Larimer County Workforce Center

The Larimer County Workforce Center, which has offices in Fort Collins and Loveland, also administers the County's Enterprise Zone. Enterprise Zones are a state program through the Colorado Office of Economic Development and International Trade (OEDIT). Enterprise Zones are areas of the state

that are economically distressed based upon statistics from Census data. They are administered locally. Larimer County received Enterprise Zone designation in 1993. The Larimer County Enterprise Zone covers portions of Wellington, Fort Collins, Berthoud, and Loveland.

Businesses locating or expanding in an Enterprise Zone have the potential to receive state tax credits. For more information about these credits, visit: http://larimerworkforce.org/index.php?pr=Enterprise_Zone&linkid=enterprise on the Larimer County Workforce Center's web site. A map of the Loveland portion of the Enterprise Zone is also available on this web site, as is an Enterprise Zone Address Locator.

In 2006, the Loveland City Council requested an expansion of their portion of the Enterprise Zone to include the Agilent property and the vacant WaterPik plant. The Colorado Economic Development Commission (EDC), which is a committee of OEDIT, approved this request. According to Loveland's Business Development Office, the expansion of the zone to include the Agilent property and the state tax credits associated with businesses locating in an Enterprise Zone, facilitated the Aerospace Clean Energy Manufacturing and Innovation Park (ACE) decision to locate in Loveland.

In addition to state tax credits for businesses locating and expanding in an Enterprise Zone, there is a special Contribution Tax Credit that can be utilized by "Approved Enterprise Zone Projects" as an incentive to taxpayers to donate money to such agencies. Agencies are "Approved" by application to the Colorado Economic Development Commission through the local Enterprise Zone Administrator. These entities can then offer tax payers that donate money a 25% state tax credit based upon the amount of contribution.

This incentive has helped various entities in Loveland: Alternatives to Violence, Friends of the Loveland Public Library (Loveland Library Expansion), House of Neighborly Services, McKee Foundation (Loveland Community Health Center), Pulliam Building Renovation, and the Rialto Bridge Project. A countywide list of "Approved Enterprise Zone Agencies" can also be found on the web site.



Neighbor to Neighbor receives Wells Fargo Grant for Home Buyer Education Program

Neighbor to Neighbor, a 41-year-old housing services non-profit agency serving Larimer County received a \$7,500 grant from the Wells Fargo Foundation on behalf of Wells Fargo Home Mortgage. These funds from the Housing Foundation Charitable Committee are ear-marked for the operation of N2N's Home Buyer Education Program.

Lindsay Nichols, Neighbor to Neighbor program director, is grateful for Wells Fargo's continued commitment to educating potential home buyers in the area. "On behalf of the clients we serve, I appreciate this support," she said. "Buying your first home is a complicated process and we want to make sure that home buyers have the necessary information to make the right decisions for long term success."

Neighbor to Neighbor's free group Home Buyer Education classes are held monthly to inform first-time home buyers about the process of becoming a successful home owner. This class is a pre-requisite for eligible households to access local down payment assistance programs. Attendees who complete N2N's one-session class leave as savvy consumers prepared to become stable homeowners. Classes cover topics including tips for budgeting and saving for down payment, establishing and maintaining good credit, shopping for a loan, negotiating the price of a home, home owners' insurance, energy efficiency, and protecting your investment. This class meets the certificate requirements for CHFA, City of Fort Collins, and Larimer County through the Housing Authority of the City of Loveland down payment assistance programs as well as the HUD counseling requirement needed for Fannie Mae My Community Loan Products. These local down payment assistance programs provide thousands of dollars toward homeownership to qualified buyers.

Potential home buyers may also access one-on-one pre-purchase counseling to discuss their individual housing needs, budget, and credit, and identify goals to work toward successful, affordable home ownership.


Building Loveland's First Safehouse

Alternatives to Violence (ATV), a Loveland based non-profit organization, is slated to break ground on Loveland's first emergency safehouse in Southern Larimer County in the spring of 2012. This significant project is comprised of a partnership between ATV, Loveland Habitat for Humanity and the 2011 - 2012 Leadership Loveland class.

