of intent with the city for this development in March 2022. According to information in that letter, the pad will house up to 11 horizontal wells, with construction and drilling expected to take several months.

City planners will be facilitating the meeting and presenting an overview of the application process for oil and gas development in the city. There will also be a discussion of the approval process for the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC), and how to navigate its online application system.

Meeting participants will get a chance to ask questions of both city planners and MRG representatives, and share feedback, which will be used in the administrative review process.

According to a city press release, notice of this meeting was issued to neighbors within a 2,200-foot radius of the property on Dec. 29. Information has also been posted on the city's oil and gas webpage.

In August, the city announced that it had struck a deal

with another McWhinney affiliated company to exchange a city-owned parcel adjacent to the proposed drilling site for land along the Big Thompson River that will be used for recreational open space.

By relinquishing the house on the property, the city loses its standing to object as a residential property owner within the 2,000 foot setback mandated by COGCC rules. However, the city still has oversight as the "relevant local government" in the process, according to the city attorney's office.

This is the second of two proposed developments that MRG is planning in Loveland. In December, the company filed a formal application to construct the East (CE) well-pad and production facility north of U.S. 34, near the new Kinston residential development, which is also affiliated with McWhinney.

That site is expected to hold 15 wells, drilled a mile underground and extending 7,900 feet to the west, under the interstate.

The application is currently under the city's "Track 2" review process, which gives Loveland development director Brett Limbaugh final authority to approve or deny the application. Per the city's oil and gas website, the process is expected to take four to six months.

The proposed development is also currently under review by the COGCC. During the public comment period on the application, which is viewable at the COGCC website, nearly 120 area residents shared their thoughts on the proposal, all but two of them opposed to it. Commenters expressed concern about the development's potential impacts on local air and water quality and the danger of contamination from chemicals used in the drilling and production processes.

The COGCC comment period has closed, but a hearing for the development before the commission has been scheduled for Feb. 22. Application documents are available for review at cogcc.state.co.us/permits2.html#/ogdp. Search for pending Form 2As in Larimer County.

Loveland is accepting online comments for the East CE development through Jan. 16 at lovgov.org/services/development-services/oil-gas-development-in-loveland/contact-the-city.
