Item 5.1: Unified Development Code (UDC) Landscaping Update to Align with Senate Bill 24-005 - Marian **Duran and Nathan Alburn**

This item was presented to the Loveland Utilities Commission on July 16, 2025. However, staff inadvertently omitted taking a formal motion of support at that time. As a result, the item is being included on the August LUC agenda as a consent item. The Commission's support—or lack thereof—will be communicated to City Council later this year.

The City of Loveland is updating the Unified Development Code (UDC) to comply with Senate Bill 24-005, effective January 1, 2026, requiring commercial, industrial, and institutional developers to adopt water-wise landscape practices. Key updates include:

- Constraining high-water use non-functional turfgrass
- Minimizing water-intensive landscaping

Adhering to Senate Bill 24-005 supports Loveland's commitment to water conservation and the protection of environmental resources, promoting sustainable development practices.

Item 6.1: Power Cost-of-Service Rate Study Results – Jim Lees

The purpose of this item is to get a recommendation from the LUC on proposed 2026 Power rates for all rate classes for City Council's consideration.

Recommendation: Adopt a motion recommending the City Council approve the proposed Power rates for 2026.

Motion: Don Cook made the motion.

Second: Gary Hausman seconded the motion. The motion was approved with a 7-0 vote.

Discussion:

Gene Packer asked if fixed rates are going up relative to the 5.8%. Mark Beauchamp noted that fixed rates are going up by 8.5%.

Don Cook wanted to know if distribution cost increases were still accurate due to an increase in the cost of copper and other supplies, etc. Mark Beauchamp noted that those costs go into distribution costs and have a smaller impact on retail rate tracks.

Don Cook noted that these proposed rates feel like a moving target and Sharon Israel confirmed that rate tracking is a moving target and that we do the best that we can with the information we are given.

Gene Packer wanted to know if rate increases for the four owner-communities of Platte River Power Authority are similar. Mark Beauchamp confirmed that proposed rate increases for all 4 cities are very similar.

Gary Hausman wanted to know more about the Southwest Power Pool (SPP) and what it is. Sharon Israel stated that this organization manages the electric grid and wholesale power market for the central United States. She suggested that we request a future presentation on the SPP and bring in someone from Platte River Power Authority's markets group to present to the LUC.
