Item 4.1: Water Treatment Plant Daily and Monthly Flow Report - Chad Birgenheier

STAFF REPORT

Item 5.1: Green Ridge Glade Reservoir Oxygenation – Donald Cecil

The Green Ridge Glade Reservoir Oxygenation Project proposes to install a hypolimnetic oxygenation system at the Chasteen's Grove Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and Green Ridge Glade (GRG) Reservoir. The oxygenation system will supplement oxygen within lower levels of the reservoir, improving water quality, and effectively increasing the firm capacity within the reservoir.

Recommendation: Staff item only. No action required.

Discussion:

John Butler wanted to know the level of oxygenation we anticipate to combat stratification. Donald Cecil was not able to give him a specific number but noted that they would be testing various levels when this system is implemented.

Councilor Olsen wanted to know if we would decommission the solar bees. Donald Cecil confirmed that this oxygenation system is intended to replace them.

Christopher Say wondered why we are using a liquid oxygenation system over using a blower in the lake. Donald Cecil noted that we are specifically addressing the chemical composition of the reservoir.

Dan Herlihev wanted to know about the delivery of the oxygen to the tank near the reservoir and was notified that deliveries will be made from the county road to accommodate the large truck.

COMMISSION & COUNCIL REPORTS



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Commission Reports

Dan Herlihey: Welcome to Sharon! Dan caught a recent news story that the CDC has started to research potential links between fluoride and developmental issues in child brain development. Kevin Gertig confirmed that he saw that story and indicated that the key to the fluoride discussion is the dosage. He agreed that there is more work that needs to be done. Kevin suggested that the group keep up with the research and encouraged regular updates to the LUC. Sharon Israel noted that the regulatory framework and established safe levels of fluoride are provided by public health officials. She thinks part of the policy discussion will need to be discussing acute vs. chronic health affects (short term benefits vs. long term risks). She committed to continuing to update the commission with information from the Water Quality lab. We also confirmed that our city fluoride decisions were decided by City Council and are not mandated by the City Charter.

Gene Packer: Gene wanted to know the cost savings of not having the 4th of July display in 2025. **Councilor Olsen** did not have that information.

- 4. **John Faulkner** gave an update on a leak near South Namaqua Road. There was a large portion of the pipe that was corroded out the bottom. We had to reach out to a contractor to assist with the large replacement.
- 5. Kevin wanted to give his sincere thanks to the Commission. His entire career has been public service to the utilities there is nothing more rewarding! He is confident that staff is already working on a lot of solutions and plans for the future. He also encouraged some upgrades in the interconnects. Councilor Olsen requested that we bring a proposal or explanation of this need to Council as soon as possible to emphasize the importance of this need.