The ATV safehouse will serve as a refuge for Southern Larimer County women and children to escape abuse and rebuild their lives. The 10,500 square foot safehouse will provide a place of hope and healing for more than 300 citizens within Loveland each year. In addition to eight bedrooms and bathrooms, the safehouse will have a community kitchen, dining area, meeting room, play room and basement offices for counselors and office staff. One bedroom in the safehouse will be set aside for a senior woman over 60 years old.

Despite having shelters in neighboring towns, relocating survivors of domestic violence isolates them from their community and the support they might have from family, friends or their church. This problem is often compounded by a lack of transportation as women fleeing abusive situations often

The Larimer Home Ownership Program is NOW taking application! The program assists families that earn no more than 80% of the area median income, or \$61,350 for a family of four, and are purchasing a

home. They can borrow up to \$10,000 for down payment and closing costs. The loan has a 2% interest rate and a 10 year term. The program has funding for all areas of Larimer County except the City limits of Fort Collins, as they have their own program. **For additional information and an application Call Amy at (970) 635-5931 or visit the website at www.lovelandhsg.org.** This is a program offered by the Housing Authority of the City of Loveland and funded by both the City of Loveland and State Division of Housing.



The Larimer Home Improvement Program is ALSO taking applications! This program provides low to no interest loans to home owners earning no more than 80% of the area median income and serves all of Larimer County including Fort Collins and Loveland and currently has funding for all areas. These funds can be used to repair and rehab your home, making it more energy efficient, address health and safety issues and help with handicap assessable modifications. The interest rate and terms are flexible and determined based on income and your family's ability to repay. Your credit doesn't have to be perfect, but there can be no liens or judgments against the property and you can not be in foreclosure. The maximum loan amount is \$24,999 and the interest can be from zero to 5% based upon income. **For additional information and applications call Amy at (970) 635-5931 or visit the website at www.lovelandhsg.org.** This is a program administered by the Housing Authority of the City of Loveland and is also funded by both the City of Loveland and State Division of Housing.




Do you know of a deserving child with a dream? Let us know!

The Circles Community

Circles is an innovative model for helping low-income families move out of poverty permanently. It recognizes that it takes agency support to provide financial and material resources along the way, and the research has also shown that no significant learning and establishing of new habits takes place without significant relationships within the greater community! The model provides solutions in three ways:



Provides consistency and comradery for families working hard to meet their self-sufficiency goals through a weekly evening meeting, that includes a shared meal and childcare and a stipend for completing the activities while in the class.

Participants begin by attending a 15 week class, called *Getting Ahead in a Just Gettin-By World*, where they explore the impact that poverty has had on them, they examine their economic realities, they determine their strength/gap in 11 resource areas (more than just financial), and they develop a plan for their "Future Story"

Following graduation of the class, participants now recognized as Circle Leaders, are supported, weekly, for 18 more months. Weekly meetings continue with relevant topics toward meeting their goals, and they are matched with 2-3 community volunteers whose role is to support, encourage, brainstorm solutions, and befriend this family. It's a model based on empowering the individual to lead the way and gain or enhance their leadership, social and networking skills.

This is not a crisis program; it is a side by side journey with an individual/family in need, outside of the typical work hours. Celebrating 100 Homes

Loveland Habitat for Humanity to Have First Ever Build-A-Thon

Loveland Habitat for Humanity is celebrating the construction of its 100th home this fall and as part of the celebration, the affiliate will be putting on a 4-day Build-A-Thon, September 21-24. The event will take place in Loveland Habitat's new subdivision – Willow Park – which is located just behind the 29th Street Post Office in Loveland. Three homes, including the 100th, will be constructed by teams during the event.

"The Build-A-Thon is much like a Walk-a-Thon where people raise money to participate. We have 4 homes we will be building. People can form teams of 5 or 10 people to build during one of the available shifts," said Gwen Stephenson, Executive Director of Loveland Habitat for Humanity. "This is a great team building activity for families, friends or businesses. What a great way to make a difference in the lives of Loveland families while having a lot of fun."

