Location

Memorial tree and bench adoptions are available within designated locations in City parks and trail locations. Both require approval for locations and may be limited due to capacity.

The following parks are currently at capacity: North Lake Park, Benson Sculpture Garden, South Shore Parkway, Namaqua Park, Seven Lakes Park, Viestenz-Smith Mountain Park, Mehaffey Park and the Civic Center campus.

Donation Plaque Policy

The City of Loveland permits the installation of a donated plaque with adopted park trees and benches, provided it meets the criteria of the Department's donation plaque policy.

The Parks & Recreation Department/Parks Division and/or Memorial Donation Coordinator must approve plaque material, size and wording before the donor orders the plaque. Donors may work with a vendor of their choice as an additional expense to the adoption donation.

The Department is not responsible for vandalism or damages to the extent that it is a maintenance concern or possesses a liability to the public. The Department will, at its discretion, remove it and notify the donor of the action.

The following criteria apply to all plaques for trees and benches:

- Plaques must be made of a corrosive-resistant metal including bronze, aluminum or similar durable material and of a color that will harmonize with the site furnishing. Plaques must include compatible hardware for surface mounting in concrete.
- The exposed surface of the plaque must not exceed eighteen (18) square inches (3" X 6"). Plaques that exceed the size limit will not be installed onsite.
- 3. The Parks & Recreation Department/Parks Division will install plaques once they are received from the donor and will notify the donor once the installation is complete. Tree plaques are installed throughout the year and bench plaques are installed from May 1 through October 1.
