18.41.050.D.4.b and c and Section 16.020.030.A of the Municipal Code. The Municipal Code requires the Planning Commission to issue Findings and Conclusions in support of their decision within thirty (30) days of the Public Hearing. After the Commission adopts its written Findings and Conclusions, a ten (10) day appeal period will occur. Kerri Burchett, Project Planner gave a brief staff presentation on this item stating that the submitted Findings and Conclusions reflect the Planning Commission's decision on August 22, 2011. She indicated that the Municipal Code requires that the Planning Commission adopt a Resolution stating their findings and conclusions in order to finalize their decision. She elaborated that after adoption of the Resolution a 10-day appeal period will begin. Ms. Burchett stated that if an appeal is filed, it will be scheduled for a full public hearing, de novo, with the City Council. Commissioner Dowding made a motion to approve Resolution #11-01 thereby denying the First Amendment to the Mariana Butte 23rd Subdivision PUD Preliminary Development Plan and Mariana Butte 26th Subdivision preliminary plat. Upon a second by Commissioner Middleton the motion was unanimously adopted. **ADJOURNMENT** Commissioner Middleton made a motion to adjourn.