Teams are required to raise a minimum of \$100 per person – in honor of the affiliate building 100 homes – to participate. Shifts are 4 hours each, running from 8 am to noon and noon to 4 pm, on Thursday, Sept. 22; Friday, Sept. 23; and Saturday, Sept. 24. Building – which invites all skill sets and levels – will include breakfast and lunch (shift dependent) snacks, prizes and lots of fun! All tools and hard hats will be provided. Additionally there will be a team t-shirt design contest, prizes for individuals and teams that raise the most money and opening and closing celebrations with food and entertainment.

Since 1987, Loveland Habitat for Humanity has been building homes for deserving Loveland families. Families must qualify for the homes and agree to partner with Loveland Habitat by performing sweat equity on their home or the home of another family. The home is then sold to them with a no-interest loan, allowing families to have a hand up, not a hand out.

LOVELAND FOOD SHARE GROWS FIVE TIMES ITS SIZE TO FEED THE NEED

Seventeen months in process, \$2.23 million dollars raised, and one enormous step closer to a hunger-free Larimer County...It's officially moving time. This September, the Food Bank for Larimer County's Loveland Food Share pantry will be getting settled into new digs at 2600 N. Lincoln. **A public grand opening celebration is slated for Friday, September 23 at 3:30-5:30 p.m., and you are invited!** Tours and light refreshments will be provided as we celebrate our new facility with our community of supporters.

The \$2.23 million dollar capital campaign, Larimer Shares - Growing to Feed the Need, launched in March 2010, and the FBLC purchased the building and land located at 2600 N. Lincoln Avenue in Loveland (the former Ferrero Paint & Collision Repair building) in November, 2010. Renovations to the building commenced in June 2011.

Upgrades included constructing a new truck pit dock, an expanded client entry door, and reconfiguring interior walls to create staff offices and a market-like experience for clients. Project organizers also targeted basic LEED certification.

Special thanks to our major donors (\$50,000 and above) which included Volentine Family Foundation, Gates Family Foundation (matching challenge grant), John J. McLean Estate, Kroh Charitable Trust, Advance Tank and Construction Company, Daniels Fund, Kenneth and Myra Monfort Charitable Foundation, Larry and Diane Haligas, Helen K. and Arthur E. Johnson Foundation, Tom Gendron and Traci Conroy, and USDA Food and Nutrition Services.

Vaught Frye Ripley Design, Inc., worked as Architect, and a local Loveland contractor, DS Constructors, provided preconstruction and general contractor services.

As a primary FBLC program, Food Share is the single largest fresh food pantry in Larimer County with a location in north Fort Collins and one in Loveland. Collectively, Food Share provides free food to nearly 13,000 Larimer County residents each month.

This new facility will allow us to meet the growing demand for food assistance by increasing our capacity in the coming years to accommodate more than 20,000 clients and provide 5 million pounds of food annually, improve operational efficiencies, create the ability to accept and store food donations in Loveland, and ensure the safety and dignity of clients by separating them from the warehouse, receiving and more than doubling the shopping floor space to approximately 4,000 square feet.

must leave everything, including cars, behind. The need for a safehouse in Loveland is evident in the 28 percent increase in ATV clients so far this year

The ATV safehouse project will be the first safehouse built in the state of Colorado by Habitat for Humanity. Loveland Habitat for Humanity is committed to this project and will provide their expertise by helping ATV staff schedule volunteers, hire a volunteer coordinator as the construction project manager and help organize a Blitz Build. In addition, Loveland Habitat for Humanity has provided ATV access to their vendors, helping with discounted materials helping to substantially reduce costs .

The 2011-2012 Leadership Loveland class, supported as a program through the Loveland Chamber of Commerce, has chosen the ATV safehouse as their class project. Because the safehouse is being built largely by donations, Leadership Loveland participants will raise \$1,000 each for the safehouse as well as serve on specific safehouse committees into the summer of 2012. Those committees range from marketing to the actual building and design of the safehouse.

"The ATV Board, staff and volunteers are so pleased and grateful for the support and expertise of Leadership Loveland and their support of ATV and the families we serve. We thank you on their behalf," said Lynda Nielsen, executive director of ATV.

ATV has dedicated resources to Loveland for 29 years providing crisis response and case management for those who have been victims of domestic abuse, sexual assault and other violent crimes. In 2010 alone, Alternatives to Violence provided 18,615 nights of safe shelter in their transitional and scattered sites housing programs in Southern Larimer County.


