ADMINISTRATION

Noontime Nature was the only adult program hosted in June and 35 attended.

RFID tags and training arrived this month and a system to tag on Sundays while we are closed in the summer was developed. Tagging began on June 12 and about 23,000 items were tagged this month. We were not satisfied with the adhesive on the tags so ITG shipped us overlays that adhere better but also slow the process.

Most meetings and activities this month related to construction, moving and planning for Phase 2 and beyond. The Grand Reopening Committee and the Staff Morale Committee have been busy just as the Capital Campaign Committee's work winds down.

Marcia Lewis toured the new Green Valley Ranch branch of Denver Public Library and attended the Chamber of Commerce's Business Before Breakfast. Information about the library's summer programs was distributed at the First United Methodist Church's Good Neighbor Festival.

Ted Schmidt and Patty Goodwine attended a meeting with Bill Cahill that addressed board and commissions communication.

ADULT SERVICES

The adult book group read the book, *The Help*, by Katherine Stockett; 44 people attended the three sessions. The InterLibrary Loan staff processed 697 requests, borrowing 407 items from other libraries for our patrons out of 494 requests and loaning 170 items from our collection to other libraries out of 203 requests.

We proctored 11 exams for the public and worked with one student who volunteered seven hours. The book display had the theme, "Dig into Books", which is the theme of the adult summer reading program this year. The table display case held a collection of shells belonging to a staff member.

CIRCULATION

Lupe attended three meetings in June. One was a phone conference with ITG, two an "On the Fly" meeting, and three a meeting on the policy revisions.

Cindi Hasbrouck presented two book displays in June. "Quilts" was displayed the first part of the month and "War Stories" followed.

All circulation staff is helping with the RFID tagging.
